Attached at Tab A is a memo to you from State outlining the importance attached to the state visit of President João Baptista de Oliveira Figueiredo to Washingtin in May by the Brazilian government, press and public opinion.

President Figueiredo is the first Brazilian president to visit the United States in 10 years. Two Brazilian presidents, during President Carter's term of office, refused invitations while U.S.-Brazilian relations sank to an all-time low.

This Administration's attempt to revive those relations, which included a very successful Vice Presidential visit in October, has been so far one of our most significant achievements in our Latin American policy -- and at relatively low cost.

A successful visit by President Figueiredo would be a major step, perhaps the major step, to complete the process of rapprochment between the hemisphere's two giants.

Therefore, I wholly concur with State's analysis and strongly support State's suggestion of doing something special along the lines suggested in the State memo -- an invitation to join the President for a ride. Such a gesture, though apparently small, will be magnified enormously in Brazil because of our recent past history. Conversely, treating the visit as routine will go down very badly in Brazil. Atmospherics at this time are of paramount importance.

Recommendation

That you approve the visit of President Figueiredo and that a special touch be added the visit as suggested by State.

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

Subject: President Figueiredo's State Visit



President Figueiredo's visit will be the first of a Brazilian President in ten years and comes at a time when the bilateral relationship is looking up. It will receive extraordinary coverage by the Brazilian news media. Some 80-100 press and television reporters will accompany Figueiredo and will report in detail on the visit and the quality of the reception he is accorded in Washington. That level of coverage makes it essential to Figueiredo, for domestic political reasons, and to the United States, for foreign policy reasons, to establish that the visit is viewed here as a major event. To accommodate the Brazilians' basic interest, and to achieve our foreign policy objectives, the Department believes a special touch of some sort is needed.

As a former cavalry officer, President Figueiredo is an enthusiastic horseman. An invitation to join President Reagan for a ride would constitute precisely the kind of warm, human touch that will most appeal to President Figueiredo's basic instincts and make him feel that he is a welcome friend instead of just a visiting guest. That same distinction would be perceived and greatly appreciated by the Brazilian public.

President Figueiredo is expected to remain in Washington until the afternoon of May 14. Except for the White House functions scheduled for the 12th, the only fixed item on President Figueiredo's schedule now is a noon meeting at the OAS on May 13. The preferred timing for a ride would be the afternoon of May 13 but the schedule could be arranged to accommodate an alternative time within the May 12-14 framework.

The Department recommends consideration of the possibility of inviting President Figueiredo to ride with President Reagan and requests that the White House indicate the date and time for the ride.

I am delighted today to welcome President Figueiredo and Mrs. Figueiredo to Washington.

Over our many years of friendship with Brazil, Mr.

President, your country has often been described as the nation of the future. Well, the future is here. Brazil is increasingly looked to not for its potential but for its capabilities, not for what it will accomplish but for what it is accomplishing.

We in the United States rejoice with the people of Brazil for the progress you have made economically, politically and socially and look forward to expanding on the mature relationship we have developed. The ties that bind us are firm -- with mutual respect and trust reinforced by time and shared values. Our friendship, Mr. President, goes back to the early days of Brazilian independence when the United States was the first country to recognize your sovereignty. Brazil was the first South American nation to have an ambassador in Washington.

The American people will not forget, President Figueiredo, that in both the First and Second World Wars, Brazil joined with us to confront the threat to freedom.

Since the war years our two countries have collaborated on many fronts to meet diverse challenges to the security and well-being of our peoples. Brazil is an independent force for moderation and balance in this hemisphere. And while our two countries have had disagreements, which is only natural and to be

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expected between friends, we have never lost that mutual respect and admiration so characteristic of our relationship.

Your leadership, Mr. President, has built upon the qualities of which I have just spoken. During a state visit to Colombia last year, you explained: "In extreme situations, political wisdom requires utmost levels of tolerance. We learn that tolerance and moderation don't bring bitter fruits and are uncontestable demonstrations of fidelity to the true ideal of democracy." This and other statements you have made speak well of your ideals and those of your country.

Mr. President, the motto of Brazil is "Order and Progress."

During these trying times, your country has proven that it takes these words seriously. Especially hard hit by rising energy prices, your government made an impressive commitment to do what was necessary to protect your people's standard of living and the Brazilian way of life. As a result of this commitment, your country is now a leader in the development of alternative energy resources, especially the use of alcohol as a fuel and the harnessing of hydroelectric energy.

The Amazon River is, to many, synonymous with Brazil. It's grandeur, enormity and power stagger the imagination. So too does Brazil.

Let us pledge that we shall never forget or take for granted the goodwill between us.

President Figueiredo, it has been 11 years since a Brazilian President honored the United States with a state visit. This is too long a period for nations which have so much to contribute to one another. Let us confirm that the personal bonds we develop through this visit will reinforce the friendship between our peoples.

Vice President Bush visited your country and consulted with your government in October. He reported to me the constructive and amicable approach with which he was met.

So today, I look forward to our discussion. I have much to learn from you and seek your counsel on matters of mutual concern. In your annual message to the Brazilian Congress last year, you said of Brazil, "We seek to understand and to be understood." Let this be the basis of our talks today, two old friends, in a period of change, honestly and with sincerity seeking goodwill and understanding.

And with that said, President Figueiredo, I welcome you to the United States.

ARRIVAL STATEMENT

PRESIDENT FIGUEIREDO AND MRS. FIGUEIREDO, NANCY

AND I ARE DELIGHTED TO WELCOME YOU TO THE WHITE HOUSE,

THE HOME OF THE AMERICAN PEOPLE.

THE FRIENDSHIP BETWEEN BRAZIL AND THE UNITED

STATES GOES BACK TO THE FIRST DAYS OF BRAZIL'S INDEPENDENCE
WHEN THE UNITED STATES WAS THE FIRST COUNTRY TO RECOGNIZE
BRAZIL AS A SOVEREIGN NATION. IT WAS STRENGTHENED
THROUGH THE YEARS AS WE BOTH FACED THE CHALLENGE OF
CONSTRUCTING THE NEW WORLD OF THE AMERICAS AND, WITH
