



# WHERE OUR HEALTH DOLLARS CAME FROM IN 1985 (TOTAL \$425 BILLION)




# WHERE OUR HEALTH DOLLARS WENT IN 1985 (TOTAL \$425 BILLION)

Good Morning. My name is Marty Schnepper and I am Associate

Director in the Office of Public Liaison. On behalf of the

President, it is a pleasure for me to welcome you to the White

House complex for today's briefing.

Before beginning today's program, I would like to thank Susan Harris, the Director of the Washington Office of the UJA-Federation of New York, who was instrumental in making today's program possible.

Our first speaker this morning is Dr. Charles R. Schuster.

Dr. Schuster is the Director of the National Institute on Drug

Abuse. Dr. Schuster is an internationally recognized researcher

on the psychopharmacology of drugs of abuse. For the past

decade, he has been an Expert Advisor to the World Health

Organization for the international regulations of drugs of abuse.

Prior to joining the National Institute on Drug Abuse in March of

1986, Dr. Schuster was the Director of the University of

Chicago's Drug Abuse Research Center, and Professor of

Psychiatry, Pharmacological and Physiological Sciences, and

Behavioral Sciences in the University's Medical School.

From 1963 to 1968, he conducted research in psychopharmacology at the University of Michigan, where he held posts as Assistant and Associate Professor of Pharmacology. In 1968, Dr. Schuster became Associate Director of the Illinois Drug Abuse Rehabilitation Program. While there, he was instrumental in developing a new program to rehabilitate drug users. He also administered a methadone maintenance clinic and polydrug abuse clinic for adolescents, and conduced clinical drug studies.

Dr. Schuster received his Ph.D. from the University of Maryland, his M.S. from the University of New Mexico, and a B.A. from Gettysburg College, Pennsylvania.

He is a member of numerous professional societies, and serves as consultant to many committees and organizations in the drug abuse field at the national and international level. His a Fellow of the American Association for the Advance of Science, American College of Neuropsychopharmacology, and the American Psychological Association.
