SUBJECT:

Worker Adjustment Assistance

The decision memorandum on the above was signed by you. We need your clarification.

If I understand correctly, you would like us to establish a new worker adjustment program combining Title III of JTPA and the Trade Adjustment Assistance Program, but you want it to be financed out of general revenues, i.e., no new tax. Am I right that this is what you wanted?

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Overwhelming sentiments

Students adore Reagan

Something close to adoration may aptly describe the overwhelming sentiment expressed by high school seniors who attended Ronald Reagan's visit to Birmingham Tuesday.

Students from Springville and Moody high schools, among others from St. Clair County, received tickets from Republican candidates to travel with their schools to the political rally supporting Senator Jeremiah Denton. Upon their return from the event, nearly all of the comments shared by the young people favored the president, his policies and his administration.

"The thing that impressed me the most was when I actually listened to him, he struck me as the kind of person I'd like to meet," said Springville senior Donna Rayburn. "He seemed like the kind of man who cared about people. I would give anything to meet that man and see what he is like one-on-one."

Fellow classmate Alyson Marten agreed. "You can believe him and trust what he says."

Eighteen-year-old Jeff Parrish, who plans to vote in his first election next week, also spoke of his admiration for the president.

"One thing that impressed me was that he cares enough about his country to come down here to Alabama and take time out of his schedule to say, 'Look, we have to get on top of things,'" he said.

And, according to Donna, Reagan did not limit his remarks to the older, voting-age audience.

"President Reagan actually addressed the young people that were Many of the students said they were moved emotionally by the music and red-white-and-blue color themes and props used to stage the event.

Andi: "There was so much pride."
Alyson: "It made you proud to be an American."

Donna: "When the former Miss Alabama sang the 'Grand ol' Flag,' and these flags draped from the ceiling started coming down, I literally almost started crying."

Alyson: "I did start crying."

Jeff: "To me, it seemed like a pep
rally for America."

Many of the seniors at Moody High School expressed this same sense of pride and respect for the president after listening to Reagan's speech.

"I was real impressed," said Rita Gaston. "When he was talking about the Soviets not running over America. I'm proud to be an American. When those flags came down, it gave me chills."

When asked if they believed it was proper for the president to travel throughout the country campaigning for other Republicans, senior Mark Mooney said 'yes' with some qualifications.

"If he has faith in the candidate, that's okay. But if he's just campaigning for the Republican Party, then no," he said.

Joe McChargue added that he disagreed with the president's goal to maintain a Republican majority in Congress, asserting that the prac-

tice can lead to disunity between Congress and successive presidents who may be of a differing political party. However, this didn't diminish for him the profundity of seeing the president.

"It made you start thinking about the future," he remarked.

Mark Ramey agreed that he's more interested in politics now than before attending the rally.

"I never like to watch politics on TV, I turn the channel. But, I'll pay more attention now," he admitted.

Ditto, said Traci Deese. "When you start thinking about us being the next political leaders... I've never been interested, I mean, I could care less, but now, I'll pay more attention."

Some of the students said they wished the president could run for office again.

"I wish he wouldn't grow old. It's sad that somebody like Reagan has to leave," Kim Rogers said. "Reagan took so long to get our country in shape and what if someone comes in and wipes out everything he's done?"

Possibly including herself in her statement, Wendy Richey remarked, "A lot of people didn't know 'til now what a good president he was, until now."

One thing is for sure, Reagan's visit to Birmingham Tuesday left a lasting impression in the minds of a few high school seniors from St. Clair County.

Lamarr Glidewell added, "He was a very strong speaker. Down to earth and on the level with everybody."

For Andi Galloway, seeing the president helped her form some developing political convictions.

"The fact that he took time out to let the people see the president. When I vote, in a presidential election, well, it kind of pulled me a lot to the Republican Party because I was kind of undecided before," she said.
"The best thing I liked about the speech was what he had to say about drugs and the tax rates are down-because that gives me something to look forward to when we grow older."

Jeff said he supported Reagan's efforts to strengthen the U.S. military and continue with the Star Wars program and he particularly enjoyed the comments the president

had on the subject.

"When he came into office in 1980, he said America wore a sign that said, Kick me' but, now, we wear a sign that says. 'Don't tread on me.' That was cool. It made you think," he said.
