



James River French students earn \$100 to refit Statue of Liberty

"Bonjour, classe. Comment allez-vous?"

A conversational opener in French is not easy to find in elementary schools these days, but at James River Day School it happens four days a week.

The small independent school on Boonsboro Road is the only elementary school in Lynchburg that has a second language as part of the regular curriculum for kindergarten through the sixth grade.

Maybe that's one reason the fifth-grade class has a special reason for wanting to raise money to help repair a 100-year-old gift from France.

"The French children helped to raise money for the Statue of Liberty," explained Gini Simmons, a student in Margaret Daniel's fifth-grade class.

The gift came "on the hundredth anniversary of the freedom of America," said Daniel Candler.

Why would the French make such a gesture?

"I think both countries believed in freedom and liberty," said Andrew Guthrow. "France did help America in the Revolutionary War."

So, like the French children of a century ago, the students at James River decided to raise money for the Statue of Liberty. They held a bake sale Wednesday, and earned \$100 to help repair the famous statue.

Last year President Ronald Reagan appointed a commission to restore the Statue and Ellis Island, once the nation's clearinghouse for immigrants.

The 151-foot tall statue, "Liberty Enlightening The World," designed by Frederic Auguste Bartholdi, was given to America in 1884 by the people of France. The statue is atop a massive pedestal paid for — in major part — by contributions from

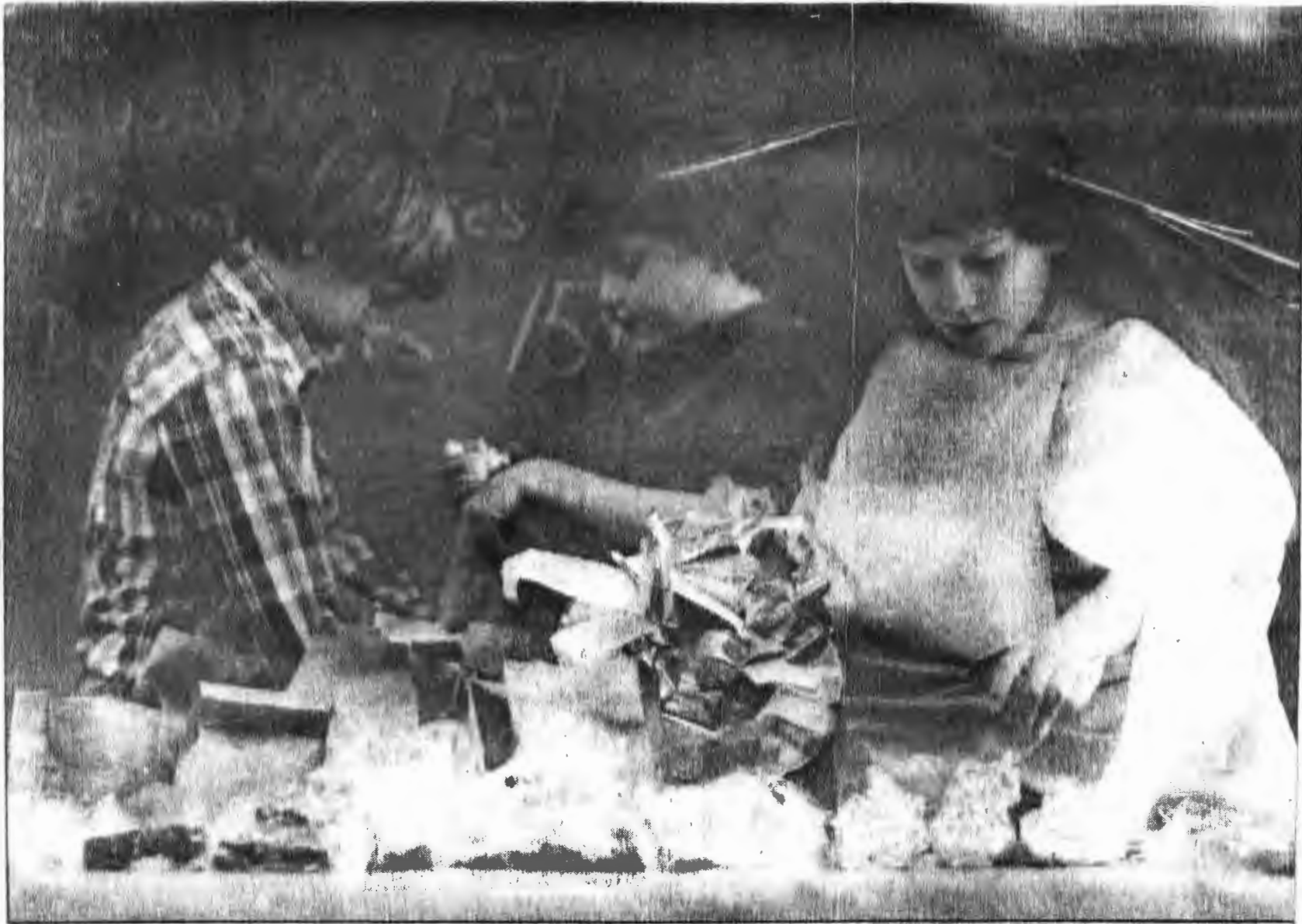

American schoolchildren. The commission estimates the cost of repair and restoration for the statue and the island will be about \$230 million — about a dollar per American.

As part of their task at James River Day School, students learned quite a bit about Miss Liberty.

"It's made of copper," said Carolyn Casey, "And they've found holes in it."

The statue was placed in New York Harbor so, "When people came into America, they could see the Statue of Liberty," said Emily Carter, "and think of liberty and freedom."

The children were alerted to the statue's dilemma by their February Scholastic News Magazine, which featured stories on Ellis Island and the Statue of Liberty and their need for repairs.

French has been a part of the school since its founding in 1971, when former teacher Anny Bennett, a French citizen, began the program.

Kindergarten through third grades have 20 minute lessons twice a week, said Ann Barr, who now teaches the first three grades. "I use a lot of music, singing, dancing."

Mrs. Barr, who holds a degree in French, is fun to observe as she teaches the youngsters.

On this morning, she wore a bright pink blouse and gray skirt as she sang while playing "Alouette" on a small portable organ. The kindergarteners sang along as they sat free-form on a turquoise shag rug, and laughed as they pointed to arm, hand, mouth.

Mrs. Barr soon abandoned the organ, and joined the children as they formed a large hand-holding circle singing "Sur Le Pont D'Avignon" in which the girls curtsy and the boys bow formally.

During the first three years, the children learn about French culture, sing French songs, name the parts of the body, and study salutations, some dialogue and counting. Mrs. Barr enjoys her work with the little ones.

"They are enthusiastic," she said. "Part of the enjoyment is seeing them learn."

The youngsters learn by hearing the language spoken. "In the fourth grade it becomes a real class, an academic subject," said Betty Shotton, who majored in Spanish and minored in French at Lynchburg College, and teaches French to the fourth, fifth and sixth graders.

By that time, the children have heard the language for several years, know many words and can begin learning how to write what they speak.

S. 680 would dedicate the Baltimore-Washington Parkway to Gladys Noon Spellman in recognition of her service in the House of Representatives. The enrolled bill would also require the Secretary of the Interior to 1) identify such dedication by signs, maps and markers, and 2) erect an appropriate marker adjacent to the Parkway commemorating the contributions of Gladys Noon Spellman.

As enrolled, S. 680 reflects certain technical amendments recommended by the Administration regarding this legislation. Accordingly, we recommend that you approve S. 680, which passed both Houses of the Congress by voice vote.

Dick Darman has requested your views on the above referenced enrolled bill by 5 PM Monday, July 11, 1983.

S. 680 would dedicate the Baltimore Washington Parkway to Gladys Noon Spellman in recognition of her service in the House of Representatives. Under S.680, the Secretary of the Interior would be required to identify such dedication by signs, maps, and markers; and to erect an appropriate marker adjacent to the Parkway commemorating the contributions of Spellman.

OMB recommends approval of the bill and Interior has no objection to it.

An Act

Entitled the "Gladys Noon Spellman Dedication".

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the Congress finds that Gladys Noon Spellman, elected to four terms in the House of Representatives from the State of Maryland, should be afforded recognition not only for her personal efforts in upgrading one of the Capital region's most important transportation corridors, but more broadly for the dedication, commitment, and concern she expended on behalf of the people of Maryland. The quality of her service to the public exemplifies the high ideals and principles she held paramount.

SEC. 2. The parkway, under the jurisdiction of the Secretary of the Interior, in the State of Maryland known as the Baltimore-Washington Parkway, is hereby dedicated to Gladys Noon Spellman in recognition of her efforts to upgrade a most important transportation corridor in the Capital region and more broadly, to recognize her service to people of Maryland and the Nation as a Member of the House of Representatives of the Congress of the United States.

SEC. 3. In order to carry out the provisions of this Act, the Secretary of the Interior is authorized and directed to provide such identification by signs, including, but not limited to existing signs, materials, maps, markers, interpretive programs, or other means as will appropriately inform the public of the contributions of Gladys Noon Spellman.

SEC. 4. The Secretary of the Interior is further authorized and directed to cause to be erected and maintained, at a suitable location adjacent to the Baltimore-Washington Parkway, an appropriate marker commemorating the contributions of Gladys Noon Spellman.

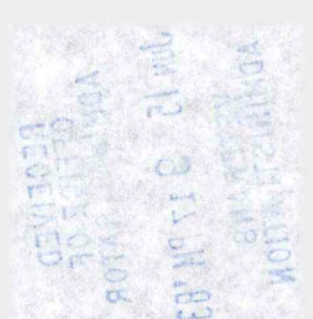





While the President is most grateful for these expressions of public recognition for veterans, it has been White House policy not to endorse specific memorials and fund raising activities. Please understand this implies no lack of support for the concept you are advancing, but only reflects a decision not to attach the President's name to the formation and financing of various organizations.

Dear President Reagan:

In late fall 1983, a group of Oregonians journeyed to Washington D.C. to attend the dedication of the National Memorial for the Vietnam War. Prior and during that trip, group members discussed establishing an Oregon Vietnam Memorial dedicated to all participants, the dead, the missing and the approximately 57,000 living in Oregon. After their return, the group met, discussed and decided on a course of action: Establishing an Oregon Memorial to the Oregonian Vietnam Era Veterans.

On January 27, 1983, the group filed as an Oregon non-profit corporation. On January 31, 1983, the organization representatives met with Oregon Governor Victor Atiyeh. The Governor expressed his support of the organization, acknowledged its purpose and accepted the position of Honorary State Chairman. In early March 1983, the organization applied to the Internal Revenue Service seeking non-profit private foundation status. With such status, public donations to the organization will be tax deductible.


The organization is currently organizing and awaiting a decision from the I.R.S. With that status the organization will begin soliciting funds. Plans are to conduct a design competition followed by Memorial construction and dedication. In fund raising and corporate efforts, the organization will rely heavily on volunteers and special emphasis will be directed toward tapping two strengths of Oregonian men and women: Their individual pioneer spirit and positive volunteerism.
