Dear Denny:

This is in response to your March 17 letter which requested information in order to respond to correspondence from Mike Beck of Rufus, Oregon.

In answer to his questions, the President receives an annual salary of \$200,000. He is paid by the month. The United States Congress sets his salary and it cannot be raised or lowered after the President takes office.

The bullet-proof limousine is the property of the United States government. It does not belong to President Reagan, and will, in turn, be used by his successor.

The President does pay for his own food and clothing as well as that of the First Lady. Official functions are covered by the White House operating expense budget, annually appropriated by Congress.

The White House has traditionally been the official home of all Presidents while in office, except for George Washington. The founding fathers of our Nation provided for a place in which our Chief Executive could live while in Washington for the execution of his duties as President. President Reagan does not pay to live there, and an annual operating budget is appropriated by Congress.

I hope this information will enable you to reply to your constituent.



Dear Denny:

Thank you for your letter on behalf of Tami Coffland of Rufus, Oregon. In response to her questions, I would like for Tami to have the following information.

The White House has traditionally been the official home of all Presidents while in office, except for George Washington. The founding fathers of our Nation provided for a place in which our Chief Executive could live while in Washington for the execution of his duties as President.

The President pays for his own food and clothing as well as that of the First Lady. Official functions, such as those for visiting heads of state, are covered by an operating budget, annually appropriated by Congress.

The President receives an annual salary of \$200,000. He is paid monthly. The United States Congress sets his salary, and it cannot be raised or lowered after the President takes office.

The bullet-proof automobile is the property of the United States government. It does not belong to the President, and will, in turn, be used by his successor.

The President does not contribute to Social Security. His pension, upon leaving office, is covered in the Former Presidents Act. Such provisions are mandated by law and can only be changed by Congress.

Traditionally, the Congress appropriates \$50,000 for each new Administration to refurbish the White House; however, Mrs. Reagan did not accept this money. Nonetheless, a much-needed restoration of both the public rooms and family quarters was

recently completed. It should be noted that everything was accomplished with donations from private citizens throughout the United States who shared the First Family's desire to maintain the historical integrity of the White House for future generations.



This is in response to your March 17 letter which requested information in order to respond to correspondence from Renea Montgomery of Rufus, Oregon.

In answer to her questions, the President is paid an annual salary of \$200,000. The United States Congress sets his salary and it cannot be raised or lowered after the President takes office.

Concerning items received while in office, foreign official gifts, usually presented by a visiting heads of state, become the property of the U.S. government if valued over \$140. A list of domestic gifts is kept throughout his Presidency. While a President is able to use some, many are held in storage during his term of office and afterwards used in exhibitions at the Presidential library which is usually constructed after a President leaves office.

I hope this information will enable you to respond to your constituent.





I know how busy you are and could never possibly read all of the mail sent to you, but I felt so impressed to write you in regard to our 12 year old son, Philip.

Last night, my husband and I were doing some work in our office (we are missionaries and worked in Nicaragua for ten years), when Philip came in and said he wanted to talk with us about something he had just done. Knowing our son, we thought it might be wise to stop and listen.

"Mama", he said, "I just tried to call President Ronald Reagan. They gave me a phone number to call but at that number they wouldn't let me talk to him. They said that I should leave a message, and when I didn't want too, they said to write a letter. I told them I was only 12 years old and I couldn't write a good letter. Finally, she gave me another phone number which was President Reagan's secretary's number. Well, she said it was impossible for me to talk to him but when I told her that it was very urgent and that I couldn't write a letter because I was only 12 years old, then she said to wait a minute. Finally, she came back and said that he was busy and that I should try again later, or either write a letter".


I could hold my suspense no longer and I said, "What is it that is so urgent that you must talk to President Reagan about?", and, so sincerely, he replied, "Mama, I just wanted to tell him what a good job he is doing for our country - and, there's no telling the shape our country would be in if it was not for him. 



Dear Andrew:

On behalf of President Reagan, I would like to apologize for the delay in responding to your original letter. Unfortunately, things occasionally have a way of going astray, even here at the White House. We are grateful to Senator Heflin for passing your letter on to the President.

President Reagan understands your concern and admires your initiative in seeking the answer to what is an important matter for hardworking young people who aspire to this nation's highest office. In researching the answer to your question, I learned that anyone born abroad whose parents are both United States citizens is considered to be a United States citizen. If only one parent is a U.S. citizen, certain tests are applied to determine if that parent can pass on the U.S. citizenship to the child. United States military bases are not considered United States soil, so the child is a statutory citizen rather than a citizen under the Fourteenth Amendment.

If and when a statutory citizen actually seems likely to run for President, the Supreme Court will have to decide whether that citizen is considered a natural-born citizen. At this time, such a decision has not been made.

In summary, therefore, if both your parents are citizens of the United States, you would have no problem with regard to your status as a citizen and could run for the office of the President. Should one of your parents not be a United States citizen, you would still have access to the Supreme Court for a decision, should your candidacy become likely.
