I. PURPOSE/BACKGROUND

To provide closing remarks at an OPL briefing for approximately 200 supporters of the Administration's defense buildup including leaders of conservative, veteran, women, religious, Hispanic and ethnic groups. You will be introduced on stage by Linas Kojelis of OPL.

The briefing was originally scheduled for January 26th but the snow emergency shut-down of the federal government on that date mandating rescheduling. The purpose of the briefing is to mobilize key support groups in support of the Administration's FY '88 defense budget. CASPAR WILLARD WEINBERGER SECRETARY OF DEFENSE

Caspar Willard Weinberger was nominated by President Reagan to be <u>Secretary</u> of <u>Defense on January 20, 1981</u>, was confirmed by the United States Senate on <u>January 20, 1981</u>, and took the oath of office on <u>January 21, 1981</u>.

Born in San Francisco, California, on August 18, 1917, Mr. Weinberger graduated from public schools and earned his A.B. Degree, Magna Cum Laude, at Harvard College in 1938. He received an L.L.B. Degree from Harvard Law School in 1941 and is a member of Phi Beta Kappa. He also received honorary degrees from the University of the Pacific, University of San Francsico, Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute and Elmira College.

Following law school, he joined the Army as a Private in the Infantry and was released from active duty four years later with the rank of Captain. During that time, he served with the 41st Infantry Division in the Pacific Theater of Operations and as a member of General Douglas MacArthur's intelligence staff.

After World War II, Secretary Weinberger served as Law Clerk to U.S. Court of Appeals Judge William E. Orr for two years until 1947, when he joined the law firm of Heller, Ehrman, White and McAuliffe in San Francisco. He was a partner in the firm from 1959 to 1969.

In November 1952, he was elected to the Assembly of the California State Legislature and was re-elected in 1954 and 1956 without opposition. In 1956 Secretary Weinberger was selected in a poll of California newspaper correspondents as the most effective member of the Legislature.

While continuing his office practice, Secretary Weinberger wrote a semi-weekly column for a number of California newspapers, moderated a weekly local public affairs television program in San Francisco and was a staff book reviewer for a San Francisco newspaper and magazine from 1959 to 1968.

In 1967, he was named Chairman, Commission on California State Government Organization and Economy (called Little Hoover Commission) and he was appointed by then-Governor Ronald Reagan as Director of Finance of California in March 1968. He served until January 1970, when he was appointed by President Richard M. Nixon as Chairman of the Federal Trade Commission. Six months later he was named Deputy Director of the Office of Management and Budget and became Director of that office in June 1972.

President Nixon appointed Secretary Weinberger, in February 1973, as Secretary of Health. Education and Welfare and he continued to head that Department under President Gerald Ford until he resigned to enter private business in August 1975.

Until resigning to accept his present office he was Director of Pepsi Co., New York; Director of Quaker Oats, Chicago; a member of the Trilateral Commission; a member of the Advisory Council of the American Ditchley Foundation; Treasurer of the Episcopal Diocese of California; a member of the Board of Trustees of St. Luke's Hospital in San Francisco; and Chairman of the National Trustees of the National Symphony Orchestra in Washington, D.C.

Secretary Weinberger is married to the former Jane Dalton of Maine and they have two children, a son, Caspar Willard Weinberger, Jr., and a daughter, Arlin Weinberger.

Before being nominated by President Ronald Reagan to be Secretary of Defense, Mr. Weinberger was Vice President, Director, and General Counsel of the Bechtel Group of Companies.

SUGGESTED BIOGRAPHICAL INTRODUCTION CASPAR W. WEINBERGER SECRETARY OF DEFENSE

Mr. Weinberger is a native Californian. He was born and raised in San Francisco. Educated at Harvard, he received his A.B. degree, magna cum laude, in 1938 and was a member of Phi Beta Kappa. He graduated from the Harvard Law School in 1941.

During World War II, he enlisted in the U.S. Army and advanced in rank from private to captain. He saw action in the South Pacific with the 41St Infantry Division and later served on the intelligence staff of General Douglas MacArthur.

Following the war, Mr. Weinberger returned to California and entered private law practive. He served three consecutive terms in the California State Assembly, and in 1955 was named the "most able member of the State Legislature" in a poll of California journalists covering the Legislature.

Mr. Weinberger continued his law practice, becoming a partner in the San Francisco firm of Heller, Ehrman, White and McAuliffe (M'-Call-liff). While serving as a practicing trial attorney, Mr. Weinberger was the moderator of a weekly televised public affairs program, a staff book reviewer for the <u>San Francisco Chronicle</u>, and a syndicated columnist. He was also elected Chairman of the Californian Republican State Central Committee in 1964.

In 1969 Governor Ronald Reagan named him Chairman of the Commission on California State Government Organization and Economy. In 1970 Governor Reagan appointed him to be State Director of Finance.

At the Federal level, Mr. Weinberger has distinguished himself in a number of responsible postitions. He has served as Chairman of the Federal Trade Commission (1969-1970); as Deputy Director and, succeeding George Shultz, as Director of the Office of Management and Budget (1970-1972); and as Secretary of Health, Education and Welfere (1973-1975).

In 1975, Mr. Weinberger returned to California, where he became General Counsel, Vice President, and Director of the Bechtel Group of Companies. He was also a member of the Board of Directors of Pepsi Cola, Inc. and the Quaker Oats Company. He assumed his present responsibilities as Secretary of Defense in January 1981.

Mr. Weinberger is married to the former Jane Dalton. They have two children, a son and a daughter.

James C. Miller III became Director of the Office of Management and Budget on October 8, 1985. For the preceding four years he had been Chairman of the Federal Trade Commission.

Miller was born in Atlanta on June 25, 1942 and was raised in Conyers, Georgia. He received a B.B.A. in Economics from the University of Georgia in 1964 and a Ph.D. in Economics from the University of Virginia in 1969.

After teaching economics for a year at Georgia State University, he served from 1969 to 1972 as Senior Staff Economist at the U.S. Department of Transportation. From September, 1972 until June, 1974, he was Associate Professor of Economics at Texas A&M University, during which period he also served as a consultant to the Department of Transportation and the National Bureau of Standards.

From July, 1974 until October, 1975 Miller was Senior Staff Economist for the President's Council of Economic Advisers, where he specialized in transportation, regulation and antitrust policy. During 1975 he was named an Adjunct Scholar at the American Enterprise Institute.

In October, 1975 Miller was appointed Assistant Director of the U.S. Council on Wage and Price Stability, where he monitored the impact of the public sector on inflation and served on President Ford's Regulatory Review Group.

From early 1977 until early 1981 Miller was a Resident Scholar at the American Enterprise Institute and Co-director of AEI's Center for the Study of Government Regulation. From that post he was named by OMB Director David Stockman as the first Administrator for Information and Regulatory Affairs, where he also served as Executive Director of the Presidential Task Force on Regulatory Relief, chaired by Vice President George Bush.

Miller became Chairman of the Federal Trade Commission in October. 1981.

He is married and resides with his wife and three children in Washington, D.C.
