

It is now 3;30 in the morning. I have just listened to the latest news from the Phillipines and I felt compelled to write and tell you that I feel that you are on the verge of one of the greatest victories there that one could hope for. If a peaceful transition of power can be achieved without giving the communists an opening to disrupt and destroy the country, then democracy will have mounted a challenge to the Soviets that could turn the tide in the world. As of this moment we can only pray the Marcos will see the light and step down. I cannot think of any way it could have been handled better than you have handled it.

I wanted to thank you for taking time out on the very busy day which you experienced on the 7th, to see me. 
