Attached at Tab A are suggested talking points, provided by the State Department, for Mrs. Reagan's use in her tea for Lady Thea Muldoon, wife of the New Zealand Prime Minister, Sir Robert Muldoon, on Friday, February, 24, 1984. At Tab B are bio sketches on Lady Muldoon and the wives of the New Zealand Ambassador and Minister (Mrs. Adams-Schneider and Mrs. Wood, respectively), who will be accompanying her. The list of attendees is at Tab C.

The New Zealand Embassy tells us that Mrs. Muldoon does not discuss international political issues, that she is very family oriented, loves children, is essentially a doer rather than a talker, and concentrates on making their home a refuge for the Prime Minister from the cares of the world. They say she likes many of the same things Mrs. Reagan likes, and that she will be interested in Mrs. Reagan's own family. In India, during the Commonwealth Conference this past fall, Lady Muldoon was apparently very active in visiting and talking with groups in the poor and depressed areas of Delhi, despite some opposition from the Indian government. Mrs. Reagan may wish to ask her about that experience as well as Lady Muldoon's trip to China with the Prime Minister in 1981.

Mrs. Reagan's Coffee for Lady Thea Muldoon February 24, 1984 11:00 a.m.

Lady Muldoon has been closely associated with several groups concerned with the welfare of women and children.

- -- Is the phenomenon of the single mother a growing trend in New Zealand?
- -- Have public and private programs been established to assist the single mother in handling both work and child rearing?
- -- In the course of your work with young people, have you encountered the problem of increasing drug abuse?
- -- Lady Muldoon would be interested in your work to combat drug abuse among American young people.

Lady Muldoon shares her husband's interest in horticulture (particularly lilies) and is interested in the Japanese flowering arranging art of ikebana.

-- Are there any types of lilies or other beautiful flora which are native only to New Zealand?

Lady Muldoon is knowledgeable on the subject of New Zealand arts and crafts, including the art of the Maoris, the Polynesian inhabitants of NZ who are now a minority group in NZ.

- -- What are some of the materials or techniques unique to New Zealand art and crafts?
- -- What are some of the characteristics of Maori arts and crafts?

On their way to Washington the Muldoons will stop in Paris and London.

-- Lady Muldoon might be asked about the highlights of their stops.

Lady Muldoon and the Prime Minister have three grown children, two daughters and a son.

-- Lady Muldoon might be asked about their career aspirations.

After leaving Washington, the Muldoons will visit New York, New Orleans, Austin, San Antonio, San Francisco, Los Angeles, and Honolulu.

-- Mrs. Reagan might wish to discuss the Muldoon schedule and comment on sites, particularly in California, with which Mrs. Reagan is familiar and which the Muldoons might wish to visit.

BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA A PROCLAMATION

CONSIDERING THAT:

The Treaty between the United States of America and New Zealand on the Delimitation of the Maritime Boundary between Tokelau and the United States of America was signed at Atafu on December 2, 1980, the text of which, in the English and Tokelauan languages, is hereto annexed;

The Senate of the United States of America by its resolution of June 21, 1983, two-thirds of the Senators present concurring therein, gave its advice and consent to ratification of the Treaty;

The Treaty was ratified by the President of the United States of America on August 16, 1983, in pursuance of the advice and consent of the Senate, and duly ratified on the part of New Zealand;

It is provided in Article VII of the Treaty that the Treaty shall enter into force on the date of exchange of instruments of ratification;

The instruments of ratification of the Treaty were exchanged at Pago Pago, American Samoa on September 3, 1983; and accordingly the Treaty entered into force on September 3, 1983;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Ronald Reagan, President of the United States of America, proclaim and make public the Treaty, to the end that it be observed and fulfilled with good faith on and after September 3, 1983, by the United States of America and by the citizens of the United States of America and all other persons subject to the jurisdiction thereof.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I have signed this proclamation and caused the Seal of the United States of America to be affixed.
