JUNE 18 DELAY AT THE NORTHWEST GATE

I would like to make you aware of a most embarrassing and frustrating problem which occurred Monday, June 18, and resulted in a one-hour delay for both Frank Sinatra and The First Lady.

Monday morning at 9:00 a.m., Sergeant Mayclin called from my office to make the Northwest Gate aware of the arrival of Frank Sinatra's back-up group and his equipment at 2:00 p.m. A dog was requested during this conversation to be on hand at 2:00 p.m. at the Northwest Gate.

I am told that because of the very hectic day we had here Monday, both of our dogs stopped working. To make a long story short, Mr. Sinatra's van with his equipment sat at the Northwest Gate for one hour while Mr. Sinatra sat in the East Room waiting.

While I do totally sympathize that the dogs were exhausted from a long, hot day, I find it totally unacceptable that someone in a supervisory position did not anticipate this -- especially on the day of a State Arrival Ceremony -- and make arrangements early on so that this delay would not occur. Also, there was no initiative taken at the Gate to make alternate arrangements despite the fact that my Deputy personally went to the Gate to see what the delay was. Obviously, Mr. Sinatra could not rehearse without his equipment, which threw everything off by one hour.

I would appreciate your looking into this matter and taking measures to ensure that something like this does not happen in the future as we do have major stars coming into the White House on a regular basis.
