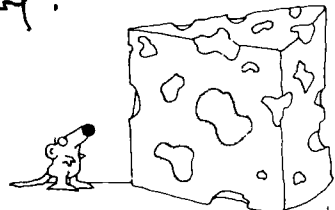

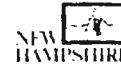

Dear President Ron:

Those guys who give you that continued hard time about SDI don't seem to know how long the USSR has been readying their own versions, or testing elements thereof. I was the guy at NORAD October 4, 1957 when the press queries came flooding in on SPUTNIK & did it have military significance and I said it could have (#1), but the White House/Pentagon position was that it "has no military significance." I later called attention to the nose-thumbing orbit of the first pass(#2) of Major Gherman Titov, and suggested to my boss, General Laurence S. Kuter, the CINC NORAD, that August 7, 1961 was the day to make the assessment that we had now entered the era of a requirement for an anti-satellite satellite system(#3). Again, we were instructed that such statements were dangerous nonsense. Tecumseh prepares for 'Amerika'

TECUMSEH — The courthouse itself has been graciously weathering as a backdrop since 1888. Brand new are the gazebo, a fake cafe and a small store built for the express purpose of being blown up.

At last, the cameras are about to roll on the ABC-TV miniseries "Amerika." For the next couple of months, Tecumseh's picturesque town square will be a movie set — and a "kourtyard."

Yes, the Soviets will have taken over a town square that is proudly listed in its entirety in the National Register of Historic Sites. For movie purposes, the gingerbread-faced stores will have a look of abandonment.

The idea is a Russian takeover, 10 years after.

Ironically, Mayor-carpenter Lavern Bartels has been hammering away at the gazebo with "no real idea" of its part in the 12-hour series. He only knows that ABC's projects brought welcome work to himself, two sons and four other carpenters.

Everyone excited

Bartels also helped build an Elmwood farmhouse that, according to other sources, will be demolished in the film. Respecting the confidentiality of ABC officials, the mayor is virtually mum about movie details.

"We don't know what's going on really, but everybody in town seems to be excited," Bartels said. "The film crews are due the middle of March. Then things should get interesting."

The mayor and his wife, Eloise, have been in the thick of things from the moment ABC Circle Films first approached the town last July. Mrs. Bartels became an instant and effective booster as the town's Chamber of Commerce secretary.

Both admit they are promoters of the film without having read its script. Although it has sparked some controversy, they are unaware of any local opposition of a political nature.

'Morale booster'

"A few merchants' hesitated to see their businesses closed during the filming, but most people are enthusiastic," said Mrs. Bartels. "This is a good morale booster for us."

Along with numerous friends, the Bartels have applied to be extras in the six-

part series. They have been told that there will be 210 speaking parts and that one parade scene will use 800 to 1,000 people.

"I was flooded with phone calls after a local news story mentioned that horses and buggies would appear in the film," Mrs. Bartels said.

An agreement with ABC Circle Films permits use of the downtown area from now until May 31. But City Clerk-Treasurer Steve Waring said actual filming is expected to take only 10 to 15 days.

Network officials have said their crews, who will have their headquarters in Lincoln, probably will spend three to four months in the area. About 25 percent of the film's budget will be spent on the segments being filmed in Nebraska.

Although many storefronts will be altered for the film, Waring said ABC will restore them to original condition. The city official once operated a delicatessen, incidentally, in the building being remodeled as a cafe for the film.

"The agreement assures the integrity of our historic preservation district, which is the whole square plus a half block in each direction," Waring said.

ABC will donate \$5,000 to the city, plus paying separately for use of the community building.

One ABC request calls for moving the memorial World War II tank, which has been at the northwest corner of the courtyard since 1960. It will show up elsewhere in the film, but nobody has explained the specifics.

Interestingly, Tecumseh's City Council did a bit of backtracking to accommodate the filmmakers. Involved was the long-needed replacement of some decorative metalwork on the City Hall. The 1889 structure is a companion showpiece to the courthouse.

"The building has some bad rust, so the council had just approved a repair project," Waring said.

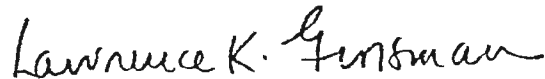

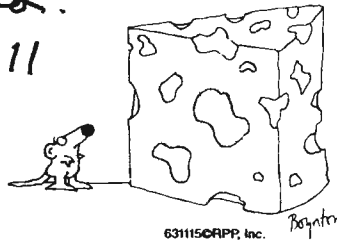

Dear Mr. President:

C.A.D.
Since the murder of my sister, Dayle Okazaki, our family has become victims of a senseless and violent crime. My sister was murdered by the walk-in-killer. Because he has murdered 15 individuals, has numerous attempted murders, and has raped, assaulted and burglarized, kidnapped and molested children, we are told his trial could go on for 5 to 7 years. Because his crimes were so violent, the media has sensationalized the case.

(Since the murder, I have become involved in a support group with other families of homicide victims. In our monthly meetings we share our experiences, our feelings and give each other emotional support. We discuss how much our lives have changed. We have become aware that only in America are criminals allowed more rights and protections than the victims of their crimes.

Families are not only victimized by the crime, they are victimized by the media and by our criminal justice system. Our lives will never be the same. We, as survivors, must help to make changes so that other families will not have to go through what we are going through.

✓ The tide must turn to give victims rights. As it now stands the criminals have all the rights. We are too concerned that the criminal is treated fairly. No consideration is given to families & witnesses who have to testify in these cases. Commuting, taking time off from work, the agony of constantly reliving the crime and learning all the details of what actually happened is painful & draining. So much information is withheld from the family to protect the criminal. The way that the families find out what happened is cruel... and yet they are told to display no emotion in the court room. They have to listen to their loved ones character questioned as if they were the criminal as the defense tries to justify the crime. Where is the justice for the murder victims and their families?

The media exhibits constant insensitivity to the pain of the families by often making false, unproven, or thoughtless statements regarding the victim. Because the media is protected by Constitutional rights there is literally nothing we can do. The victims, especially in the case of murder, cannot defend themselves. It is left to the family in these instances to prove that such statements are not true and that malice is involved. Again, the victim has no rights, and there is no justice.

No one should profit from a violent act. Yet books can be written without the consent of the families involved and the profits used to defend the criminal. It is not right that such a profit can be made from our loss, our pain, our hurt and tears. Profits should be made available to the families who have suffered financially from their loss or donated to an organization to help other victims.

There is no punishment to equal the crime. There is no justice for murder. We will all have to live with a vital part of our lives suddenly and violently taken from us for no good reason. Our lives are filled with constant nightmares, anguish, loneliness, sadness, emptiness, and frustration. The criminal's act is far reaching and effects the lives of far more than his victims. He makes us all a victim, and we the victims end up with the life sentence. Help us so we can make a difference.

And how we live

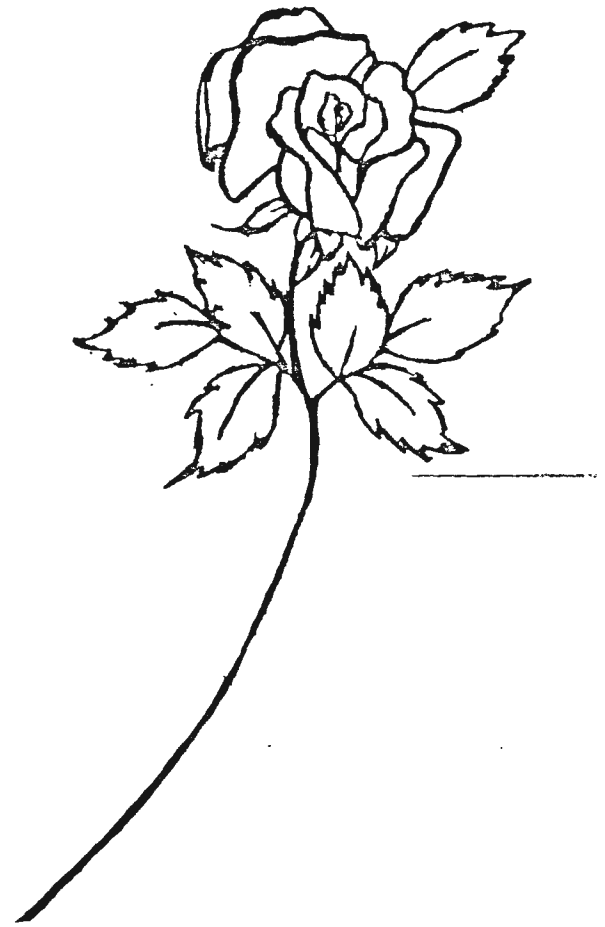
