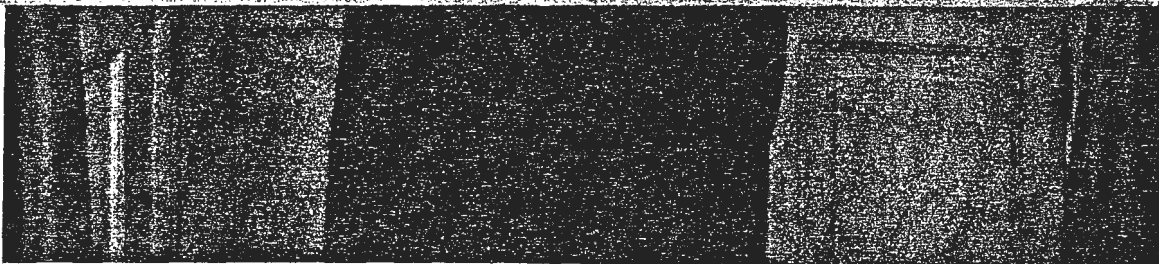

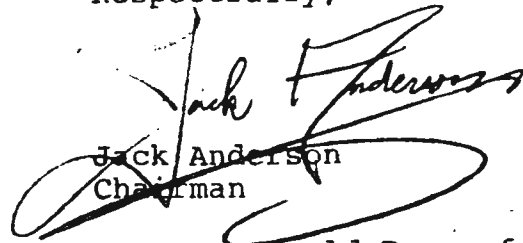

Dear Ron:

It is now 3:30 in the morning. I have just listened to the latest news from the Phillipines and I felt compelled to write and tell you that I feel that you are on the verge of one of the greatest victories there that one could hope for. If a peaceful transition of power can be achieved without giving the communists an opening to disrupt and destroy the country, then democracy will have mounted a challenge to the Soviets that could turn the tide in the world. As of this moment we can only pray the Marcos will see the light and step down. I cannot think of any way it could have been handled better than you have handled it.

I wanted to thank you for taking time out on the very busy day which you experienced on the 7th, to see me. While the meeting was short I think it was fruitful and I was very glad that Don Regan was there. I sent him the material at once and as I didn't know his secretary I sent it through Kathy. She has been such a dependable person. You are blessed to have her.

While the progress has been slow I feel that we are now making progress in helping our people see the picture of the underground communist movement and what it has done to our society. The power center of their operation is clearly centered now in Los Angeles and centers around three persons, Bradley, Cranston and Willie Brown. I am tremendously impressed with Deukmejian. His reelection is vital and anything that can be done to bolster his stature should be done. Perhaps the most important election though is the Senatorial race and that is in a mess. I don't know what has happened to Ed Davis but whatever it is has completely destroyed his usefulness. I understand that after he became State Senator he divorced his wife and married his Secretary which maybe the key, for after he sponsored the gay rights bill it was obvious that something had happened to him. I think it vital that someone with influence move into the situation and try to straighten it out. Bobbie Fiedler has been seriously damaged by what Davis did and I think that the best thing that could happen for her is for her to retrieve her place in the House if that can be done. By far the best man in the race is Bruce Herschensohn but his name identification is very low and he must get going soon on an extensive program if he is to have a chance. We need to come out of the primary with the strongest man possible.

I need to explain to him that while the material is old it establishes an obligation which he has and as you know they never let a person off the hook. I have watched his actions on the key issues and I am certain that when the pressure goes on - he responds. I hope that we may have a chance to talk soon that will give me, to make available all of ~~the~~ <sup>an opportunity</sup> information I have acquired.

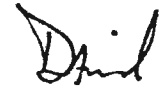

The babies were given to us by a pathologist. They are whole, and perfectly formed. I put this tape together in December and everywhere I show it, people are deeply moved.

I appreciate your stand for life, and because of your response to the "Silent Scream" I know you'd want to view this video. If you want additional copies, or if you want to arrange a private and confidential viewing of the babies for yourself or any members of Congress, I would consider it a privilege to arrange it.

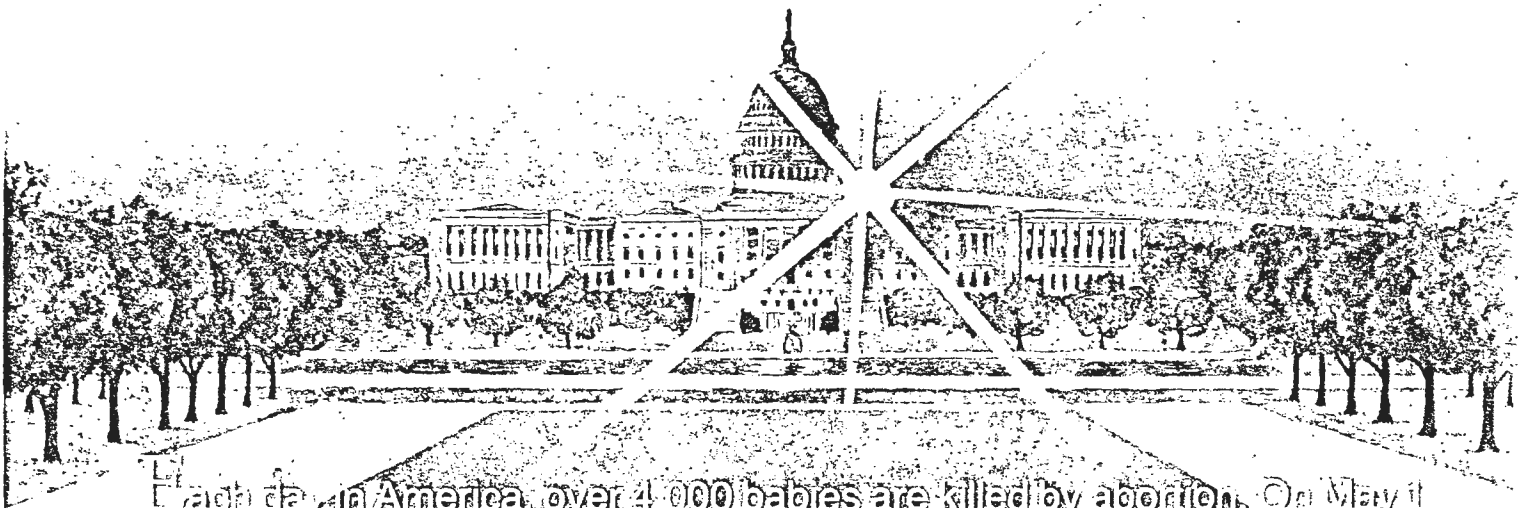
