Those who live today remember those who do not. Those who know freedom remember today those who gave up life for freedom.

Today, in honor of the dead, we conduct ceremonies. We lay wreaths. We speak words of tribute. And in our memories, in our hearts -- we hold them close to us still.

Yet we also know -- even as their families knew when they last looked upon them -- that they can never be fully ours again, that they belong now to God and to that for which they so selflessly made a final and eternal act of devotion.

We could not forget them. Even if they were not our own, we could not forget them. For all time, they are what we can only aspire to be: giving, unselfish, the epitome of human love -- to lay down one's life so that others might live.

We think on their lives. We think on their final moments. In our mind's eye, we see young Americans in a European forest or on an Asian island or at sea or in aerial combat. And as life expired, we know that those who could had last thoughts of us and of their love for us.

As they thought of us then, so too we think of them now. With love, with devotion. And with faith -- the certainty that what they died for was worthy of their sacrifice. Faith too in God and in the Nation that has pledged itself to his work and to the dream of human freedom.

SEQUENCE OF EVENTS

ARRIVAL OF THE PRESIDENT

Presidential motorcade will arrive at the Fort Myer Chapel Gate at 1050 hours. The motorcade will be met by an escort vehicle which will escort the motorcade to the dismount point on the flagstone walk on the north side of the amphitheater. A twenty-one gun salute will be fired during this movement to the dismount point.

MOVEMENT TO THE PLAZA

MG Hilbert will greet President Reagan at the dismount point and brief him on the ceremony, if required. Mr. Turnage, Administrator of Veterans Affairs, and Mr. Skinder, National Commander, Military Order of the Purple Heart will also greet the President at the dismount point. The MDW Ceremonies Officer will organize the personnel accompanying the President and brief them, if necessary.

MG Hilbert will escort President Reagan and accompanying personnel (official party) through an honor cordon along the walk leading to the northern entrance to the plaza and halt on the gray line in front of the Tomb. The official party will be escorted to their position on the steps. (The honor cordon will "PRESENT ARMS" as the President enters the cordon.)

HONORS TO THE NATION:

When the President and the official party are in position on the plaza, the honor guard will "PRESENT ARMS" and the band will play the National Anthem of the United States. On the first note of the music, the official party should render the appropriate salute (hand salute or hand over heart). At the conclusion of the National Anthem, the official party will terminate their salute and the honor guard will "ORDER ARMS".

PLACING OF THE WREATH:

At this time, the wreath bearer, drummer, and bugler move forward, with the drummer and bugler stopping short of the President. The wreath bearer will continue and halt in front of the President who will place his hands on the wreath and step forward as the wreath bearer backs toward the Tomb and places the wreath on the tripod positioned on the plaza. President Reagan then returns to his position beside MG Hilbert on the gray line. The wreath bearer will then move to his position beside the drummer and bugler. The drummer will then sound four muffled ruffles, and the bugler will play "TAPS". On the first note of the drum beat, the offical party should render the appropriate salute.

MOMENT OF SILENCE:

At the conclusion of "TAPS", the official Party will terminate their salutes and the honor guard will "ORDER ARMS". The wreath bearer will then remove his hat indicating the beginning of 30 seconds of silence. All individuals not under arms should then remove their headgear and assume an attitude of prayer for 30 seconds. At the conclusion of the movement of silence, the wreath bearer will click his heels and replace his headgear. All individuals should then also replace their headgear.

MOVEMENT TO THE MEMORIAL DISPLAY ROOM:

MG Hilbert will then escort the President into the Memorial Display Room where he will pause momentarily to be announced into the Amphitheater. During this pause, the invited guests who have observed the wreath ceremony will return to their boxes.

MOVEMENT OF THE PRESIDENT INTO THE AMPHITHEATER:

When the invited guests have returned to their boxes and the official party has been seated in the apse. Four ruffles and flourishes will be sounded followed by announcement of the President and the playing of "Hail to the Chief". At that time, the President will be escorted to his seat in the apse and the Memorial Service will then begin.

DEPARTURE OF THE PRESIDENT:

Following the Memorial Service, MG Hilbert will escort the President from the apse back into the Memorial Display Room. When the official party is ready, MG Hilbert will escort the President down the display room steps onto the plaza and to his vehicle waiting at the original dismount point. An honor cordon will be positioned along the walk that leads up to the President's car. As President Reagan enters the cordon, the cordon will come to "PRESENT ARMS". The motorcade will then depart by way of Roosevelt Drive and Memorial Gate.

CONCLUSION OF CEREMONY:

The departure of President Reagan will conclude the Veterans




