- C. Facilitation of Participation by Central American Democracies in Regional Meetings and Negotiations. The \$2,000,000 provided by Section 205(d)(1) of the Act will be used by the Secretary of State to facilitate the participation of Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala, and Honduras in regional meetings and negotiations to promote beace, stability, and security in Central America. The Secretary of State is authorized to use any balance of the \$2,000,000 specified in Section 205(d)(1) not needed for this purpose as a contrabution aware meeting the initial costs of implementing a negotiated sectlement of the central American conflict, in accordance with PublicaLaw 99-8. IS.

## II. Assistance has the Vicaragean emocratic Resistance

- A. Policy Gurdance, Coordination and Supervision. The President's executive powers under the State tion and the Secretary of State's responsibilities under Section 207(a) of the Act require an effective system for colicy fimulation, decisions and implementation. For this purpose there is hereby established the following special interagency structure which, except as otherwise provided herein, will function within the National Security Council (NSC) structure established by NSDD-2 of January 12, 1982. (S)
- 1. Interagency Group on Nicaragua (IG/N). To provide policy guidance, coordination, and supervision of activities relating to the Nicaraguan democratic Less ance, the policies set out in the Act and a lated matters, a limited-attendance IG/N is established under the National Security Council structure. The IG/N shall be calife by the Assi tant tecritary of State for Inter-American Affirs and will include representation from the Department of Declars, the Central Litelligence agency, the Joint Chiefs of Staffman the National Security Gundel. Representatives of other departments and a endies with responsibility for specific matters to be considered will attend on invitation by the Chairman. The IT/N will ordinarily meet at the White House. The IG/N will:

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- -- Ensure that proposed United States Government activities with respect to the Nicaracian democratic resistance are fully integrable with United States di lomatic, economic, and security policy objectives concerning alcaragua and Central America
- -- Review and approve the proposed program or assistance to the Nicaraguan demogratic resistance, and to funding for that assistance.
- -- Ensure compliance with all requirements of law, effective consultation with and reports to the Congress and the needs of public diplomacy in the conduct of programs and activities relating to the Nicaraguan democratic resistance.
- -- Monitor the execution of approved policies and decisions and evaluate the adequacy and effectiveness of such execution.
- 2. Senior Interagency Ground Nick agua (SIG/N). To assure that senior slid officials a fully informed, and have the opportunity to revie and decelor policitop lons and objectives, the Under Secretary of State for Political Defairs will convene and chair regular matters of the SI /N at internals not longer than 90 days. The number ship of the SIG/N vill consist of representatives of departments and a encies represented on the IG/N, above the rank of assistant Secretary. The Under Secretary of State for Political iffers will also convent and chair special meetings of the SIG/N as may be necessary to review issues that are not resolved by the Chairman of the IG/N and require immediate decision, or otherwise warrant review by senior policy officials. - B. Program Implementation. Under the policy guidance, coordination and supervision provided by the interagency structure described above, the Central Intelligence Agency will carry out a comprehensive program of asistince for the Nicaraguan democratic destance, actuding material, training, intelligence, political, and propagandal ports. As may be requested by the Director of Central Intelligence, the Department of Defense will provide inlitary advice; and the Department of Defense and other departments and agencies will provide personnel and other support consistent with law to facilitate timely and efficient program incrementation and fulfillient of policy objectives.
