JOSEPH R. WRIGHT, JR.

Mr. Wright has served as Deputy Director of the Office of Management and Budget since April 27, 1982. He is also Chairman of the President's Council on Integrity and Efficiency, which oversees the activities of over 7,000 Inspector General employees, and Chairman of the President's Council on Management Improvement, which oversees the upgrading of management activities in the Federal Government.

He is the architect and overseer of Reform '88 -- President Reagan's six-year management improvement effort that includes activities such as installing a cash management system to handle over \$1.5 trillion in cash, redesigning an updated government-wide financial accounting system from over 300 separate agency systems, installing a new Federal personnel system consolidating over 200 payrolls, and upgrading more than 17,000 computers. He also initiated the government-wide Federal productivity improvement program announced in 1985 to improve productivity by 20% in five years. Before joining the Office of Management and Budget, Mr. Wright was Deputy Secretary of Commerce, helping to structure the Administration's international trade policy and programs.

Prior to the Reagan Administration, Mr. Wright was President of Citicorp Retail Services, Inc. and Retail Consumer Services, Inc. -- credit card/retail marketing subsidiaries of Citicorp, Inc., the largest bankholding company in the world. He was in this position for five years, during a rapid expansion of the credit card industry. The sales volume, which he was responsible for servicing, grew from \$100 million to over \$1 billion, through 27 offices with 2,500 employees handling 14 million cardholders.

Prior to joining Citicorp in 1976, Mr. Wright served in Washington as Assistant Secretary for Administration at the Department of Agriculture. This was the key management and administrative position of the Department, which had a budget of \$14 billion, 14,000 offices and 120,000 personnel. He had previously spent a short time at the Department of Commerce as Acting Assistant Secretary for Economic Affairs and Deputy Director of the Census Bureau, where he oversaw the final processing of the 1970 Census -- a massive data processing management task.

From 1966 to 1971, Mr. Wright was Vice President and Division Head of Booz, Allen and Hamilton, Inc., the largest management consulting firm in the world, where he was responsible for new products, marketing, mergers and acquisitions.

Mr. Wright, 47, received a Professional Engineering degree from the Colorado School of Mines in 1961 and a Master's degree in Industrial Administration from Yale University in 1964. He then became an instructor in the Graduate School of Business at Georgetown University in Operations Research and Quantitative Management, while also serving two years in the Department of Defense.

He was born in Tulsa, Oklahoma, where his family still resides. He and his wife Ellen have four children.
