I am writing you in regard to Donald I. Macdonald, M.D., the White House nominee for the vacant ADAMHA directorship.

After spending yesterday morning with Dr. Macdonald, when he chaired the Florida Medical Association's Committee on Alcohol and Drug Abuse for the last time, and listening to his remarks regarding his aspirations for the new position, I am even more firmly convinced that the President made a fine choice.

Mac is a professional through and through, and his sincere interest in serving the public, particularly the youth of America, cannot be challenged. Reasonably good program managers and bureaucratic administrators are in abundance at every level of government; however, real professionals with dedication and know-how who are able to discern and articulate timely public policy issues and to get support and resources for needed changes are rare. Mac has the conviction, the interest, the demeanor, and the delivery to make a difference.

For the past four or five years, he has been an active member of the Florida Medical Association's Committee on Alcohol and Drug Abuse, a body that has been a strong and active organization for approximately nine years. I have been a part of nearly all quarterly meetings since its inception. The Committee has dealt with statewide issues relating to treatment, intervention, prevention, program quality, and, yes, general mental health, criminal justice and law enforcement issues as well. And, of course, Mac has dealt with all kinds of emotional problems in his general practice. It is also noteworthy that his wife has been an active member on the State's District Mental Health Board, so it is fair to say that he is generally knowledgeable about emotional problems and issues related to that specialty. Certainly he has dealt with the problem of teenage alcohol in his practice; his latest book, entitled "Drugs, Drinking, and Adolescents," published this month, certainly reflects a current knowledge of the subject.

He has lectured extensively throughout this country, primarily on issues related to children's health, and the fact that he has in

recent months been awarded 60 honorariums in 25 states speaks to his high energy level and the extent of his current knowledge. Admittedly, his specialty is children and, clearly, his primary interest lies with trying to help with the problems of children in this country. That is not to say he is not interested in all populations, and, knowing his interest and dedication, I am sure he will become involved in all the special problems and populations that ADAMHA addresses.

As you might surmise, I am absolutely ecstatic over the fact that the President would select someone who is so eminently involved in the leadership of the parent movement. I know that some of my counterparts throughout the country have had questions about the national parent movement. I concluded several years ago that prevention/intervention efforts, no matter how well funded or designed by public agencies, were a loss without the full support of and involvement with the parents and families of youth.

I know that Mac will continue to support the parent effort, and certainly this is of top interest to Nancy Reagan. I am sure that we will find her interest and support are now further demonstrated through Dr. Macdonald.

I think perhaps one of Mac's early frustrations may be his inability to effect positive new directions in reasonable time frames. I am sure he does not yet fully appreciate the preponderance of Federal and even State agencies in trying to get things accomplished. However, several people have already implored his patience with the process. He listens very well and will make use of the advice and recommendations of all those around him, including constituent groups and professional organizations.

He made special note of the fact that you would be in attendance at his White House meetings today, and I am sure you will be favorably impressed with his knowledge and overall qualities.

I would highly recommend that this position be filled by Dr. Donald MacDonald of Florida.

Fifteen years as a professional in the field of substance abuse and chemical dependency have given me the opportunity to view the field area from many different perspectives. Dr. MacDonald's philosophy and background as a pediatrician as well as a respected academician can offer an approach that we in the actual treatment and prevention sector of substance abuse can appreciate.

Those of us who have successfully established treatment modalities long ago realized that psychiatric approaches to chemical dependency only dealt with a small sector of the problem. Research alone, for research sake, did no service to those who needed to apply the results of studies unless dissemenation and integration of this work was given to us.

The government must also step back from the funding and direct involvement in programs and place the responsibility for quality treatment, prevention and intervention in the private sector unencumbered by dictates of bureaucracy.

Work must be done to look toward drug free treatment modalities, education programs, and a general re-evaluation of our approaches to young people who are the most affected by drug and alcohol abuse.

The problems in our country manifested by drug and alcohol abuse are increasing and becoming more complex. It is a social problem not limited to the medical, criminal justice, or mental health world.

I believe Dr. MacDonald has this philosophy in mind and can enlist those in all of the areas of concern to take decisive and positive steps in dealing with alcoholism and substance abuse. Leadership is the key and breaking down barriers created by special interest groups must be accomplished.

As a pediatrician, Dr. MacDonald is involved with the development, physically and emotionally of our main targeted audience, children. He is a respected professional and visiting professor who is not only well versed in the field of substance abuse and alcoholism, but shares his knowledge openly and willingly to others, and solicits the learned wisdom of others.

His ability to attract good, competent and motivated people is a definate asset as a prospective administrator with the leadership qualities that are necessary to accomplish difficult management tasks.

I, along with many others, hope that your decision in regard to the appointment of Dr. MacDonald is a positive one.

I am writing as a fellow San Diegan and as an individual with considerable experience in the mental health field to convey the concerns of both my colleagues and myself about the selection process for the appointment of the recently vacated Directorship of the Alcohol, Drug Abuse and Mental Health Administration (ADAMHA). There is unanimous agreement among those of us in the scientific, academic and clinical sectors of our discipline that this very important position must be filled by the most qualified candidate available. Over the past two decades our field has become scientifically a highly substantive one and leadership at the Federal level must be exercised by a scientifically competent and very substantive individual. The ADAMHA Directorship for our field is paralleled by the Directorship of the National Institutes of Health for the field of General Medicine and Health. Therefore, it is essential, that the same careful, objective and broad search process that was used in appointing the Director of NIH be used to identify the most suitable candidate for the ADAMHA Directorship.

Already several highly qualified candidates have expressed interest in this position, including the current Director of the National Institute of Mental Health, Dr. Herbert Pardes and Dr. Bernard Grosser, Chairman of the Department of Psychiatry at the University of Utah, who has the strong support of Senator Orrin Hatch. With individuals of this caliber already expressing interest in the job, there is little doubt that a superbly qualified and appropriate candidate can be identified to exert the kind of scientific and clinical leadership which is necessary at the Federal level to continue to move our field forward.

I want to thank you very much for your attention to what is an enormously important matter to us, but in the larger scheme of things is certainly but one of a number of issues which requires your attention. If it would be helpful to either you or someone on your staff for clarification or for additional background to this particular issue, obviously, I would be very happy to brief you further on it. Thank you very much for taking time in your busy schedule to attent to this matter.

I am writing to you on behalf of the American Association of Chairmen of Departments of Psychiatry, constituting the leadership of all of the academically based Departments of Psychiatry in the United States, concerning the pending appointment of a new Administrator of the Alcohol, Drug Abuse, and Mental Health Administration. Our Association and the Departments we represent are deeply involved in all of the programs of ADAMHA and have been strongly supportive of its vital role in research, training, and service delivery. ADAMHA deserves great credit for the progress that has been made in understanding, treating, and preventing the terrible toll of addictive disease and mental illness.

We believe that broadly knowledgeable leadership of ADAMHA is essential to continued progress in these areas. Research in both the biological and psychosocial aspects of mental illness and the addictions constitutes some of the most rapidly developing and exciting forefronts of medicine and biology. Preparation of the next generation of research and clinical personnel is a most important challenge. Development and evaluation of new treatment approaches holds great promise.

Given these opportunities and challenges, we hope that a very careful and thorough search will be undertaken for the most professionally qualified individual to fill this important leadership position. Several criteria appear to us to be relevant for consideration. First, the size and complexity of ADAMHA would seem to require a significant amount of administrative experience and a track record in creative program design and implementation. Second, since ADAMHA oversees activities in alcoholism, drug abuse, and mental health, broad training in psychiatry and experience in all three areas would seem highly desirable. It is our understanding that several candidates are presently under active review. We would like to particularly urge careful consideration of Drs. Herbert Kliener and Bernard Grosser. From our knowledge of these individuals, their professional backgrounds, and their deep commitment to comprehensive programs in the understanding and treatment of addictive
