Dear President Reagan,

My father and my grandparents came to this country after the second World War to escape the horror of Communist tyranny in Eastern Europe. I grew up hearing my father talk about how brutal the Soviets were. Many a night I watched him wring his hands and fear for his uncles and cousins who were left behind. I was and still am frustrated by what I see as apathy on the part of our nation. Why, for so many years, have we permitted the Soviet Union to go about their evil business of taking over the globe by spreading their ideology through fear and terror? First in Eastern Europe - then Southeast Asia, and now today in Africa, Afghanistan, and even here in our hemisphere! Are we so blind that we cannot see that there will not be peace until they are stopped or until they take over the globe? Why has the U.S. allowed the Soviets to bully around the world for so long, until now, it almost seems as if there is no stopping them?

Mr. Reagan, I looked forward to the day when you would be elected as our President. Years before you were even a candidate, I remember my father telling me that, "Someday, Ronald Reagan would make a good President!" We believed that you would take a stand for what is right and just.
