

Thank you for your message to the President recommending Attorney General Edwin Meese to be Associate Justice of the United States Supreme Court. As you know, the President has nominated Judge Robert H. Bork for this position.

All of us recognize that one of your strongest virtues is your loyalty to the people who have served you well.
