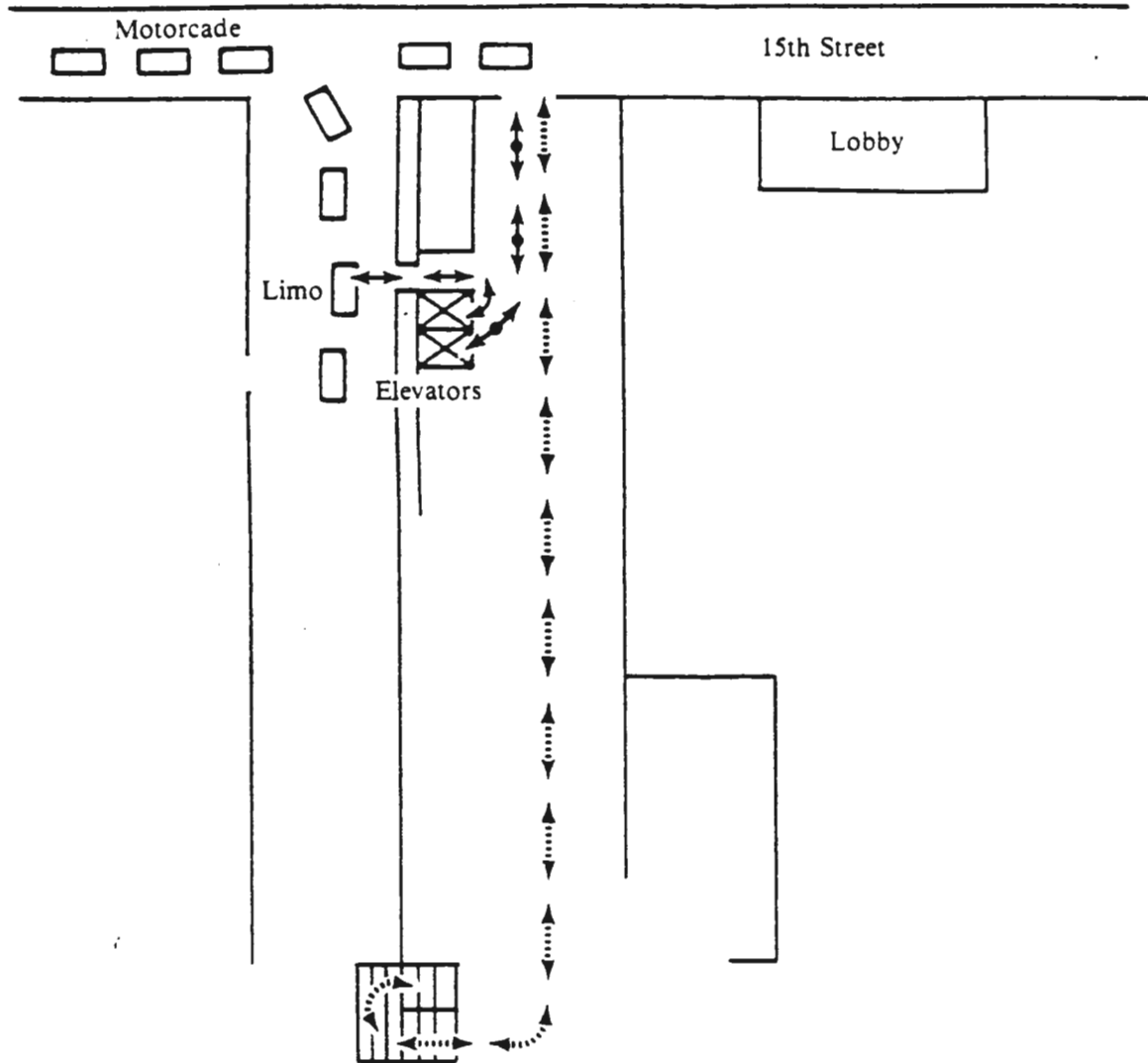

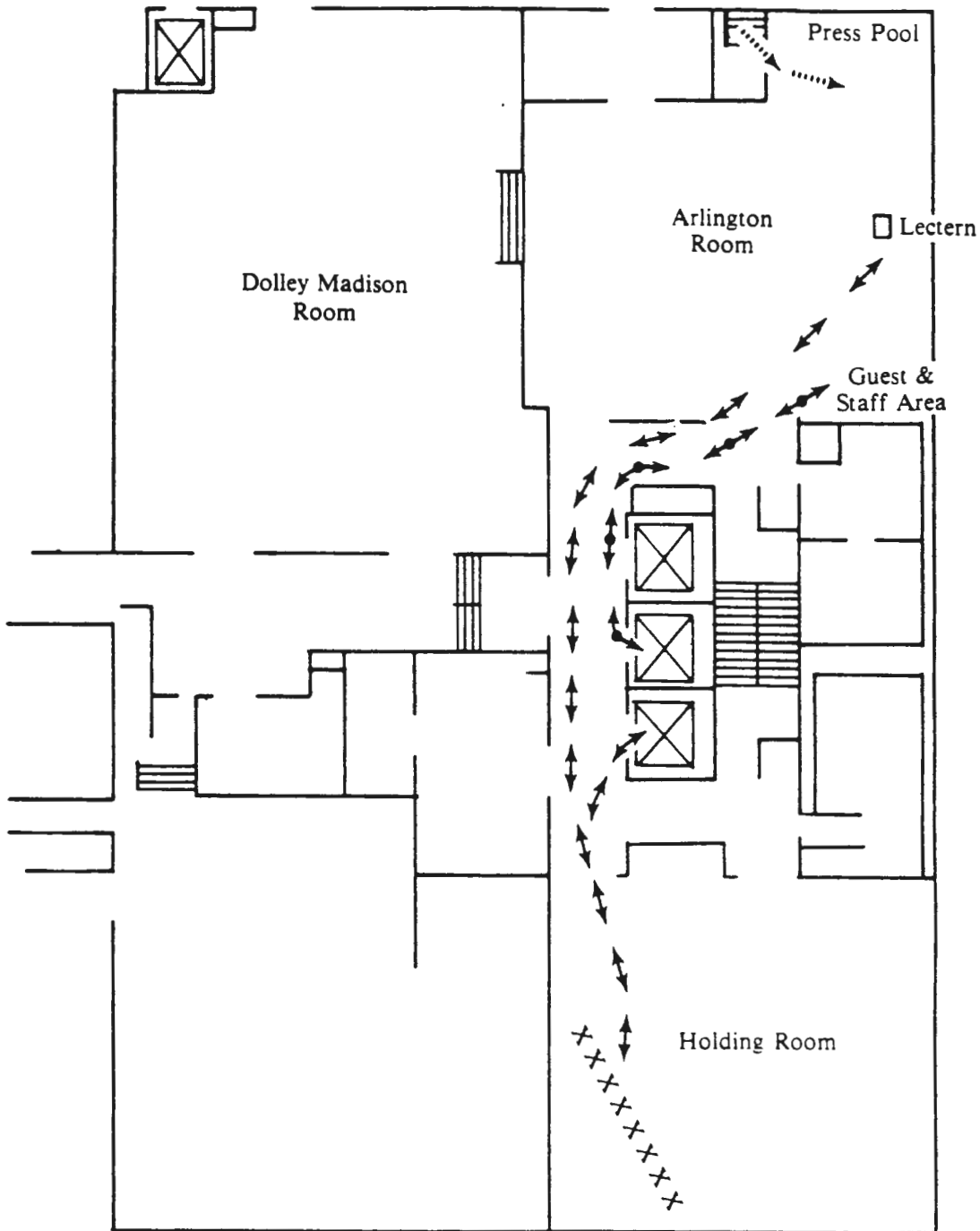

I. PURPOSE

To brief you on findings of the Nikaido mission to the United States and to report on possible Japanese initiatives to deal with the current trade imbalance.

II. BACKGROUND

Nikaido, Vice President of Japan's majority Liberal Democratic Party (LDP) has just completed a ten-day visit to the United States at the invitation of Senator Dole. He headed a high-level LDP delegation with the official purpose of meeting with Congressional leaders and Administration officials to gauge the severity of protectionist sentiment, explain Japan's proposed approach to the trade imbalance problem and regularize parliamentary exchanges in the future.

He told Ambassador Mansfield that his most important objective will be to set the stage for a successful New York meeting in late October between you and Prime Minister Nakasone.

The meeting is largely a photo opportunity for Nikaido, but could also produce some indication of Japanese willingness to be responsive to the U.S. protectionist climate by recommending short and long-term policies to open markets and promote consumer spending. These ideas may take more definite form at the New York meeting with Nakasone.

TALKING POINTS--MEETING WITH SUSUMU NIKAIDO

- Very glad to see the Mission here at this time. It's particularly important that Japan's leaders have a direct, accurate understanding of the situation in Washington now.
  
- In my view, the eight-point action plan, which you have discussed during your visit here, while useful, does not fully deal with the need for longer-term measures to rectify the underlying problem causing Japan's trade frictions with her trading partners, that is, the low level of your manufactured imports.

(If Nikaido raises the idea of an import "vision," the following may be helpful.)

- The idea seems to make a lot of sense. I understand it is the way in which Japan has handled its other most important economic problems--reconstruction of the economy in the 50's, building heavy industries in the 60's, overcoming the energy crisis in the 70's, and moving to a high-tech "knowledge-intensive" economy in the 80's.
  
- Your government has told us that visions work through consensus rather than coercion, and use the vitality of the private sector to further national goals on which nearly all Japanese agree.

- This is a much more desirable way to bring about needed economic change than by arbitrary government intervention and coercion, such as imposing export restraints or import surcharges.
  
- Have a safe trip home and please give my best regards to the Prime Minister and tell him that I am look forward to seeing him shortly in New York.

Senate Majority Leader Dole and attorney Robert Strauss (former Chairman of the Democratic National Committee) are co-hosting tonight's dinner in honor of Long, and Senator Dole has asked that the President attend. They would like the President to make some brief remarks honoring Long.
