



Dear Mr. President:

In a world where the news media emphasizes so much bad news, I am pleased to provide you with some good news regarding a gentleman from Mishawaka, Indiana.

On November 13, 1987, 2:25 a.m. an accident occurred on the Indiana East-West Toll Road in Lake County, Indiana when a patron lost control of his vehicle, hitting the guardrail; the vehicle crossed both eastbound lanes and struck a concrete divider, rendering the driver unconscious and the vehicle immediately caught fire.

Arthur W. Johnson, a bus driver for United Limo Bus Service Inc., Mishawaka, Indiana almost immediately came upon the accident, quickly retrieving a fire extinguisher from his bus and began a quick search of the vehicle for occupants, and not finding anyone, attempted to put out the fire. Not satisfied with his search, Mr. Johnson again looked into the burning vehicle and noticed the unconscious driver lying on the floor.

Mr. Johnson, without fear for his own safety, successfully pulled the man from the burning vehicle only moments before the entire vehicle became engulfed in flames.

This week, Governor Robert D. Orr, Governor of Indiana, honored Mr. Johnson at the Indiana Toll Road Administration Building, Granger, Indiana, for his outstanding courage and bravery.

It was a very special time for all of us who were a part of the ceremony with Mr. Johnson, his family, fellow employees and State Officials.

WHEREAS, I, Robert D. Orr, Governor of the State of Indiana, wish to recognize and commend those individuals who, by selfless and humanitarian action, have rendered vital, lifesaving measures to their fellow citizens; and

WHEREAS, while traveling eastbound on the Toll Road, at 2:25 a.m. on November 13, 1987, Michael W. Krymare lost control of his vehicle; hitting the guardrail, the vehicle crossed both lanes and struck the concrete divider, the impact rendered the driver unconscious; the vehicle immediately caught fire; and

WHEREAS, Arthur W. Johnson a bus driver from Mishawaka, Indiana, demonstrated uncommonly quiek thinking and outstanding courage and bravery when he came upon the scene of an accident on the Indiana East-West Toll Road at Milepost 6.8 eastbound immediately after it happened; and

WHEREAS, without fear for his own safety, Arthur Johnson saved the life of a fellow traveler, Michael W. Krymare, by successfully pulling him from the burning vehicle only moments before the entire vehicle became engulfed in flames;


