BIOGRAPHY - Lancelot Raymond Adams-Schneider

New Zealand

Formerly Minister of Broadcasting, Minister of Customs, Minister of Health and Social Welfare and Minister of Trade and Industry, Lance Adams-Schneider was born in Wellington in 1919. He attended local schools before ending his formal education to open a dry goods store.

Born Lancelot Raymond Adams, he was reared by an aunt from the time of his mother's death. Later, he added the aunt's surname to his own. Adams-Schneider served for four years as an orderly with the New Zealand Medical Corps during World War II and after his discharge, returned to his dry goods business in which he still maintains an interest. He is a former executive member of the New Zealand Retailers Federation.

When Adams-Schneider retired from government service in November of 1981, he ended twenty-two years in Parliament. He was a good manager of the people in his ministry, an excellent debater in Parliament and well respected by those in his Party. He has represented New Zealand at numerous international conferences and led its first trade mission to Southeast Asia in 1964. His continuous service to the Cabinet and now his appointment as Ambassador to the United States indicate his closeness to the Prime Minister. In addition, he is a good friend of the U.S. and a strong proponent of the ANZUS Alliance.

Lance Adams-Schneider, 62, is married to the former Shirley Lois Brunton. They have two sons and a daughter.

Attached are Tab A are briefing materials which State has prepared for the Vice President's use in connection with his attendance at the dinner tonight in honor of New Zealand Prime Minister Robert D. Muldoon.

The material was reviewed by David Laux who thinks it is fine and has already passed a copy to Walt Doran.

David attended the National Press Club luncheon for Muldoon yesterday and tells me that Muldoon put on his usual fiery, two-fisted performance. In response to some loaded questions to him on the impact on New Zealand of U.S. sales of dairy products to Egypt, Muldoon gave a surprisingly complimentary reply. He said that the U.S. has always been very sensitive to the importance of New Zealand's dairy exports to New Zealand and has always consulted closely with New Zealand on any foreign sales of U.S. dairy products. He was very complimentary of the U.S. attitude in this respect and downplayed the negative impact of such sales although he admitted they do occasionally cause problems. Muldoon also went out of his way to express his personal admiration for President Reagan as a man and for his firm policies in dealing with the Soviet Union. He gave a particularly touching appraisal of the Korean Airline tragedy, saying its major benefit was the education it gave to a new generation of young people around the world of the problem we all face in living on the same planet with the Soviet Union.


