BRIEFING PAPER FOR PRESENTATION OF THE ROGERS COMMISSION REPORT

I. PURPOSE

To meet with the Commission members, receive the formal report, be briefed on its contents, and thank them both privately and publicly for their work.

II. BACKGROUND

On February 3, 1986 you established the Presidential Commission on the Space Shuttle Challenger accident to establish the probable cause or causes of the accident; and to develop recommendations for corrective or other action based upon the Commissions findings and determinations. The Commission was asked to report their findings to you within 120 days, which they will have done upon your receipt of their report this weekend.

Former Secretary of State William P. Rogers has served as chairman of the Commission and former astronaut Neil Armstrong has served as vice chairman.

You will receive the report officially along with a verbal summary of its findings from William Rogers and the Commission members in a brief meeting in the Cabinet Room.

Afterwards, twelve Commission members and the executive director will join you on the dais in the Rose Garden. (There are thirteen Commission members, however, General Chuck Yeager will not be in attendance.)

III. PARTICIPANTS

Cabinet Room: Twelve Commission members, NASA Administrator, James Fletcher, Commission Executive Director, Alton Keel, and senior White House officials.

Rose Garden: You will be joined on the dais by the twelve Commission members, and their Executive Director. Attendees will include: Commission spouses, Commission staff and spouses and senior NASA officials.

V. SEQUENCE OF EVENTS

Cabinet Room

You will open the meeting, make brief remarks (attached), and then call on Chairman Rogers.

William Rogers will brief you on the findings and recommendations of the report. There will be time after his presentation for a brief informal discussion.

Following the briefing you will have photographs taken with the individual Commission members.

You will then leave the Cabinet Room and return to the Oval Office with Chairman Rogers while the Commission members proceed to the dias.

Rose Garden

You will speak first, (Speechwriters have prepared remarks) thanking the Commission members, acknowledging receipt of the report and looking forward to reading and reviewing it. You will also urge the U.S. to keep the space program going and reaffirm your commitment to it.

After your remarks, William Rogers will thank all those who have contributed to the success of the Commission's work.

Following Chairman Rogers' remarks, you will return to the Oval Office.

I. PURPOSE

To promote the President's views on democracy for the Caribbean and Latin America, particularly in Nicaragua.

II. BACKGROUND

Radio Marti reaches an Hispanic audience in the United States, the Caribbean and parts of Latin America. It is targetted for a Cuban audience and recently celebrated its first anniversary. This interview provides a unique opportunity for the President to speak directly to the Hispanic community on issues of utmost concern to them: particularly the situation in Nicaragua.

The interview will be taped, translated with a voice-over into Spanish and aired later in the week.
