On last Friday, we discussed our approach to handling Mrs. Thatcher's message to you asking your assistance in ensuring that both the US and the UK could support the text of the communique issued after the NATO Defense Ministers' meeting. This issue was resolved at NATO on Friday. However, it may arise, once again, during the upcoming week in the context of the drafting of the communique for the NATO Foreign Ministers' meeting. This time the French may be the problem.

We have drafted a very short message that we would like to send to Mrs. Thatcher before the Foreign Ministers' meeting. The objectives would be to close the loop with the Prime Minister, and, in the process, see if we could leave a clear marker that you expected her assistance in ensuring the solution on language reached at the Defense Ministers' meeting to hold at the Foreign Ministers' meeting.

The text that we would like to send is as follows:

"Thank you very much for your message of December 2 concerning the nuclear arms control sections of the fall NATO ministerial communiques. I am gratified that we have been able to work out language in the Defense Ministers' communique which supports and protects our mutual interests. [Based on this, and with our two countries standing shoulder-to-shoulder on this language,] there is every reason to believe that we will be equally successful at the Foreign Ministers' meeting next week in maintaining this language which underscores our common approach to these central issues of security and arms control."

SUBJECT: Response to Mrs. Thatcher

Per our conversations on Friday, we did ask State to draft a short response to Mrs. Thatcher on the issue of DPC communique language. The US objectives were to:

- (1) close the loop with the Prime Minister, and
- (2) in the process, see if we could leave a clear marker that the President expected the solution on language reached at the DPC to hold at the NAC.

The State draft cable to this end is at Tab A. It is being held as a crosshatch awaiting the NSC approval for immediate release. As you can see, we think that it needs a bit of strengthening if it is to meet both the US objectives. We would recommend that it be cleared with the changes noted.

Based on your previous conversation with the President on this matter, we do not think that it warrants more of his time. However, should you wish to bring this to the President's attention before releasing the cable, a short memorandum for your use is at Tab I.

SUBJECT: Back Channel Message on SDI from Mrs. Thatcher

Background. Mrs. Thatcher sent the President a back-channel message on SDI (Tab A), amplifying the points she made to Paul Nitze and Richard Perle during their recent consultation trip. The message supports moving to the legally correct interpretation of the ABM Treaty if that is necessary for adequate testing (but not before). Mrs. Thatcher then repeats her argument that we should attempt to structure the SDI program so as to give Gorbachev a sense of predictability, which she believes he must have to go forward with START reductions. You previously sent Mrs. Thatcher's message to the President for his review.

Issues. Two related but distinct issues exist:

- What substantive reply to provide Mrs. Thatcher.
- Whether the suggestion she makes deserves further review.

Mrs. Thatcher's concept is one we have not examined in detail. While her logic is clear, there are some obvious practical problems. There would appear to be no way to negotiate a verifiable road map for the future which would bind both sides, although it might prove feasible to provide unilateral assurances that specific events will not occur before specific dates. Whether providing such assurances would be wise or would make it easier for Gorbachev to agree to START reductions, as Mrs. Thatcher believes, is uncertain.

Given Mrs. Thatcher's interests and her close relationship with the President, we believe her suggestion deserves further study. That study needs to be harmonized with the various other ideas floating around, such as the Kampelman/Lehman approach sent you last week or the ideas Secretary Shultz has been working on but wouldn't discuss at the NSPG two weeks ago. The mechanism for such study and harmonization is the Arms Control Support Group (ACSG). We thus propose that the ACSG undertake a brief examination of Mrs. Thatcher's proposal along the lines set forth at Tab II. The results of that examination will let us determine what, if any, further action to take.

Pending the results of such an examination, we have prepared a suggested reply to Mrs. Thatcher (Tab B) which thanks her for her recommendations, indicates we will give them careful study, and discourages her from raising them with Gorbachev during her impending meeting.

You will recall that Ambassador Price suggested that the President invite Mrs. Thatcher to Washington following her visit to Moscow. We are concerned that this would raise false expectations about a U.S.-Soviet agreement. Our checking indicates the British share this concern and that Mrs. Thatcher is not suggesting a visit to Washington. We understand that Mrs. Thatcher plans to call the President and send him a message after visiting Moscow. Geoffrey Howe will also come to see George Shultz on April 9. The President's reply expresses pleasure that Howe will debrief Shultz.

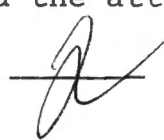

At Tab I is a memorandum for the President forwarding a proposed response via White House channels to Mrs. Thatcher's latest message (28 April) on INF outcomes.
