

Dear Marshall:

I am enclosing a memorandum that I received today from the Managing Director of The Jewish Press, Rabbi Yehuda Schwartz, outlining a problem that this weekly newspaper suddenly developed with the U.S. Post Office.

As you know, The Jewish Press is the most influential weekly Jewish newspaper in the country, and provides an important service to the Jewish community at large and particularly to the Orthodox Jewish sector.

Unquestionably, the Jewish community has a stake in the survival of The Jewish Press as a viable publication, so that it can continue to provide to the Jewish masses traditional insights on current events and knowledge about the culture and roots of our ancient people.

Obviously, the newspaper publishers were in the total dark that they were violating a technical regulation in the manner that they reported their annual circulation. I have no doubt that had the Post Office auditors who each year inspected their records and files informed The Jewish Press that they must correct their annual statement, this would have been done forthwith.

It would be a severe blow to our entire community if The Jewish Press were to be faulted for this technical violation by compelling the publishers to now pay the U.S. Post Office a large sum of money to retroactively make up for the difference between the second and third-class rates for the past three years.

I respectfully suggest that you bring to the attention of the proper U.S. Postal authorities the deep concern of our community, as well as my suggestion that The Jewish Press in order to correct the records, should be requested to now publish in one of its editions a revised copy of its annual report for the last three years, which would be filled out in accordance with the regulations.

On March 15th, we were visited by two Postal Inspectors from the General Post Office in New York who claimed we were in violation of Second Class permit requirements.

They explained they received a complaint that we were distributing more than half our Postage Circulation at less than half the postage subscription rate. Therefore, now we would be subject to the Third Class rate and conditions instead of the Second Class rates and conditions we had been enjoying up till now.

Also, they explained we would be subject to a retroactive surcharge covering the past three years, which could total a large sum of money. Enclosed is a copy of our 9/16/83 Circulation Statement upon which complaint was made.

Obviously, this will put a heavy, unbearable — and we feel unjustified — financial burden upon The Jewish Press a religious family newspaper that has been supplying news and information for over a quarter of a century throughout the Metropolitan New York area as well as throughout the world.

Until the New York Postal Inspectors brought the complaint to our attention, we were not aware of our failure to comply with Second Class permit requirements.

Notice is hereby given that there is a revenue deficiency in the amount of \$228,137.37 in the second class mailing of the publication, 'Jewish Press', 338 3rd Avenue, Brooklyn, New York 11215. Payment of that amount is to be made to Postmaster, Brooklyn, New York 11201-9998.

A Postal Inspection Audit has found that copies sold to Dan's Distributions were in the nominal rate category. This reduced your paid circulation from 99.8% to 22 %, thus disqualifying the Jewish Press from the general publication category and from mailing at the 2nd class rate.

All copies mailed at the second class rate from 4/28/81 to 2/24/84 have been recomputed at the third class pound rate for domestic copies and at the international regular printed matter rate for foreign copies.
