Dear Mr. Breger:

Recently, Father Timothy Healy, President of Georgetown University, spoke with you on the subject of a forthcoming conference that is cosponsored by the Anti-Defamation League of B'nai B'rith and the Woodrow Wilson International Center for Scholars of the Smithsonian Institution. The conference is entitled "Democratic Freedom, Democratic Responsibility: The Delicate Balance Between Liberty and License."

The conference will involve approximately one hundred selected men and women, all of whom are influential and respected authorities in their fields, in a critical investigation of the decline of democratic values and practices in the United States and of the ways in which such decline can be reversed. This is a most timely gathering, considering the current one hundred and fiftieth anniversary of the publication of the first volume of de Tocqueville's Democracy in America and the coming bicentennial of the United States Constitution.

We feel that it would be entirely proper and fitting for this event to be highlighted by a concluding reception at the White House, hosted by the President and Mrs. Reagan, for the conferees. Such a reception would be scheduled from 6:00 to 7:00 P.M. on one of the following dates:

A White House reception would guarantee the success and wider societal impact of this undertaking. Since we need to send out invitations and see to the organizational details fairly soon, we would appreciate a response as soon as one can be obtained.

## Conference Proposal

### DEMOCRATIC FREEDOM, DEMOCRATIC RESPONSIBILITY:

### THE DELICATE BALANCE BETWEEN LIBERTY AND LICENSE

Sidney Hook has recently outlined what he has come to see as the greatest challenge facing American democracy today: the decline of liberty into license. In his words:

Since World War II the institutions of freedom in this country have expanded in that ... there has been an increase in equality of opportunity. At the same time, however, there has been an erosion of the values of the democratic way of life ... The fact that there is less respect for democratic traditions is a potential danger. In that direction looms the possibility of a progressive disorder. The great danger of democracy has always been the possibility that it may lead to anarchy ... Aristotle recognized that even when human beings are confronted with a choice between anarchy and despotism, they would choose despotism because anarchy is the rule of a thousand despots. That is the path down which we may go if the quality of our democratic process is further eroded. (U.S. News & World Report, June 1984)

The decline that Hook warns about requires us to assess many spheres of American life: can it be found in the media, in the educational system, in the academy, in the economy, in our religious institutions as well as in the political process? When democracy tends toward anarchy, it ceases to be democracy.

If democracy in America is to be vital, it must be rethought, redefined, and reworked. The founding fathers knew this well and called for a constant vigilance that has been, unfortunately, lacking in recent years.

The Anti-Defamation League of B'nai B'rith has been deeply concerned about the maintenance of a pluralist democratic society in the United States since its founding over seventy years ago. It is our goal to convene, in association with the Woodrow Wilson International Center for Scholars of the Smithsonian Institution, an ambitious conference to discuss these issues.

The conference will be a by-invitation-only gathering of a small group of influential men and women in such fields as government, politics, the law, business, labor, the media, education, religion, and social leadership. We have entitled this conference, "Democratic Freedom, Democratic Responsibility: The Delicate Balance Between Liberty and License."

Now that the program has been printed, ADL would suffer great embarrasment if we nixed the reception. The cost of an extremely, modest affair would be in the neighborhood of \$250-300.00.

The alternative to OPL's paying is to have ADL pick up the cost-but I understand that approval for this kind of arrangement is rarely given? Can we talk about this soon? It is very important that this matter be resolved ASAP. Thanks.
