Dear Senator Fester,

My husband & I are in our early thirties and trying very hard to make a living as farmers.

But we are very worried about our future and the future of our three children.

After listening to news reports, farm reports, & reading farm magazines, we don't see anything promising coming our way in the near future.

I grew up in Dickeyville, Wisc. and didn't know much about life on a farm until I married and my husband started to run his Dad's farm. Then I found how great life in the country could be.

We started to farm in 1977-1978 and managed to get all our

bills paid and even managed to put a small amount in the bank each month.

But we never spent our money extravagantly. Even though people say farmers brought on their money worries themselves by buying all new equipment that is not true for us or for many of our neighbors. We did not want to sink deeply into debt. My husband went to sales & bought good used equipment and even then the one large tractor we own cost \$11,000.00. All our other tractors are older type John Deere's. Such as N620, a J.D. 70, J.D. B. etc. But my husband is a great mechanic & takes very good care of the machinery so it will keep

running a few more years. We do not have a large dairy herd (we milk around 60 cows) but always before we had our bills paid. No one had to wait to get paid when we did business with them. Until the last couple of years. Then we were charged an advertising fee, a milk tap, and now our milk price is dropping drastically. Also the price we receive for our choice steers has dropped. When we have corn to sell we receive a lower price than ~~than~~ my Aunt did when she was farming 30 years ago.

How does the President, who I'm sure doesn't know what it's like to really,

need money, think a farm family can possibly make ends meet when no one else's prices are dropped lower except the farmers.

The price of all the feed we buy, machinery parts, tractor fuel, farm supplies, electricity, veterinary expenses, and the list goes on, — they just keep going up or stay the same.

Please explain how we can make it?

How can someone in the government who never steps foot on a farmers land, know what its like to have sleepless nights wondering how the bills in the cupboard will ever get paid? Depression sets in easily.

I'm sorry my letter was

so long, but we, the farmers
need someone to help us.

Besides all the other problems
we have, now our main
worry is how long we will
be able to run this farm
before its takin away from
us. This is our living —
this is where we want to
raise our children.

Why doesn't the government
understand how hard we work
(from 5:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. at
night & sometimes later in
summer) but how very
useless it seems?

Dear Mr. President,

I sat teary-eyed tonight when you spoke about Americans "living from pay to pay." Living in West Virginia and having relatives who are still unemployed from steel mills and coal mines, your message certainly hit home too well.

But why with tears? Because it is too difficult to be an optimist any more. It seems as if I become cheerful and optimistic...all the hopes fall out of sight again. My own dear husband was laid-off from the Ohio Valley coal fields in 1981. He does not "sit tight" very well, and found a job at nearly half the pay...only to be unexpectedly laid-off December the next year. After two years of meager holidays and no call-back to the mines, he changed his panel and was called to work here, in the Monongahela Valley, in another mine. After six months of travelling over 150-miles each day to work and hardly ever seeing our two boys, we decided to sell our new home and move closer to work.

We found a small farm with a 50-year old home and, after several months of maneuvering, financed the property. There were higher bills and lots of farm work, but we were never stopped from dreaming of a time when our "hobby farm" might someday provide a homestead for our boys and a better life for us all. It was beautiful! (I even fought a round with cancer and won!) Optimism grew as well as our abundant vegetable garden!

Then two years ago, an unexpected lay-off clouded our lives again with pessimism and fear. Six months later, at the end of our savings and out of possibilities, the mine called him back. Yes, we made it, but the fears it created have made it nearly impossible to look too far ahead again. Then the flood came in November and the mines could not move coal because of the debris on the river...and the work was stopped for a month. Another scare. Again, so close to Christmas that I am beginning to get paranoid about my favorite holiday!

I suppose we are "well off" compared to most folks who have experienced work stoppages, but I am becoming resigned to the fact that we cannot make the needed improvements to our home or plan to help our sons through college because the future is too uncertain. We always seem to be forced to live from pay-to-pay with no dreams or plans to keep us going. There is no place for "wants" because they become "can'ts" too quickly.

I feel so badly that I have lost sight of our dreams and have started living from day-to-day instead of for tomorrow. But, I feel even more regret that we have relatives who can only see one day at a time. Without a dream, there is no future. If, indeed, hope springs eternal...our gushing stream is going dry. For someone who has always met challenges head-on and encouraged others that they could always take the challenge and make the changes, I have become so cautiously pessimistic that I scare even me.

After your message, I had the opportunity to get furious when the opposition implied that your administration was to blame for the

plight of America's farmers. Hogwash! Easy credit and too many "wants" have put our farmers in debt beyond their dreams! Farming, more than any other occupation, is a speculation. My husband wants to expand our property holdings. The bank has agreed to finance the added property on the basis of what he can make from his investment of last year's tax refund into several head of cattle. Optimism is dulling the senses. It is wrong. It is a speculation and not my idea of what sound finances are based.

So it has been with the large-scale farmers. If everyone does well with soybeans and the prices drop out and the one farmer who depended on a substantial price doesn't make enough to meet his farm or machinery mortgage, he and his banker are the ones to blame for over-speculation...not you and your administration.

So how can any of us dream any more? Must the fear of debt and bankruptcy hold us from assaulting the future. Or...is this the kind of restraint that brought so many folks through the years after the Great Depression? Is this the rein that will eventually help us corral our spending and make us all wiser?

We have tightened our purse strings and watched with admiration as you have done the same with government spending. But when is it time to quit tying knots in the strings to "get by" and feel good and not guilty about getting a new set of strings?


I know you don't have all the answers. And I don't expect you to answer this. I just wanted to share my thoughts with you.

Thank you, Mr. President, for being an example and a wonderful leader.


