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

APPUE is non-gubernment parents association that organized it on May 10th., 1973. Our work is to perform a methodical educational and informative prevention, aimed at parents, teaching staff and adolescents; lectures for parents and teachers are organized regularly, concerning drug abuse. Also, educational seminars are conducted for elementary and secondary teachers, emphasizing the problem represented by drugs.

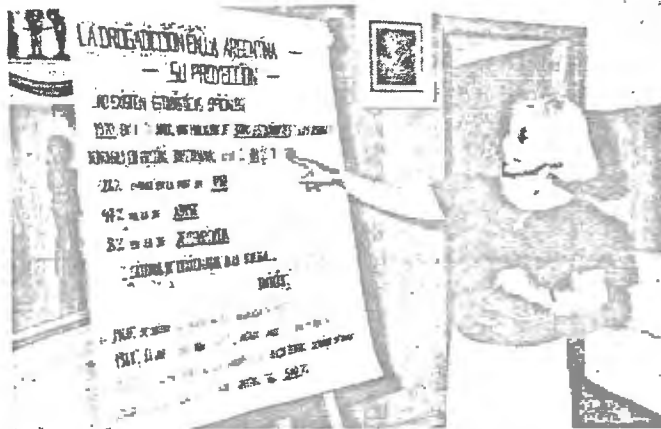
La permisibilidad en materia de drogas le costó a España un precio muy alto

La profesora Victoria Bitar de Fernández relata sus experiencias

“El precio que hemos pagado por la política de permisibilidad ha sido muy alto”. Con esta frase resume la profesora Victoria Bitar de Fernández, la opinión que recogió en España de los especialistas en toxicomanía y drogadicción. “Me sorprendió; algo que se da muy poco entre nosotros: el reconocimiento de haber equivocado el camino. Los argentinos tenemos más vanidad y nunca confesamos errores propios: siempre la culpa la tiene el otro”.

Vicepresidenta de la Asociación de Padres para la Prevención del Uso de Estupefacientes, y con más de 15 años de dedicación al tema —una década cumplida residiendo en los Estados Unidos—, la señora de Fernández recuerda que la asociación de cuya dirección participa “nacó junto con el Cenareso, en 1972”. Entre 300 y 400 exposiciones ante padres, maestros y alumnos; seminarios, notas periodísticas, presentaciones en los medios de comunicación y apoyo a otras entidades de bien público dedicadas a la prevención y rehabilitación del drogadicto, señalan la intensa actividad desplegada en trece años de existencia.

“Presentaré a las autoridades del gobierno y al propio presidente de la Nación los resultados de estos viajes de estudio, tanto a España como a los Estados Unidos.

La senadora Paula Hawkins, de Florida, que conduce el principal movimiento norteamericano contra la droga, me recibió en Washington y me entregó material sumamente importante que recoge décadas de experiencias cumplidas en su país.” (La profesora Fernández hace expresa mención del Proyecto PRC (Prevention Resource Center), preparado en Springfield, Illinois, y que constituye una guía para programas de prevención y desarrollo, preparados para la idiosincrasia latinoamericana.

“Fíjese la importancia que España dará al problema: en el presupuesto estatal para 1985 se asignan 200 millones de pesetas al programa de rehabilitación de adictos. En estos momentos también ha sido presentado al Parlamento un proyecto

conjunto del Partido Socialista, en el gobierno, y sectores de la oposición para reformar la ley de drogas, y al artículo 344 de su Código Penal. Se quiere volver a sancionar con prisión mayor no sólo el cultivo, la elaboración, el transporte y el tráfico de estupefacientes, sino también derogar las normas que actualmente consienten la tenencia para uso personal. En poco más de dos años de legislación “benigna”, España consiguió ascender a uno de los primeros puestos entre los países consumidores de drogas: el 20% de su juventud fuma marihuana y se estima que hay entre 80 y 100.000 heroinómanos. Recién ahora están reconociendo, además, la importancia de la prevención. Antes sólo se ocupaban de la rehabilitación, lo que se manifestó como solución

insuficiente para el problema.

“Tanto en los Estados Unidos como en España, se ha valorizado en gran medida la influencia fundamental en el tema que tiene el núcleo familiar. Más de 4.000 grupos de padres están actuando en el país del Norte. En Italia, el sacerdote Carlos Bella, de Milán, realizó una encuesta sobre drogas entre 1.000 padres de drogadictos y obtuvo estos resultados: desconocimiento de la psicología del adolescente, ignorancia sobre las drogas y sus efectos, y falta de capacidad para enfrentar la relación con la juventud.”

Otra experiencia innovadora que encontró la señora de Fernández, fue la cumplida por el doctor Alan Cohen, director del Pacific Research, de California. “En lugar de la clásica encuesta del «por qué se drogan», hizo la contraria: «¿Por qué no se drogan?». Los jóvenes que permanecen inmunes a esta enfermedad moderna mostraron estas características: buena relación en sus hogares, autoestima, sentido de la vida.”

Concluye la profesora Fernández señalando que APPUE está empeñada ahora en la creación de un centro de orientación para padres, en materia de drogas, con filiales en todo el país.
