DAVID L. WOLPER
CHAIRMAN LIBERTY WEEKEND
AND EXECUTIVE PRODUCER

David L. Wolper, an internationally renowned filmmaker who brought the Emmy Award-winning ROOTS to television screens throughout the world and produced the spectacular Opening and Closing Ceremonies of the 1984 Olympic Games in Los Angeles, is the Chairman of LIBERTY WEEKEND and the Executive Producer of all the events.

Wolper will coordinate the planning and staging of all the events of LIBERTY WEEKEND starting with the Opening Ceremonies on the evening of July 3rd, 1986, through the Closing Ceremonies on July 6th, 1986.

Wolper has made more than 500 films which have won more than 150 awards, including 2 Oscars, 40 Emmys, 7 Golden Globes, 3 Freedom Foundation Awards, 5 Peabodys, as well as recognition through retrospectives at most of the world's great film festivals.

Wolper was one of seven men responsible for bringing the Olympic Games to Los Angeles. He was vice-chairman of the Los Angeles Olympic Organizing Committee and a member of the Board of Directors Executive Committee. He was chairman of the Television Commission and responsible for negotiating the unprecedented \$225 million agreement with ABC network to televise the Games. He was commissioner and producer of the Opening and Closing Ceremonies.

Wolper produced THE RACE FOR SPACE in 1958 after coming across an extraordinary collection of 6,000 feet of Soviet film documenting the Russian space program. He gathered support from advertisers, but the networks refused to run the program because of a policy prohibiting use of any independently-produced documentary. Wolper lined up 150 local stations "a 4th network" to carry his film. THE RACE FOR SPACE won numerous international awards and was the first television program ever to be nominated for an Academy Award.

Wolper convinced French underwater explorer Jacques Cousteau in 1967 to take an expedition around the world as a basis for a series of American television specials. He produced the Cousteau specials for five years, making Jacques Cousteau an international household name.

The docu-drama genre also can be traced to Wolper, who tried this innovative approach to documentary tradition with THEY'VE KILLED PRESIDENT LINCOLN.

THE HELLSTROM CHRONICLE, a documentary about the life cycles of insects, brought Wolper his first Oscar in 1971 after nine nominations in the documentary division. He won his second Oscar in 1985 when he was presented the prestigious Jean Hersholt Humanitarian Award.

The Munich Olympic Organizing Committee awarded Wolper the contract to produce the Official Film of the 1972 Olympics. He had proposed the idea of photographing the Munich Games through the camera lenses of a number of noted international movie directors. The contributing directors were Milos Forman of Czechoslovakia, Kon Ichikawa of Japan, Claude LeLouch of France, Juri Ozerov of the Soviet Union, Arthur Penn of the United States, John Schlesinger of Great Britain, Mail Zetterling of Sweden and Michael Pflighar of West Germany.

The documentary, VISIONS OF EIGHT, was honored at the film festivals of Cannes, Moscow, San Sebastian, and others around the world.

Former President Ford appointed Wolper to the Advisory Council for the American Revolution Bicentennial Administration in January, 1975. He was the only film industry representative named to the 25-member council and was voted its chairman.

Among his 500 films Wolper produced the miniseries THE THORN BIRDS, THE NATIONAL GEOGRAPHIC SPECIALS, THE RISE AND FALL OF THE THIRD REICH, THE SMITHSONIAN INSTITUTION SPECIALS, THE MARCH OF TIME, Carl Sandburg's LINCOLN, THE MAKING OF THE PRESIDENT 1960 and 1964.

He is a Trustee of The American Film Institute, The Los Angeles County Museum of Art, The American Federation of Arts, The Los Angeles Heart Institute and the LAOC Amateur Athletic Foundation.

Mr. Wolper is married to his artist wife, Gloria, and has two sons, Mark and Michael, who are both in the entertainment industry and a daughter, Leslie Ann, who is attending college.



PRESIDENT REAGAN TO PRESENT MEDAL OF LIBERTY
TO TWELVE REMARKABLE NATURALIZED AMERICANS AT
"LIBERTY WEEKEND" OPENING CEREMONIES ON JULY 3RD

New York, N.Y. --- Twelve remarkable Americans, each a naturalized citizen, and each of whom has made a substantial contribution to the United States, have been named to receive The Medal of Liberty, one of the most prestigious new honors to be awarded by this nation.

President Reagan will present the 12 citizens with The Medal of Liberty Awards as one of the highlights of the Opening Ceremonies of "Liberty Weekend," on the evening of July 3rd aboard the aircraft carrier U.S.S. John F. Kennedy in the New York / New Jersey Harbor.

The Medal of Liberty Selection Committee, composed of 24 distinguished Americans, worked from an initial list of 200 recommendations. After several months of deliberation, the 12 winners were announced by Lee A. Iacocca, Chairman of The Statue of Liberty--Ellis Island Foundation, and David L. Wolper, Chairman and Executive Producer of "Liberty Weekend."

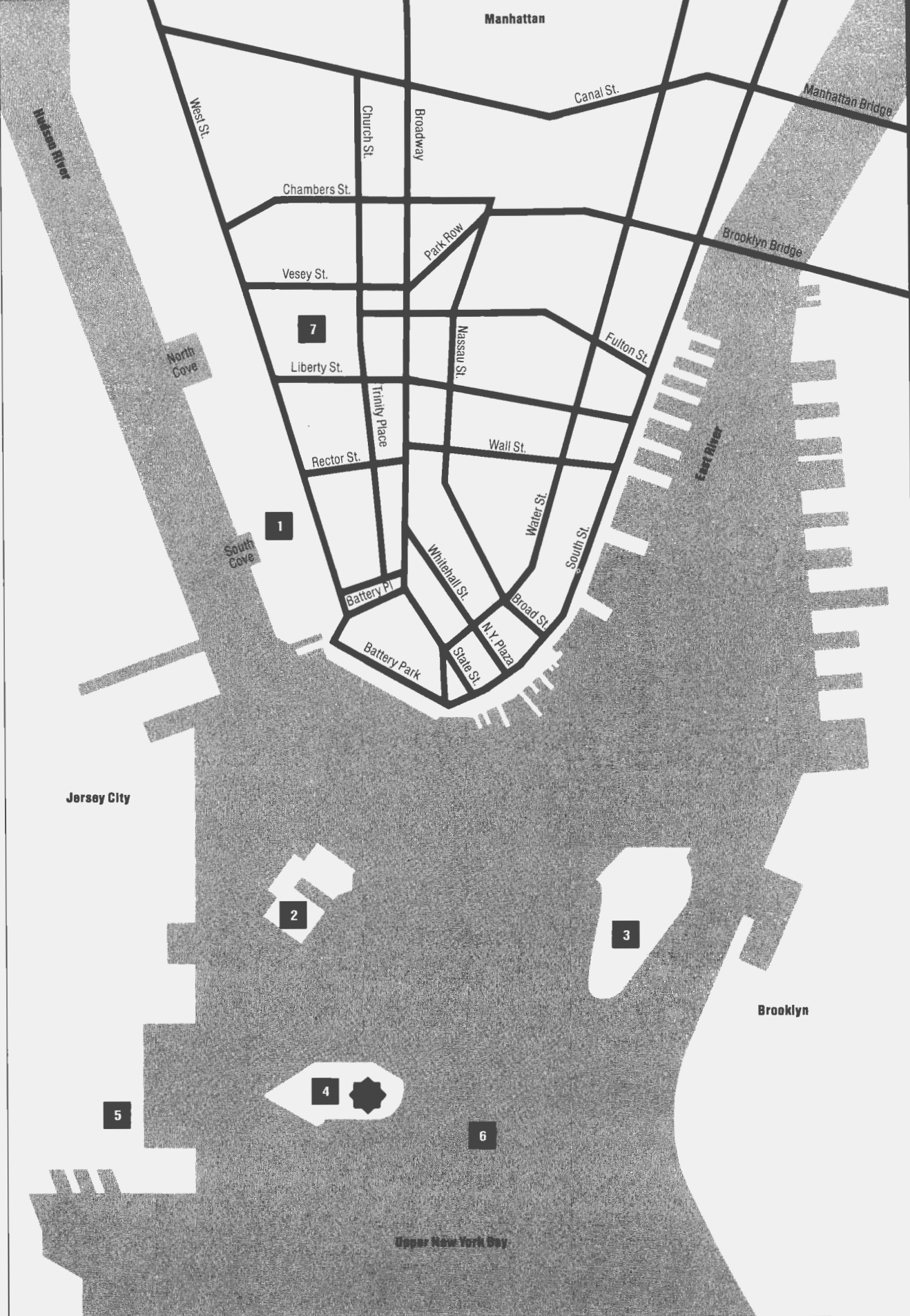
The Medal of Liberty has been struck in commemoration of the 100th

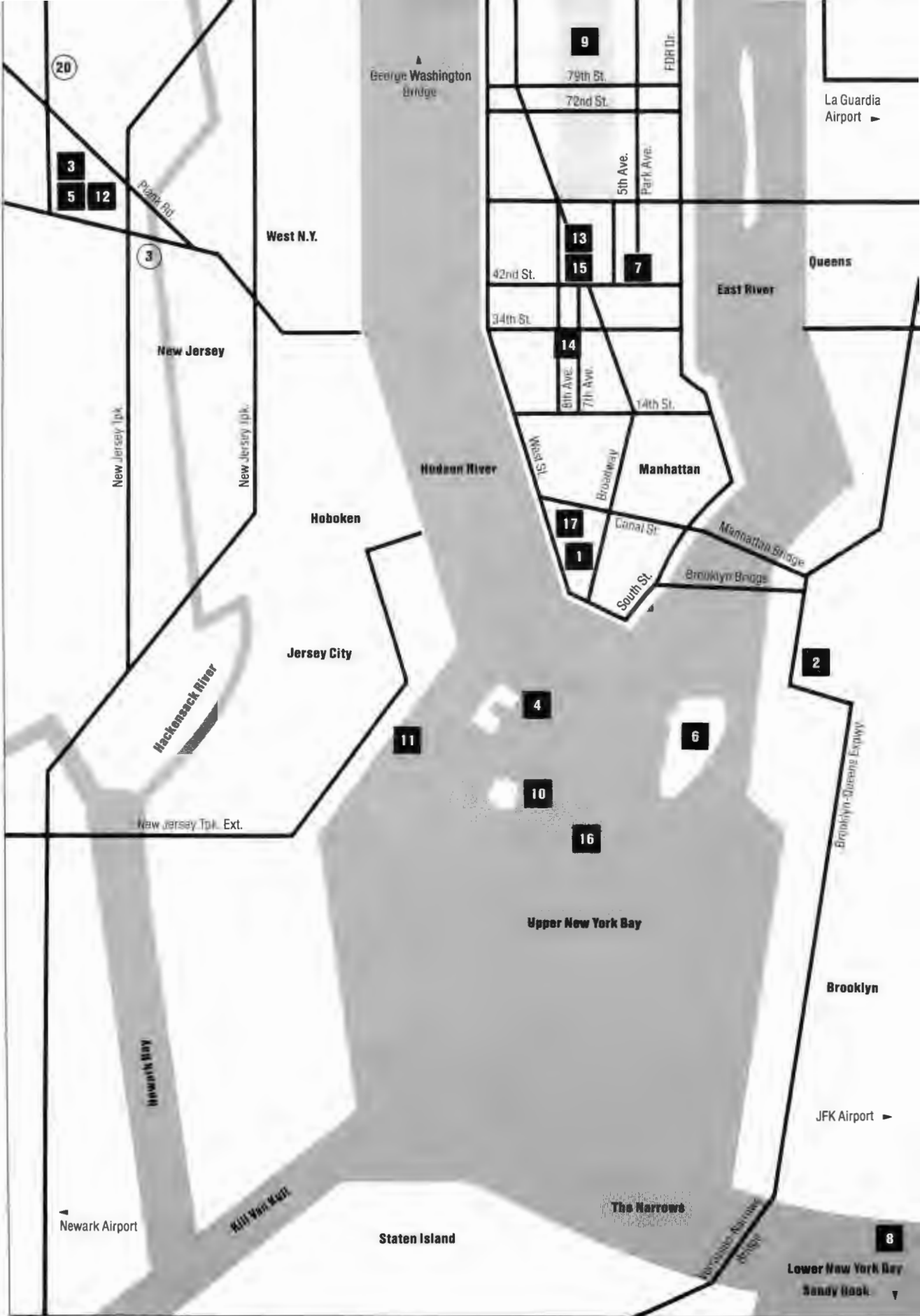

In this package are the necessary forms and supplementary information your organization will need to apply for accreditation as news media to LIBERTY WEEKEND, the four-day official celebration of the centennial year of the Statue of Liberty. LIBERTY WEEKEND is a series of events from 3-6 July incorporating classical, patriotic and popular musical events with impressive Opening and Closing Ceremonies, a conference on the future of liberty, and, on 4 July, the fifth International Naval Review and the Operation Sail 1986 Salute to Liberty.

The organizing committee, Liberty Weekend, is a function of the Statue of Liberty-Ellis Island Foundation, Inc. and has offices at 1 Park Avenue, New York, New York 10016; telephone (212) 213-5410. Your contact for news information and public relations relating specifically to Liberty Weekend is Jonas Halperin, while Richard Perelman is responsible for news operations, including coverage logistics for press, radio and television (see below for those responsible for coverage logistics for the International Naval Review and OpSail '86).

Information about the restoration of the Statue itself and Ellis Island, along with fund-raising and all other activities of the Statue of Liberty/Ellis Island Foundation not relating directly to Liberty Weekend should be obtained from Henning Nielsen, the Foundation's Director of Public Affairs. The Foundation is located at 101 Park Avenue, New York, New York 10178; telephone (212) 883-1986.

The Operation Sail 1986 Salute to Liberty is being organized by the same non-for-profit corporation which presented OpSail '64 and OpSail '76. Information about OpSail '86 and coverage logistics for the vessels participating should be obtained from Jude Giabbai, media and public relations officer. OpSail '86 offices are located at Two World Trade Center, Suite 2154, New York, New York 10048; telephone (212) 775-1490.

The U.S. Navy is hosting an International Naval Review in the New York Harbor. Contact for information and access to these ships is Commander John Alexander or Commander Steve Becker at (212) 826-4653. The International Naval Review has offices at One World Trade Center, Suite 2743, New York, New York 10048.

The United States Coast Guard will have two major responsibilities during Liberty Weekend. The USCG has a regulatory role in New York Harbor of all on-the-water vessels and will be the host agency for events on Governor's Island, the largest Coast Guard base in the world. (1) About Liberty Weekend

Liberty Weekend will take place from 3-6 July 1986 at sites in both New York and New Jersey. The weekend will begin with the assembly of the ships for the

International Naval Review and Operation Sail '86 in the New York & New Jersey harbor in the morning and early afternoon. The Opening Ceremonies on the evening of 3 July will take place aboard the aircraft carrier U.S.S. John F. Kennedy; included will be the unveiling and re-lighting of the Statue of Liberty by President Ronald Reagan and the swearing-in of 2,000 new citizens on Ellis Island by Chief Justice Warren Burger, along with 20,000 new citizens in four other cities tied together via satellite television transmissions. The president of France will also participate in a special ceremony. President Reagan will also present the Medal of Liberty to ten living naturalized American citizens who have made significant contributions to their chosen country. Among the performers already confirmed to appear are Frank Sinatra, Kenny Rogers, Neil Diamond, Elizabeth Taylor and Debbie Allen. An original fanfare by John Williams, to be used for all Liberty Weekend events, will debut at the Opening Ceremonies.

The fourth of July will begin with the International Naval Review, bringing together in the harbor about 35 U.S. and foreign naval vessels as well as more than 100 U.S. Navy and Marine Corps aircraft. President Reagan as commander-in-chief is expected to preside over the review aboard the battleship U.S.S. Iowa. At approximately 10:30 a.m., President Reagan will lead the official opening of Operation Sail 1986, a parade of tall sailing ships which will be led by the U.S. Coast Guard bark Eagle. The opening of OpSail '86 will take place on Governor's Island, located just south of Manhattan in New York Harbor.

On the evening of the fourth, an Americana Music Concert featuring patriotic and popular music of George M. Cohan, John Philip Sousa and others will be staged in Liberty State Park in New Jersey. The concert will be led by John Williams and the Boston Pops orchestra and include performances by John Denver, Johnny Cash, Barry Manilow, Joel Grey, Whitney Houston, Jack Lemmon, Melissa Manchester, Simon Estes and Clamma Dale. Following will be one of the largest fireworks displays in history, with barges placed in the water across from the World Trade Center and continuing around the island of Manhattan as far as the Brooklyn Bridge. The International Fireworks Spectacular will conclude with a series of bursts over the Statue of Liberty.

On the fifth of July, a short ceremony will mark the re-opening of Liberty Island to the public, which will then be able to visit the Statue of Liberty for the first time since mid-1985. Youngsters from all fifty states will participate as state winners of the Christa McAuliffe National Essay Contest. International Naval Review and OpSail ships moored at piers in New York and New Jersey will also be open for public inspection and viewing. The festive atmosphere will be enhanced by entertainment tied to the nationalities of the ships participating in the INR and OpSail events. In the afternoon, the spectacular Liberty Flight '86 will showcase the evolution of aircraft from the time of the Wright Brothers to the giant earth and space traveling vehicles of today. During the evening, an International Concert in the Park featuring Zubin Mehta conducting the New York Philharmonic Orchestra will take place on the Great Lawn in Central Park. Numerous other outstanding classical artists, including Placido Domingo, Marilyn Horne, Sherrill Milnes, Pinchas Zuckerman, Yo Yo Ma and James Galway will participate in this free admission event expected to be attended by more than 250,000 people. The Orchestre de Paris will participate via satellite television direct from Paris and can be viewed on large-screen television on the Great Lawn.

A two-day Liberty Conference will be held on 5-6 July, bringing together educators, historians, journalists and political figures on the subject of liberty in the future. The conference will include panel discussions, debates and speeches; all sessions are expected to be carried on television.

On 6 July, the Statue of Liberty and ships will again be open for viewing by the public. A special program will take place that evening from the Byrne Arena and at Giants Stadium in the Meadowlands Sports Complex in East Rutherford, New Jersey. The Sports Salute to the Statue of Liberty in Byrne Arena will include figure skating and gymnastics exhibitions by some of the world's great athletes, including Dorothy Hamill, Peggy Fleming, Bart Conner and Mary Lou Retton. The Closing Ceremonies and concert in Giants Stadium will feature a cast of more than 15,000 with bands, audience participation and a vast array of special effects. An all-star concert will be included with some of the leading performers in popular entertainment today: Frank Sinatra, Kenny Rogers, Lionel Richie, Willie Nelson, Gene Kelly, Shirley Maclaine, Patti La Belle and Elizabeth Taylor, among others.

On the fourth, fifth and sixth, the New York Harbor Festival Fair will take place in Lower Manhattan as well. A collection of entertainment, ethnic cuisine, exhibits and special presentations, this event has been expanded from its normal fourth of July-only programming to three days as a salute to the Statue.

The evening events of Liberty Weekend will be televised on an exclusive basis in the United States by the American Broadcast Companies (ABC), including the Opening Ceremonies, Americana Music Concert, International Concert in the Park, International Sports Salute to the Statue and the Closing Ceremonies and concert. Other Liberty Weekend events - including the International Naval Review, the OpSail '86 ceremonial opening and Parade of Sail and the International Fireworks Spectacular on 4 July - will be available for television in the United States on a non-exclusive basis. Wide international coverage of Liberty Weekend is also expected.

(2) Accreditation for news media

Facilities will be arranged to assist news media in coverage of Liberty Weekend as listed below. In order to best deliver the planned services to those actually covering the event, news media will be accredited through the Application for Accreditation and Individual Identification Forms.

News media organizations may obtain Applications for Accreditation by calling or writing to the Liberty Weekend office in New York and asking for the required forms. The primary period for the receipt of applications from news media for Liberty Weekend accreditation ends on Friday, 11 April 1986. With some 3,500 news media expected to receive accreditation for the events, space will be limited.

The overall Application for Accreditation should be completed on behalf of the entire news organization filing for credentials, while the Individual Identification forms are for completion by each individual person requesting accreditation.

(3) Accommodations for news media

As Liberty Weekend will take place in New York and New Jersey, news media will find many opportunities for accommodations in all categories. News media will be responsible to book and pay for their own accommodations.

The headquarters hotel for news media services during Liberty Weekend will be the New York Marriott Marquis located at 1535 Broadway at Times Square. A very limited number of rooms are available there, although thousands of other hotel rooms are located within a short walk.

(4) Center for News Media (CNM)

A central facility for accreditation processing, information about Liberty Weekend and filing services during Liberty Weekend will be located in the Marriott Marquis for use by news media before and during the events.

Journalists will be able to pick up their credentials at the CNM and up-to-the-minute information about the events will be available at this site. A large working area with approximately 550 seats and several hundred charge-a-call telephones will be available, along with communications facilities by telex and telecopier.

(5) Event coverage

Opportunities for broadcast, photographic and print coverage of each Liberty Weekend event will be available. In general, reserved viewing areas, interview and working facilities will be reserved for the exclusive use of media in order to allow for suitable coverage conditions.

Access to some areas and events will require only the Liberty Weekend news media accreditation badge, while entry to other events will be limited and require entry passes in addition to the news media accreditation cards. These passes will be distributed by the Liberty Weekend News Operations staff at the CNM at the Marriott Marquis hotel beginning one to two days prior to the events themselves.

Coverage facilities at the individual events are planned to include;

3 July - The Navy will have a limited number of spaces aboard harbor craft for media to photograph the arrival parade of naval ships into the harbor commencing late in the morning. Media embarkations on the Naval Review ships are also planned on a limited basis. Following the parade, the ships will be positioned for the actual review which takes place the following day. Opening Ceremonies

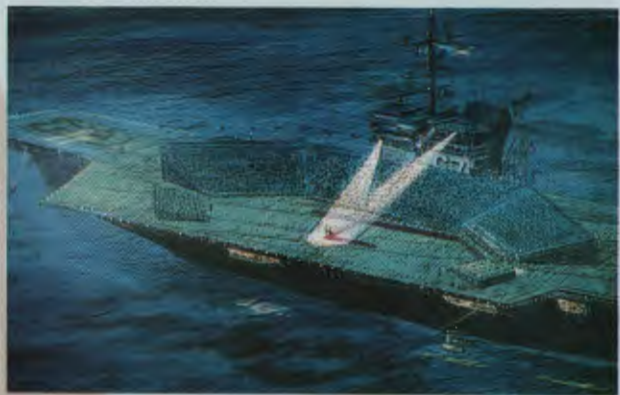
Liberty Weekend officially begins on the evening of July 3rd, with Opening Ceremonies to unveil the newly-restored Statue of Liberty and to relight its torch.

Televised throughout the world, the ceremonies will originate from the aircraft carrier USS John F. Kennedy, anchored off the Statue of Liberty.

Using a glowing spectacle of light to "unveil" the Statue, the President of the United States will push a button aboard the carrier, sending a brilliant stream of light across the water. One part at a time, the Statue will be gradually illuminated as a 100-piece symphony orchestra and 300-voice choir perform "America the Beautiful."

The President of France will participate in a special ceremony.

On Ellis Island and simultaneously by satellite in cities throughout America, the Chief Justice of the United States will swear in over 25,000 new citizens.



Operation Sail 1986 and International Naval Review Assemblies

From an assembly point off the northern shore of Long Island, approximately 100 sailing ships will sail under the Triborough Bridge, down the East River and under the Verrazano-Narrows Bridge. At anchorage in Gravesend Bay and Sandy Hook, the ships will remain overnight to prepare for their participation in the Parade of Sail on July 4th.

To prepare for the International Naval Review, approximately 35 naval vessels representing the nations of the world will steam under the Verrazano-Narrows Bridge and anchor at various locations in the New York/New Jersey Harbor and along the Hudson River.

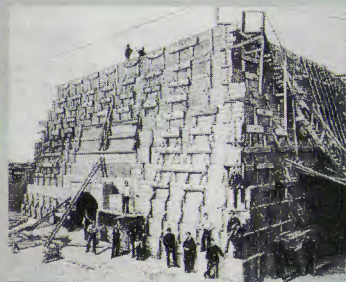

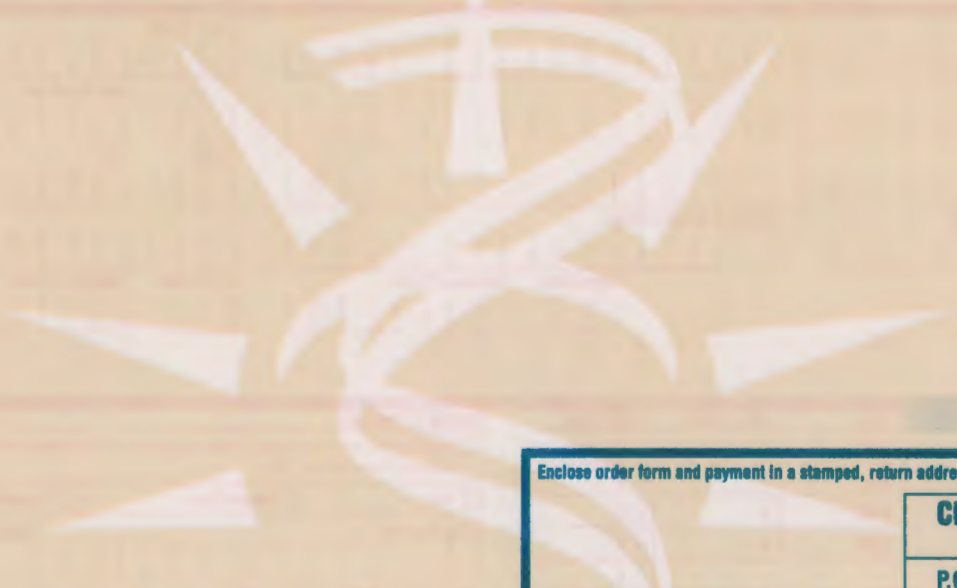

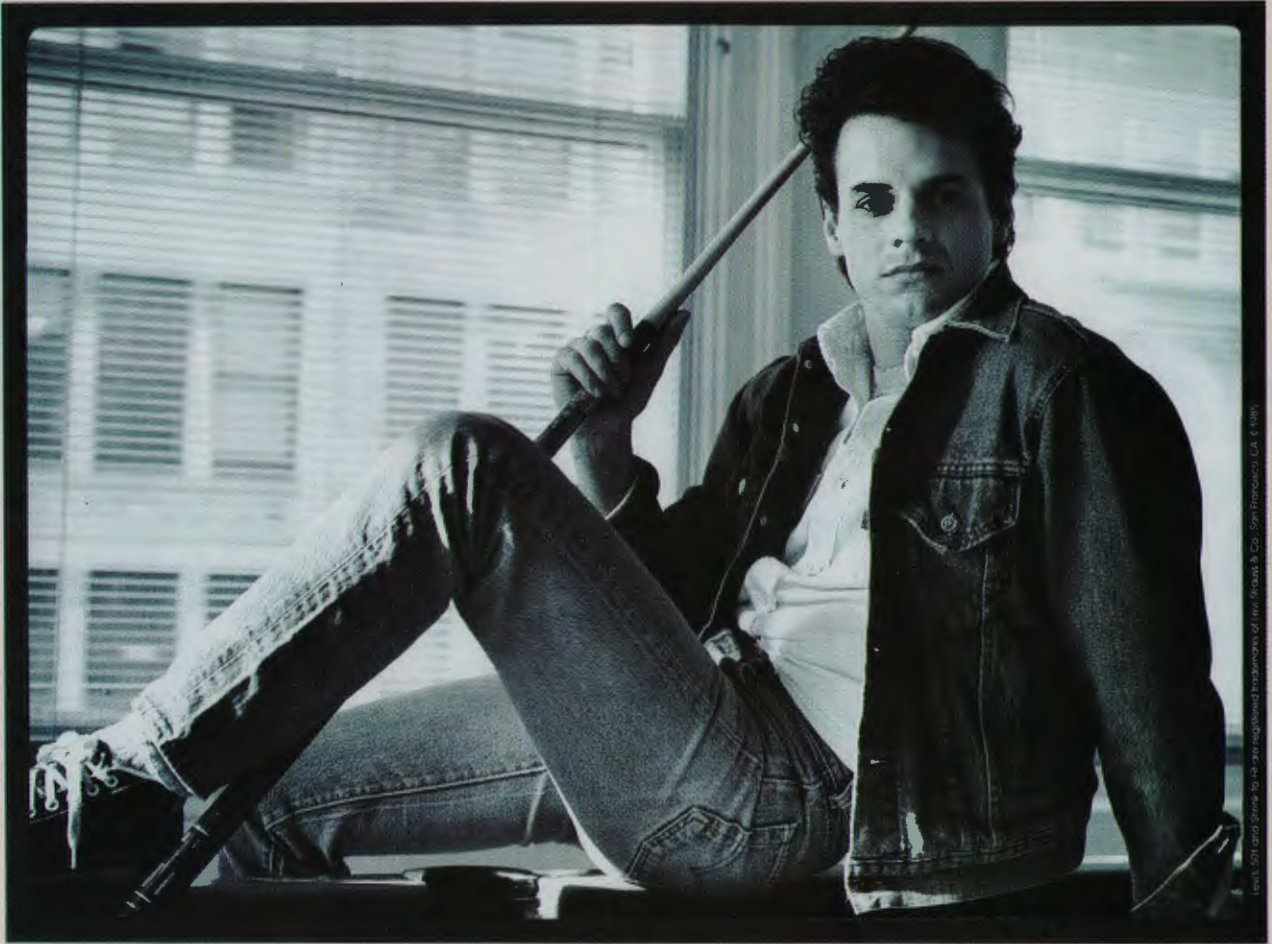
