As you know, the Brazil-U.S. Business Council scheduled its Sixth Plenary meeting to take place at the U.S. Chamber headquarters during the upcoming state visit of President Figueiredo on May 12-13, 1982. We subsequently learned that the Brazilian government was inviting an entourage of private businessmen to accompany their president, as is his custom on state visits. We also became aware that numerous other American business groups had sought to participate in the activities surrounding the state visit.

In view of these circumstances, the Brazilian Foreign Ministry, with the support of our State Department, requested us to expand the meeting to include the businessmen from all groups. Both Dr. Richard L. Lesher, president of the U.S. Chamber, and Mr. Michael Blumenthal, chairman of the U.S. section of the Business Council, accepted this proposal as the best way to ensure that the business meeting enhance the state visit.

Both Messrs. Lesher and Blumenthal are delighted that President Reagan has tentatively accepted the invitation to address the meeting on May 13 at 1:00 p.m, in the U.S. Chamber headquarters. Naturally, we are anxious to receive written confirmation since we are in the throes of printing registration materials for the some 300 businessmen who will be in attendance.

We plan to mobilize our media resources to disseminate through our 220,000 member companies, chambers and associations the support for private enterprise and strengthened relations with Brazil that the President's presence will symbolize at this meeting.

MAY 12-13, 1982

The President of Brazil will make a state visit to Washington on May 12-13, 1982. As is his custom, he will be accompanied by 150 of the senior businessmen of Brazil. They will meet with their American counterparts to discuss business affairs at a two-day conference being organized by the Chamber of Commerce in conjunction with the U.S. section of the Brazil-U.S. Business Council and in cooperation with various other American business groups that concern themselves with Brazilian business.

In three working sessions, the meeting will focus on the general economic environment in the two countries, on business and policy questions affecting Brazil-U.S. trade, and on subjects related to American direct investment in Brazil.

The program will include remarks by the most senior government officials of the two countries in the area of finance and business, and from senior spokesmen from the private sector. Arrangements are being made to have both President Reagan and President Figueiredo participate in the proceedings.

It has come to my attention that you are considering inviting His Excellency Joao Figueiredo, President of the Federative Republic of Brazil, to Washington, D.C. in 1982. As chairman of the U.S. section of the Brazil-U.S. Business Council, I welcome this initiative as continuing confirmation of your administration's commitment to improving relations between our two countries. As the only bilateral private sector organization dedicated to enhancing economic relations between Brazil and the United States, the Council stands ready to assist you in making President Figueiredo's visit to our country a successful one.

The Brazil-U.S. Business Council was created in 1976 at the request of the Brazilian government, and is composed of over 100 senior business executives from both nations. The Council meets annually, alternating between Brazil and the United States, to discuss bilateral business issues which affect our two way trade. The Council is particularly fortunate to enjoy the full support of the two nations' largest private sector organizations: the National Confederation of Commercial Associations in Brazil, and the U.S. Chamber of Commerce. The Brazil and U.S. section secretariats operate under the administrative aegis of these two organizations, respectively.

The U.S. section will be hosting our VI Plenary Session in Washington, D.C. sometime in 1982, and would like to schedule this meeting to coincide with President Figueiredo's proposed visit. Having recently returned from a very successful V Plenary meeting this past June in Brasilia, where we had the honor of being addressed by the President, the Vice President, and members of the Cabinet, we are hopeful that in turn, you and/or other high-ranking officials in your administration would consider participating in our meeting.

My request comes at a particularly crucial period for Brazil. As you are well aware, the Figueiredo administration, while committed to furthering the democratic process through its policy of <u>abertura</u>, is encountering a number of political and economic pressures affecting that process. The Council, especially our Brazil section membership, is cognizant of the important role it can play in helping Brazil realize its aspirations, both politically and economically.



Subject: State Visit of Brazilian President Figueiredo

The Brazilian Foreign Minister has requested that President Figueiredo's state visit be on May 12, 1982, rather than May 13, as approved by the White House. President Figueiredo was scheduled to visit Canada in May to reciprocate a visit by Prime Minister Trudeau but this is being deferred until June to permit a May visit to Washington. For medical reasons arising from his recent heart attack, Figueiredo must have approximately a twenty day interval between foreign trips. Advancing the Washington visit one day would enable the Brazilians to offer to the Canadians the full month of June for rescheduling of the Canadian visit.

We believe the Brazilians are doing everything possible to accommodate us while not unduly bruising Canadian sensitivities and recommend, therefore, that the May 12, 1982 date be approved.
