I am writing this letter to reiterate my support for AID funding for Kiryat Sanz Laniado Hospital in Netanya, Israel.

I discussed the project with William Brew, Economic Consul for the U.S. Embassy in Israel, who recently visited the hospital. Bill was extremely impressed with the operation. He said that it was serving the essential needs of the community, and was clearly badly in need of the funds to continue doing so.

There had been some problems with the Laniado Hospital previously which would tend to disqualify it for AID funding. Bill's observations during his visit support the assertions of the American Friends of Kiryat Sanz Laniado Hospital that these problems have been eliminated. Specifically, he saw that the hospital was staffed with many U.S. citizens, operating along U.S. guidelines, and employed many non-Israeli, non-Jewish professional and support personnel. In addition, the previous director has been replaced with one whose vision and practice are consistent with the goals and policies of the U.S. and of AID.

I urge you to give this project top priority for funding during the current round. Kiryat Sanz Laniado Hospital is exactly the type of project AID seeks to fund.

The sponsoring organization, as represented by the Board of Trustees of the American Friends of Kiryat Sanz Laniado Hospital owns and operates the norpital and the nursing school. As the owners, the trustees have undertaken responsibility for any and all liabilities incurred by the hospital, either as regards financial management or patient care. Moreover, as the ultimate agency of responsibility, the Board accepts the burden of ascertaining that medical services of the highest quality are delivered to the patients; that medical approaches are made in the community to prevent illness; that the physicians on the the staff will use the catchment area to study appropriate medical problems, and provide data which may be used by medical researchers all over the world.

The Board of Trustees of the American Friends of Kiryat Sanz Laniado Hospital has the legal responsibility for control of the quality of medical care in the hospital. To achieve this objective it monitors ongoing programs by receiving, reviewing, evaluating and reacting to monthly reports which contain evidence of the staffs' performance. It thereby gives assurance that the medical staff is well organized; that the most effective medical audit procedures are employed; that the nursing service is efficiently organized and that fruitful research is being carried out.

To enable the hospital to function on a day-to-day basis, the Board of Trustees has appointed a hospital administrator, a medical director, and key hospital personnel. The Board delegates to these executives the authority and responsibility to manage the operations of the hospitals and retaining unto itself ultimate responsibility. The Board has also assigned the responsibility for day-to-day operations to a steering committee in Israel.

The Board of Trustees of Laniado Hosptial is self-perpetuating, meets regularly to receive reports, and plans all of the activities of the hospital.

D. DESCRIPTION OF OVERSEAS INSTITUTION

18. DESCRIBE THE NATURE OF THE OVERSEAS INSTITUTION; ITS HISTORY, OBJECTIVES, AND EXISTING AND PLANNED IMPACT ON THE COMMUNITY.

Kiryat Sanz Laniado Hospital was founded in 1962 concurrent with the founding of Kiryat Sanz, a suburb of the city of Netanya. Designed by a predominantly American Board and staffed principally by American and American trained personnel, the hospital was opened in 1976 to provide medical services for Kiryat Sanz, the city of Netanya, and the entire Sharon region consisting of 220,000 residents.

This region comprises an area of 50 miles to the north and south of Netanya. The growing population is making increasing demands upon the hospital and its staff.

Kiryat Sanz Laniado Hospital has 120 patient beds. Plans call for additional beds by the early 1990s to accommodate the growing needs of an increasing population. Over 30,000 patients are treated in the emergency room each year. Over 12,000 babies were born at Laniado since the opening in 1976. The hospital has a Day Care

Program; a Home Care Program; departments of Ophthalmology, Obstetrics, Gynecology, Internal Medicine, a Cardiac department with a Coronary intensive care unit, a Urology local tment, Department of Surgery, Hemo-Dialysis treatment facility, Pediatrics, a Newborn and Infant Care Center, a center for childhood illness, a chronic disease hospital, and a nursing school.

During the past decade hospital facilities have been constructed to meet increased needs. The nursing school facilities, however, have not kept up with the pace of growth. The nursing school is currently housed in two renovated residential buildings, totally inadequate to train 120 students. Student nurses continue to be housed in rented apartments dispersed throughout the neiborhood. This makes study difficult and inhibits an espirit-de-corps which developes when all the students occupy a single dormitory facility. The academic spaces and the library facilities are not on a level with the high quality of instruction and training.

There is a great need at the present time to upgrade the nurses' training facilities and residences to match the level of hospital staff and facilities.

Kiryat Sanz Laniado Hospital continues to be a study and demonstration center for American ideas and practices.

Community Care Programs

a) For the general population

Laniado Hospital developes and institutionalizes community care programs. Laniado physicians and para medical staff work out of community facilities to bring preventive medicine and early detection of disease to a population not sophisticated in the skills of acquiring medical help. American doctors encourage the citizens of the region to engage in practices which will be conducive to good health and to seek help for detected illness. Orientals who are not educated in obtaining medical help and Chassidic Jews often rely upon natural events to relieve their afflictions. Laniado reaches out into the communities, into the schools and into other community organizations to provide instruction in self help and reliance upon professional medical practitioners.

b) For the elderly

All residents over 65 years of age are offered physical checkups every 1 112. Secretaring procedure 1212 a thorough physical examination. We have discovered that the cost of overall pre-disease screenings of this sort prevent the much greater cost of treating well developed diseases. Following sound American practices, elderly persons are looked after and are enabled to live independently in the community. Thus fewer geriatric facilities are needed and the elderly can go about their personal lives without requiring special assistance.

In general, Laniado's community outreach program employing American practices in community and family medicine enable the physicians to encourage proper nutrition, inculcate habits leading to disease prevention, and enable early disease detection.

Unit-Dose Packaging System

A patient drug packaging procedure, not currently used widely in Israel, but extremely efficient and popularly use in the United States is the Unit-Dose packaging system. This is a procedure in which tablets and medications are prepared for each patient requiring them on an individual basis. Laniado is the first hospital to use this system effectively in Israel. Since that time (in the last three years), the system has been employed extensively in a number of other hospitals, primarily major medical centers here in Israel by virtue of the example set by Laniado Hospital. All the equipment utilized in the packaging system including the packaging machines, liquid bottle fillers, labelling machines, and Unit-Dose dispensing carts, are products which orginate in the United States.

Continuity of Care

The American practice which brings the physician practicing in the community into the hospital and allows the hospital staff physician to practice in the community is meeting with great resistance in Israel. As an American hospital controlled by an American Board, Laniado has made giant strides in its efforts to make this system operative in Kiryat Sanz Laniado Hospital. This practice is now becoming increasingly possible because of the large number of American trained and American born physicians who are taking an active role in the Board's decisions as well as on the hospital staff.

Distribution of function

We have been successful in achieving a significant distribution of functions and responsibilities in the hospital

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itself. Major among these achievements has been the successful transition of many functions normally conducted by physicians but currently assigned to non-medical administrative staffs.

Medical and Surgical Equipment and Supplies

The American and American trained physicians who serve on the staff of Kiryat Sanz Laniado Hospital have ascertained that the equipment and supplies they require are the same as those to which they were accustomed in the United States. The hospital contains an impressive amount of made in USA equipment and supplies.

- 1. All patient room beds and bedside equipment are of Simmons Mfg. or Interoyal Manufacturing Company and are purchased in the United States.
- 2. All monitors in the Department of Surgery are manufactured by Menen-Greatbach in the United States.
- 3. Most heavy components such as operating tables (AMACO) and operating utilities are purchased in America from Ohio Medical, Valley Lab Generators.
- 4. The Hemodialysis unit consists exclusively of Travenol equipment of U.S. manufacture.
- 5. Diagnostic equipment in the Cardiology Department includes a Cambridge Stress Test System with treadmill and monitoring apparatus. It also includes an Electronics-for-Medicine Echocardiograph system which is manufactured and purchased in the United States.
- 6. Equipment in the Intensive Coronary Care Unit includes the Menen-Greatbach monitoring equipment, Bennett respirators and Meditronic pacemakers.

Library

The hospital library can easily be mistaken for one in the United States. The language of oral communication is English. The system of classification is American, and the books and journals are predominantly in English and from the U.S.A. The card files, shelving system, and circulation programs are designed in accordance with American standards.

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The element which distinguishes Kiryat Sanz Laniado Hospital from all other similar hospitals in Israel is the fact that it is wholly controlled by an American Board of Trustees which is determined to emulate American practices in Israel as a demonstration to the professional staffs and Boards of other Israeli hospitals, that American ideas and practices are efficient, affordable and worthy of duplication in the Middle East.

To achieve this end the Board has sought to staff the hospital with American trained physicians and nurses. It can boast of an impressive staff at present. The Board is resolved to recruit two new full-time American trained physicians each year as needed. Moreover, because of its commitment to American ideas and practices, the Board has requested that its Medical director establish a formal procedure to encourage American ideas and practices. This is an appropriate opportunity to introduce the Medical Director.

The Medical Director

The Medical Director of Kiryat Sanz Laniado Hospital is Dr. Yaacov Tendler. Dr. Tendler as his biography reveals was born in the United States, attended an American college, received his medical degree at the Albert Einstein College of Medicine, served as an intern and later as a resident in American hospitals and holds the Diplomate from the American Board of Internal Medicine and The American Board of Pulmonology.

Other American Major Staff Appointments: The Department of Ophthalmology

The Department of Ophthalmology is comprised of the Chief, Dr. George Rubin, who is a United States citizen, graduate of K.C.O.S. (1953) and Diplomate of the American Board of Ophthalmology (1980) and Dr. Levi Rothkopf, a United States citizen, graduate of New York Medical College (1965) and Diplomate of the American Board of Ophthalmology (1971). Dr. Peter Ballen who is Chief Ophthalmic Consultant is a United States citizen, graduate of New York Medical College (1948), Captain, United States Air Force (1951-1953), and Diplomate of the American Board of Ophthalmology (1954). He has served as Professor of Clinical Ophthalmology, Stonybrook University Medical Center from 1973 to the present and specialized in ophthalmic plastic surgery and intra-ocular lens implants at Laniado Hospital.

The Department of Surgery

The Chief of Surgery is Dr. Baruch Schmidt, a United States citizen, who was graduated from the Washington University School of Medicine, at St. Louis, Missouri (1962) and served in the United State Air Force (1963-1965). Dr. Schmidt specialized in General Surgery at Upstate Medical Center of New York, Syracuse (1966-1969) and is a Diplomate of the American Board of Surgery (1970)

Director of Home Care

Dr. Leslie Kay, a United States citizen, was graduated from the University of Rome, Italy in 1936 and practiced

medicine in New York for 37 years. At Laniado Hospital he is a staff member of the Department of Internal Medicine and Director of Home Care.

Dr. Steven Ulano, Board Certified both in Internal Medicine and General Surgery is currently serving at Laniado.

Dr. Bert Kaufman, a U.S. trained specialist in Emergency medicine, is in charge of the Emergency room.

In addition to these full-time key people on the medical staff, the Medical Director regularly recruits nationally respected American medical specialists who visit the hospital to share their knowledge with the staff and the administration. These prominent medical educators make rounds, give lectures, conduct seminars, all designed to encourage American medical practices and ideas.

III

Kiryat Sanz Laniado Hospital serves as a center to teaching and medical research. Utilizing its distinctive population, the research arm of the staff seeks to utilize its research both to improve the quality of life and health of those living in the hospital catchment area and to assist other researchers in their work.

The oriental and chassidic communities provide a unique population. The study of which may be used as a contrast to other communities. Tropical diseases have been and continue to be studied by others. Laniado will make its medical contribution by studying its population carefully.

Nutrition

The population of a major portion of Kiryat Sanz has established eating habits which are of a high salt-high cholestrol nature. Physicians at Laniado are performing a study comparing their population with those in the United States and will correlate the effects in both regions. This will be helpful both to Israeli as well as to American researchers.

Many Children Families

One of the unusual characteristics of Kiryat Sanz and its environment is the size of the family. Many families have as many as eight and ten children. A study will be designed to identify the special pre-natal needs of mothers who have already had four or more children combined with follow-up studies which will be undertaken to trace the physical development of children born as 8th, 9th, and 10th to one mother.

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Laniado's impact upon the community

The effect of the practices of Laniado upon the community are:

The health and quality of life of the population will be significantly improved.

Outreach efforts will effect the very young and the very old. The very young will benefit from improved prenatal programs. Children born after many previous children will have a better chance for survival and normal growth and development. The elderly will receive regular checkups often preventing debilitating, costly diseases.

Improvement of nutritional regimens will assuredly prevent nutrigional illness.

Physicians will learn to follow their patients into the hospital and hospital based physicians will learn to allow outsiders in. By thus amalgamating community practice with hospital-based physicians the quality of medical practice and the health of the population will improve.

Beyond the community, Laniado's research will assist the student of medicine by providing the specialized information needed when special populations are studied.

But an even more important contribution Laniado will ultimately make is to demonstrate the effectiveness of American medical practices and procedures in the management and delivery of medical services.

95% of all patients are covered by either Kupat Cholim (The Sick Fund) or Bituach Leumi (National Health Insurance Plan) which pays at the rate of 5,500 Israeli Shekel, or approximately \$110 per day. The difference between rate paid and cost is covered by the American Friends.

80% of the patients treated are working people. 15% are children of such families and 5% are tourists or private pay patients.

Department of Cardiology is using American techniques with treadmill stress testing and Swan Ganz catheter hemodynamic monitoring to assess patients' states and test vasodilator therapy. In addition, we are using echocardiogram and radioisotipe nuclear heart scans to assess ambiguous diagnoses.

Department of Pulmonary Medicine, directed by a U.S. trained and Board certified pulmonologist, is using research to test bronchodilator therapy and assess patients' status. The bronchoscopy unit detects early malignancies. The pulmonary function unit, as part of the entire community educational effort of the hospital, educates the public to stop smoking and detect early changes in lung function due to smoking. We comply with the guidelines of the American Thoracic Society.

<u>Surgery Department</u> is directed by a U.S. Board certified surgeon. The Vascular Surgery Service is conducting clinical research, using sophisticated techniques, i.e. Doppler studies of nerve blocks in the treatment of peripheral vascular disease.

The <u>Gynecology Department</u>'s infertility experts are doing tuboplasty and other corrective techniques for infertility

The <u>Neonatal Unit</u> uses apnea monitors and equipment for a Neonatal Premature Intensive Care Unit - utilizing respirators, incubators, umbilical artery catheterization, etc.

The <u>Nursing Department</u> has introduced primary nursing care in most departments. Together with the pharmacy, the nursing peak contract the contract of medication and a Cardex System to minimize staff errors.

The lay administrative staff of the hospital has now assumed many of the non-medical functions weretofore performed by the physicians. In addition to improving the efficiency of the hospital, this has also added more medical man hours to direct patient care. The entire administrative policy and procedure manual is being patterned after the U.S. system.



The sponsoring organization, as represented by the Board of Trustees of the American Friends of Kiryat Sanz Laniado Hospital owns and operates the hospital and the nursing school. As the owners, the trustees have undertaken responsibility for any and all liabilities incurred by the hospital, either as regards financial management or patient care. Moreover, as the ultimate agency of responsibility, the Board accepts the burden of ascertaining that medical services of the highest quality are delivered to the patients; that medical approaches are made in the community to prevent illness; that the physicians on the the staff will use the catchment area to study appropriate medical problems, and provide data which may be used by medical researchers all over the world.

The Board of Trustees of the American Friends of Kiryat Sanz Laniado Hospital has the legal responsibility for control of the quality of medical care in the hospital. To achieve this objective it monitors ongoing programs by receiving, reviewing, evaluating and reacting to monthly reports which contain evidence of the staffs' performance. It thereby gives assurance that the medical staff is well organized; that the most effective medical audit procedures are employed; that the nursing service is efficiently organized and that fruitful research is being carried out.

To enable the hospital to function on a day-to-day basis, the Board of Trustees has appointed a hospital administrator, a medical director, and key hospital personnel. The Board delegates to these executives the authority and responsibility to manage the operations of the hospitals and retaining unto itself ultimate responsibility. The Board has also assigned the responsibility for day-to-day operations to a steering committee in Israel.

The Board of Trustees of Laniado Hosptial is self-perpetuating, meets regularly to receive reports, and plans all of the activities of the hospital.

D. DESCRIPTION OF OVERSEAS INSTITUTION

18. DESCRIBE THE NATURE OF THE OVERSEAS INSTITUTION; ITS HISTORY, OBJECTIVES, AND EXISTING AND PLANNED IMPACT ON THE COMMUNITY.

Kiryat Sanz Laniado Hospital was founded in 1962 concurrent with the founding of Kiryat Sanz, a suburb of the city of Netanya. Designed by a predominantly American Board and staffed principally by American and American trained personnel, the hospital was opened in 1976 to provide medical services for Kiryat Sanz, the city of Netanya, and the entire Sharon region consisting of 220,000 residents.

This region comprises an area of 50 miles to the north and south of Netanya. The growing population is making increasing demands upon the hospital and its staff.

Kiryat Sanz Laniado Hospital has 120 patient beds. Plans call for additional beds by the early 1990s to accommodate the growing needs of an increasing population. Over 30,000 patients are treated in the emergency room each year. Over 12,000 babies were born at Laniado since the opening in 1976. The hospital has a Day Care

Program; a Home Care Program; departments of Ophthalmology,
Obstetrics, Gynecology, Internal Medicine, a Cardiac department
with a Coronary intensive care unit, a Urology department, Department
of Surgery, Hemo-Dialysis treatment facility, Pediatrics, a
Newborn and Infant Care Center, a center for childhood illness,
a chronic disease hospital, and a nursing school.

During the past decade hospital facilities have been constructed to meet increased needs. The nursing school facilities, however, have not kept up with the pace of growth. The nursing school is currently housed in two renovated residential buildings, totally inadequate to train 120 students. Student nurses continue to be housed in rented apartments dispersed throughout the neiborhood. This makes study difficult and inhibits an <u>espirit-de-corps</u> which developes when all the students occupy a single dormitory facility. The academic spaces and the library facilities are not on a level with the high quality of instruction and training.

There is a great need at the present time to upgrade the nurses' training facilities and residences to match the level of hospital staff and facilities.

Kiryat Sanz Laniado Hospital continues to be a study and demonstration center for American ideas and practices.

Community Care Programs

a) For the general population

Laniado Hospital developes and institutionalizes community care programs. Laniado physicians and para medical staff work out of community facilities to bring preventive medicine and early detection of disease to a population not sophisticated in the skills of acquiring medical help. American doctors encourage the citizens of the region to engage in practices which will be conducive to good health and to seek help for detected illness. Orientals who are not educated in obtaining medical help and Chassidic Jews often rely upon natural events to relieve their afflictions. Laniado reaches out into the communities, into the schools and into other community organizations to provide instruction in self help and reliance upon professional medical practitioners.

b) For the elderly

All residents over 65 years of age are offered physical checkups every 6 months. Screening procedures include a thorough physical examination. We have discovered that the cost of overall pre-disease screenings of this sort prevent the much greater cost of treating well developed diseases. Following sound American practices, elderly persons are looked after and are enabled to live independently in the community. Thus fewer geriatric facilities are needed and the elderly can go about their personal lives without requiring special assistance.

In general, Laniado's community outreach program employing American practices in community and family medicine enable the physicians to encourage proper nutrition, inculcate habits leading to disease prevention, and enable early disease detection.

Unit-Dose Packaging System

A patient drug packaging procedure, not currently used widely in Israel, but extremely efficient and popularly use in the United States is the Unit-Dose packaging system. This is a procedure in which tablets and medications are prepared for each patient requiring them on an individual basis. Laniado is the first hospital to use this system effectively in Israel. Since that time (in the last three years), the system has been employed extensively in a number of other hospitals, primarily major medical centers here in Israel by virtue of the example set by Laniado Hospital. All the equipment utilized in the packaging system including the packaging machines, liquid bottle fillers, labelling machines, and Unit-Dose dispensing carts, are products which orginate in the United States.

Continuity of Care

The American practice which brings the physician practicing in the community into the hospital and allows the hospital staff physician to practice in the community is meeting with great resistance in Israel. As an American hospital controlled by an American Board, Laniado has made giant strides in its efforts to make this system operative in Kiryat Sanz Laniado Hospital. This practice is now becoming increasingly possible because of the large number of American trained and American born physicians who are taking an active role in the Board's decisions as well as on the hospital staff.

Distribution of function

We have been successful in achieving a significant distribution of functions and responsibilities in the hospital

itself. Major among these achievements has been the successful transition of many functions normally conducted by physicians but currently assigned to non-medical administrative staffs.

Medical and Surgical Equipment and Supplies

The American and American trained physicians who serve on the staff of Kiryat Sanz Laniado Hospital have ascertained that the equipment and supplies they require are the same as those to which they were accustomed in the United States. The hospital contains an impressive amount of made in USA equipment and supplies.

- 1. All patient room beds and bedside equipment are of Simmons Mfg. or Interoyal Manufacturing Company and are purchased in the United States.
- 2. All monitors in the Department of Surgery are manufactured by Menen-Greatbach in the United States.
- 3. Most heavy components such as operating tables (AMACO) and operating utilities are purchased in America from Ohio Medical, Valley Lab Generators.
- 4. The Hemodialysis unit consists exclusively of Travenol equipment of U.S. manufacture.
- 5. Diagnostic equipment in the Cardiology Department includes a Cambridge Stress Test System with treadmill and monitoring apparatus. It also includes an Electronics-for-Medicine Echocardiograph system which is manufactured and purchased in the United States.
- 6. Equipment in the Intensive Coronary Care Unit includes the Menen-Greatbach monitoring equipment, Bennett respirators and Meditronic pacemakers.

Library

The hospital library can easily be mistaken for one in the United States. The language of oral communication is English. The system of classification is American, and the books and journals are predominantly in English and from the U.S.A. The card files, shelving system, and circulation programs are designed in accordance with American standards.

TT

The element which distinguishes Kiryat Sanz Laniado Hospital from all other similar hospitals in Israel is the fact that it is wholly controlled by an American Board of Trustees which is determined to emulate American practices in Israel as a demonstration to the professional staffs and Boards of other Israeli hospitals, that American ideas and practices are efficient, affordable and worthy of duplication in the Middle East.

To achieve this end the Board has sought to staff the hospital with American trained physicians and nurses. It can boast of an impressive staff at present. The Board is resolved to recruit two new full-time American trained physicians each year as needed. Moreover, because of its commitment to American ideas and practices, the Board has requested that its Medical director establish a formal procedure to encourage American ideas and practices. This is an appropriate opportunity to introduce the Medical Director.

The Medical Director

The Medical Director of Kiryat Sanz Laniado Hospital is Dr. Yaacov Tendler. Dr. Tendler as his biography reveals was born in the United States, attended an American college, received his medical degree at the Albert Einstein College of Medicine, served as an intern and later as a resident in American hospitals and holds the Diplomate from the American Board of Internal Medicine and The American Board of Pulmonology.

Other American Major Staff Appointments:
The Department of Ophthalmology

The Department of Ophthalmology is comprised of the Chief, Dr. George Rubin, who is a United States citizen, graduate of K.C.O.S. (1953) and Diplomate of the American Board of Ophthalmology (1980) and Dr. Levi Rothkopf, a United States citizen, graduate of New York Medical College (1965) and Diplomate of the American Board of Ophthalmology (1971). Dr. Peter Ballen who is Chief Ophthalmic Consultant is a United States citizen, graduate of New York Medical College (1948), Captain, United States Air Force (1951-1953), and Diplomate of the American Board of Ophthalmology (1954). He has served as Professor of Clinical Ophthalmology, Stonybrook University Medical Center from 1973 to the present and specialized in ophthalmic plastic surgery and intra-ocular lens implants at Laniado Hospital.

The Department of Surgery

The Chief of Surgery is Dr. Baruch Schmidt, a United States citizen, who was graduated from the Washington University School of Medicine, at St. Louis, Missouri (1962) and served in the United State Air Force (1963-1965). Dr. Schmidt specialized in General Surgery at Upstate Medical Center of New York, Syracuse (1966-1969) and is a Diplomate of the American Board of Surgery (1970)

Director of Home Care

Dr. Leslie Kay, a United States citizen, was graduated from the University of Rome, Italy in 1936 and practiced

medicine in New York for 37 years. At Laniado Hospital he is a staff member of the Department of Internal Medicine and Director of Home Care.

Dr. Steven Ulano, Board Certified both in Internal Medicine and General Surgery is currently serving at Laniado.

Dr. Bert Kaufman, a U.S. trained specialist in Emergency medicine, is in charge of the Emergency room.

In addition to these full-time key people on the medical staff, the Medical Director regularly recruits nationally respected American medical specialists who visit the hospital to share their knowledge with the staff and the administration. These prominent medical educators make rounds, give lectures, conduct seminars, all designed to encourage American medical practices and ideas.

III

Kiryat Sanz Laniado Hospital serves as a center to teaching and medical research. Utilizing its distinctive population, the research arm of the staff seeks to utilize its research both to improve the quality of life and health of those living in the hospital catchment area and to assist other researchers in their work.

The oriental and chassidic communities provide a unique population. The study of which may be used as a contrast to other communities. Tropical diseases have been and continue to be studied by others. Laniado will make its medical contribution by studying its population carefully.

Nutrition

The population of a major portion of Kiryat Sanz has established eating habits which are of a high salt-high cholestrol nature. Physicians at Laniado are performing a study comparing their population with those in the United States and will correlate the effects in both regions. This will be helpful both to Israeli as well as to American researchers.

Many Children Families

One of the unusual characteristics of Kiryat Sanz and its environment is the size of the family. Many families have as many as eight and ten children. A study will be designed to identify the special pre-natal needs of mothers who have already had four or more children combined with follow-up studies which will be undertaken to trace the physical development of children born as 8th, 9th, and 10th to one mother.

B. DESCRIBE THE HOSPITAL'S RATE STRUCTURE AND INCLUDE INFORMATION ON THE INCOME LEVELS OF PATIENTS.

95% of all patients are covered by either Kupat Cholim (The Sick Fund) or Bituach Leumi (National Health Insurance Plan) which pays at the rate of 5,500 Israeli Shekel, or approximately \$110 per day. The difference between rate paid and cost is covered by the American Friends.

80% of the patients treated are working people. 15% are children of such families and 5% are tourists or private pay patients.

Department of Cardiology is using American techniques with treadmill stress testing and Swan Ganz catheter hemodynamic monitoring to assess patients' states and test vasodilator therapy. In addition, we are using echocardiogram and radioisotipe nuclear heart scans to assess ambiguous diagnoses.

Department of Pulmonary Medicine, directed by a U.S. trained and Board certified pulmonologist, is using research to test bronchodilator therapy and assess patients' status. The bronchoscopy unit detects early malignancies. The pulmonary function unit, as part of the entire community educational effort of the hospital, educates the public to stop smoking and detect early changes in lung function due to smoking. We comply with the guidelines of the American Thoracic Society.

<u>Surgery Department</u> is directed by a U.S. Board certified surgeon. The Vascular Surgery Service is conducting clinical research, using sophisticated techniques, i.e. Doppler studies of nerve blocks in the treatment of peripheral vascular disease.

The <u>Gynecology Department</u>'s infertility experts are doing tuboplasty and other corrective techniques for infertility

The <u>Neonatal Unit</u> uses apnea monitors and equipment for a Neonatal Premature Intensive Care Unit - utilizing respirators, incubators, umbilical artery catheterization, etc.

The <u>Nursing Department</u> has introduced primary nursing care in most departments. Together with the pharmacy, the nursing Department introduced Unit Doses of medication and a Cardex System to minimize staff errors.

The lay administrative staff of the hospital has now assumed many of the non-medical functions weretofore performed by the physicians. In addition to improving the efficiency of the hospital, this has also added more medical man hours to direct patient care. The entire administrative policy and procedure manual is being patterned after the U.S. system.

The purpose of the requested funds is to provide a sum of money which will be matched by the Board of Trustees to construct a suitable facility for our nursing school. As indicated earlier, this school has not grown apace with the hospital and currently functions out of totally inadequate facilities. The two renovated multiple dwellings do not provide adequate space for the needs of an up-to-date nursing school.

There is a need for buildings of 4,200 square meters to serve the programs of the nursing school.

A tract of land has been made available for a nursing school on hospital grounds. An administration wing, a residence hall for 120 students, and an academic center will comprise the nursing school campus.

Administrative Wing

The administrative wing will include:

- 2) teachers' lounge
- 3) meeting rooms
- 4) record storage
- 5) pantry, storage, dressing rooms
- 6) 3 rooms for instructors

Residence Hall

The residence hall will include:

- 2) kitchen and dining room
- 3) lounge
- 4) house mother's apartment and office
- 5) shelter
- 6) power plant

Academic Center

The academic center will include:

- 4 lecture rooms, each accommodating up to 40 students. Movable partition walls can create

ANNUAL DINNER

The American Friends office in New York conducts an annual dinner campaign which is a six month program based on the selection of several well known communal leaders to receive an award. Each awardee solicits his friends, family and business associates to place advertisements in a journal in honor of all the awardees. In addition, these people are solicited to purchase reservation tickets at the dinner itself which is held traditionally in one of New York's fine ballrooms.

PARLOR MEETINGS

Five or six times each year, an evening benefit is held at the home of a volunteer at which time a prominent guest speaker speaks about the importance of the hospital's work. A brief audio visual presentation is shown, which features actual photographs taken at the hospital in Israel, and then, an open appeal is made for funds. Those attending usually are close acquaintances of the host.

DIRECT MAIL APPEALS

Twice yearly, a mailing is produced to elicit contribution responses from a broad audience whose names and addresses can be acquired from mailing list brokers at a nominal fee.

RADIO PROGRAM

Every Wednesday morning at 9:15 A.M., we have arranged with New York station WEVD F.M. for fifteen minutes of air time which is used to broadcast an appeal for funds for the hospital. The appeal usually is made in order to purchase a particular piece of equipment which is then dedicated in the name of the donors/listeners. Approximately 25-30 small contributions are received in response to the program each week.
