Dear Mr. Paulucci:

I have been troubled about your letter of May 9th in which you express your displeasure about the ethnic imbalance in the selection of Medal of Liberty winners. I can only respond by saying that the Medal of Liberty selection process was made without regard to national origin and the final selections were made by a distinguished committee of Americans from all ethnic backgrounds under a legitimate voting process.

I understand the disappointment that many people have expressed that many of the 135 ethnic groups in the United States were not on the final list of 12, but we must reiterate that the Medal of Liberty award never had the intent of being a ethnic type medal.

I am happy to inform you that when the emphasis shifts from the Statue of Liberty to Ellis Island soon after the 4th of July celebration, that an award has been planned in conjunction with Ellis Island by the Statue of Liberty/Ellis Island Foundation to recognize Americans throughout the United States for their contributions from the various ethnic origins.

I think you'll agree that the Medal of Liberty is being given to outstanding living individuals, and I do hope when the awards in conjunction with Ellis Island are given that they will satisfy your objections and hopes for an ethnic medal.

I thank you for your interest and consideration and look forward to joining with you and all Americans for this milestone in our nation's history.



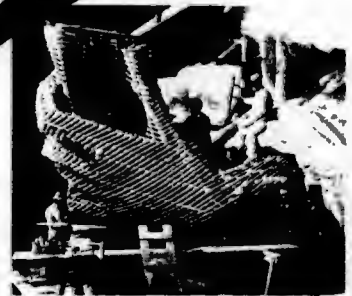

**Operation Sail 1986—
“Salute to Liberty”
Parade of Sail**

Immediately following the International Naval Review, Operation Sail 1986 marks the spectacular return of the world's greatest sailing ships to the New York/New Jersey Harbor.

Hundreds of ships of sail—from full-rigged to ketches, including historical and character vessels—will join in this “Salute to Liberty” as they majestically enter the harbor under the Verrazano-Narrows Bridge, sail

past the Statue, up the Hudson River past the naval vessels of the International Naval Review to the George Washington Bridge, then back down the Hudson to their assigned berths throughout the area.

In addition to the full-scale television coverage by domestic and foreign networks, millions of people will be able to watch it live—from a choice of literally thousands of locations along the vast parade route encompassing the New York/New Jersey Harbor and both sides of the Hudson River.

For excellent viewing, tickets for reserved grandstand seats and standing room areas are available in lower Manhattan's Battery Park City. Special ship-by-ship narration and live music will be provided to ticket holders.

Tickets can be ordered through the ticket order form.

**International Naval
Review**

The morning of July 4th will feature a stirring salute to the Statue of Liberty with an International Naval Review.

Anchored in the New York/New Jersey Harbor and on both sides of the Hudson River will be aircraft carriers, battleships, submarines and other vessels. Over 35 ships from navies around the world will fire 21-gun salutes as the President of the United States and Secretary of the Navy, on board the battleship USS Iowa, pass in review. A fly-by of Navy and Marine aircraft will culminate in an aerial salute by the Naval Aviation Demonstration Team—the famous Blue Angels.

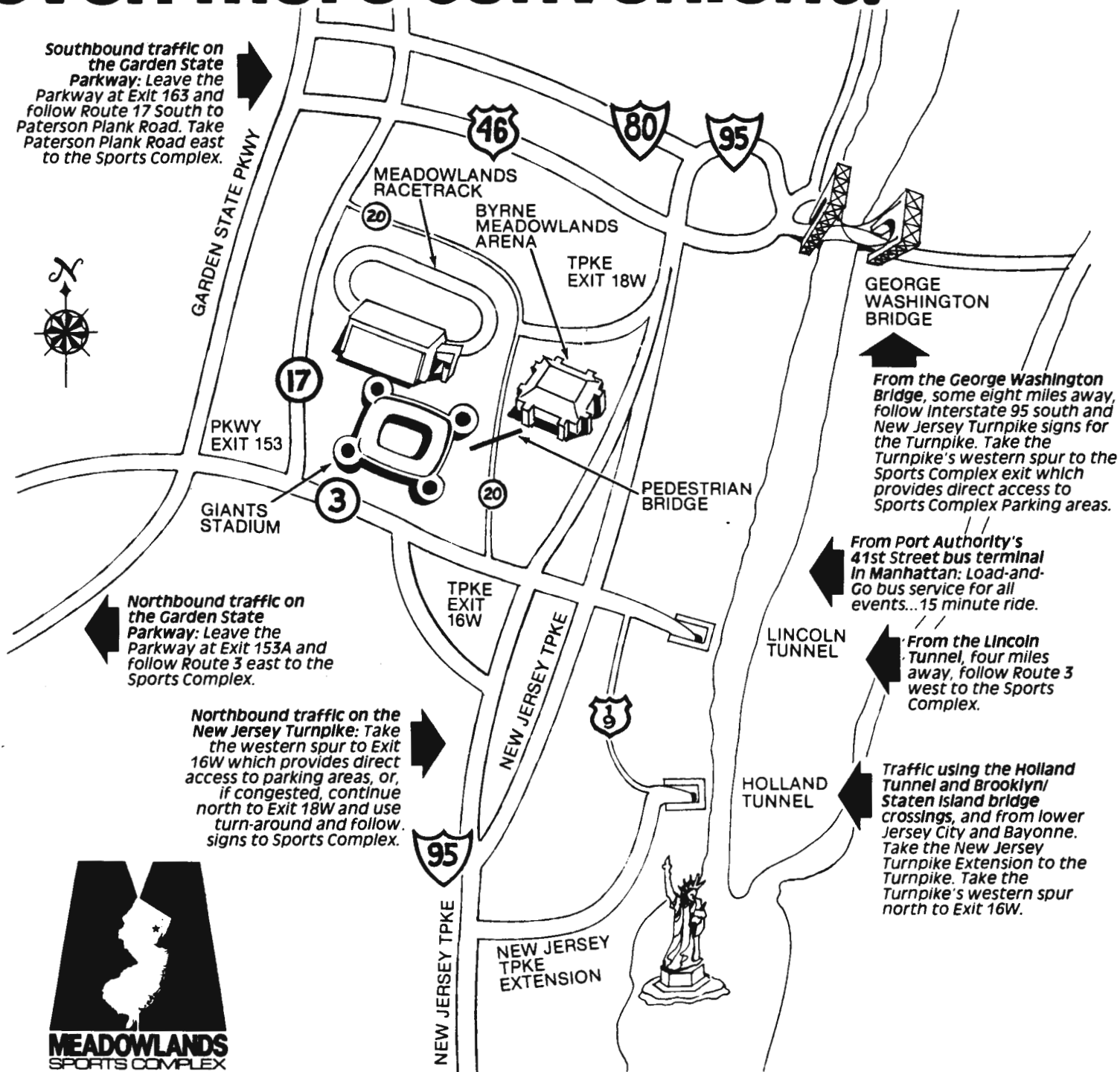

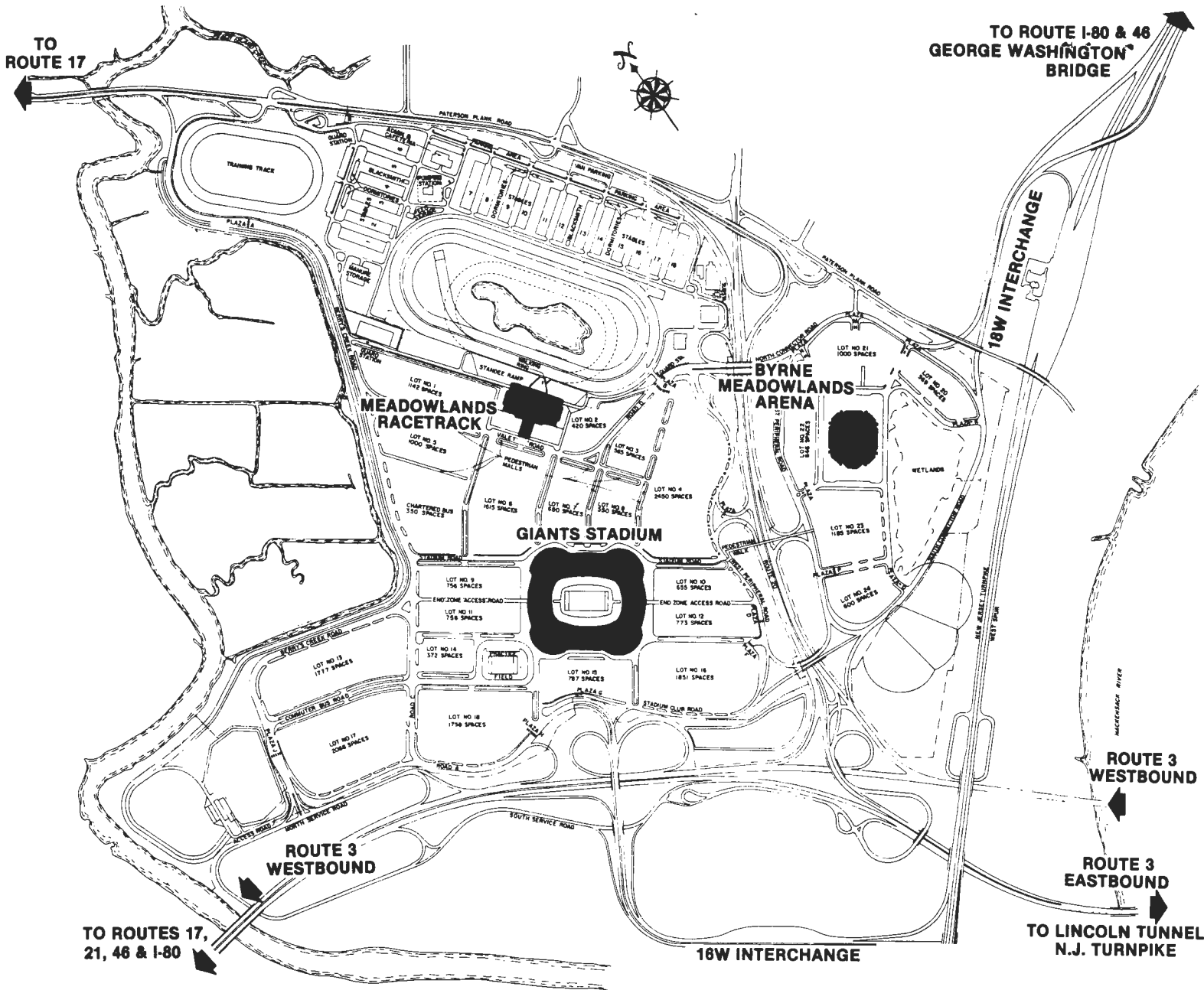

The addition of Byrne Meadowlands Arena to the Sports Complex has met with tremendous acceptance by the public. But out of that success has been born a problem—occasional traffic congestion. This is due in part to the fact that many visitors to the Arena are unfamiliar with access roads in the area, and to the revised internal movement of traffic necessitated by the Arena.



Several steps have been taken by the Sports Complex to help alleviate traffic problems at the Arena:

- 2. CAR OR VAN POOL.** You'll save on parking and reduce the number of vehicles and amount of traffic at each event.

- 3. USE MASS TRANSIT.** Leave the driving to someone else. Most area bus companies have service to major Sports Complex events. Call your local bus company for details.

and most importantly

- 4. FOLLOW DIRECTIONS ONCE YOU REACH THE SPORTS COMPLEX SITE.**

At each major traffic decision point within the Sports Complex there will be a trained traffic director to direct you to the best possible route in terms of entry and exit from the site. These traffic directors are in constant communication with traffic central to assist you in selecting the best and fastest route to and from the parking lots.
