Dear Fellow Board Member:

I am writing to you at this time about our National Convention scheduled for this forthcoming Thanksgiving Weekend at the Hyatt Regency Hotel in Baltimore, Maryland.

The National Convention of an organization such as ours is a time to evaluate our accomplishments, scrutinize our unfulfilled plans and renew our commitment to the goals to which the Orthodox Union is dedicated. To this end the Convention Committee, under the leadership of its Chairmen, Saul Quinn and Michael Wimpfheimer, ably assisted by their Program Chairman, Dr. David Luchins, have fashioned what I believe to be a unique and compelling program.

You will receive in the mail shortly a full preview of the Convention proceedings, the sessions and the names of the luminaries who will address us. I fully expect that the Convention program will be a memorable, informative and inspiring experience.

One of the highlights of this Convention will be an opportunity to pay tribute to two outstanding individuals who have left an historic mark on Jewry and who have created the foundations for today's Orthodox Union.

At the Thursday night Banquet we will pay tribute to our Executive Vice President, Rabbi Pinchas Stolper, who will be honored for 25 years of devoted and creative service to Jewry and the Orthodox Union. Rabbi Stolper's quarter century of service began in 1959 with his founding and leading the Union's youth movement -- the National Conference of Synagogue Youth (NCSY) -- from its infancy through its seminal role in the international Teshuva movement to its becoming one of the largest and most effective movements of Jewish youth. In 1976 Rabbi Stolper was appointed to the post of Executive Vice President of the Orthodox Union and has led our organization into an era of greatly expanded communal, education and outreach programs with much idealism and distinction. A widely respected writer, and speaker, Rabbi Stolper's books and articles on



every facet of Jewish life have earned him a broad following as a major Jewish thinker and leader.

At the Saturday night Convention Banquet the Orthodox Union's National Kashruth Award will be given for the first time to an individual -- Chairman of the Board, Nathan K. Gross -- who has served as distinguished Chairman of the Joint Kashruth Commission for over three decades. Nat's unique talents as lay leader of the Union's Kashruth program have been a special ingredient in its phenomenal growth and acceptance worldwide. He earned and has maintained the trust of the top echelons of the giants of the food industry, who placed their confidence in his integrity. His ability to earn the confidence of both the rabbinic and the lay communities and to serve as a catalyst to bring opposing sides together is unique. His idealism and devotion to the mitzvah of Kashruth observance are without parallel. More than any layman, he is responsible for the worldwide acceptance of the O.U. Kashruth symbol and its pre-eminent position as the guarantor of the highest standards of Kashruth.

In addition to an outstanding program and the opportunity to pay tribute to two individuals to whom we all owe so much, the luxurious guest accommodations of this famous hotel promise an enjoyable and relaxing vacation experience for the entire family.

But -- and there is always a "but" -- on such an occasion the full success of the Convention is dependent upon the presence of people such as yourself. By gathering our most prominent leaders from across the continent, it will give us the opportunity to marshal our resources so as to make the Union an even finer instrument for the enhancement of Yiddishkeit and the promotion of Torah.

As you know, this will be the conclusion of my third and last term as Orthodox Union President. I look forward to the pleasure of personally thanking all of those individuals who have aided me in achieving the goals of my Administration. In addition, I hope you will help me create that special environment of fraternal support as I pass the sceptre to a new Administration.

Therefore, in the event you haven't as yet, I want to take this opportunity to remind you to make your reservations for the Convention as quickly as possible. I look forward to the pleasure of greeting you at the Convention and enjoying together a weekend filled with accomplishment and inspiration.

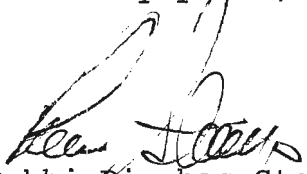

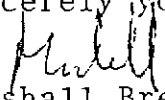
