EVENT CONCEPT

On Sunday, May 10, 1987, the President will travel to Tuskegee, Alabama to participate in the dedication of the General Daniel "Chappie" James Center for Aerospace and Health Education and be the principal speaker at Tuskegee University's Spring Commencement Convocation.

Tuskegee University was founded in 1881 by Booker T. Washington and its original aim was to provide vocational training to newly-freed slaves. It has become the largest of the Nation's predominantly Black Colleges and has programs in science, technology and liberal arts. During World War II, Tuskegee University became the Center for training the Nation's first group of black fighter pilots, "the Tuskegee Airman," including General Daniel "Chappie" James, the first and only black four-star general. In 1984 the President was made an honorary Tuskegee Airman for his support of the Tuskegee Airmen -- support that began with his narration of a World War II documentary of the Tuskegee Airmen.

The President will unveil a building marker and make brief remarks outdoors in front of the "Chappie" James Center.
