Dear Ms. Fairbanks:

Thank you so much for scheduling time on Friday, June 11 to meet our New York staff experts in housing and neighborhood renewal.

With regard to your interest in a suitable community event I have identified an occasion which seems to encompass your interests as I understand them.

JASA (Jewish Association of Services for the Aged), the largest of the 130 New York Federation social services agencies, is dedicating a 150 unit \$9 million publically funded housing development for the elderly called Scheuer House of Brighton Beach. (I believe the funding was closed during the Reagan administration.)

The community is densely populated by the Jewish very elderly and includes a Soviet immigrant population.

Simultaneously dedicated will be the Scheuer natatorium and health club affiliate of the Shorefront YM-YWHA (Young Men-Young Women Hebrew Association) of Brighton and Manhattan Beach which is funded solely by voluntary contributions as a neighborhood renewal project.

JASA is able to accommodate to your schedule in the month of September exclusive of the Sabbath and the High Holy Days should you elect to move with this event.

I am available at your convenience to provide further details as necessary and I'll forward additional event possibilities as I hear of them.
