### **Biography**

Robert Sweet served as a senior member of the Office of Policy Development and the Domestic Policy Council in the first and second administration, respectively. He specialized in education policy but coordinated general domestic policy initiatives.

Robert Sweet was born in Durham, Maine in 1937. He obtained his BA in English from the University of Maine, Orono in 1960 and completed graduate coursework in chemistry and wage and salary administration from University of New Hampshire, Durham and Brandeis University, respectively.

Sweet worked primarily in education. Prior to his bureaucratic career, from 1960-1962 he taught at the junior high and high school level. From 1962-1979 he was an educational salesman and consultant with two major textbook companies where he conducted teacher training seminars in educational methodology and material utilization in the classroom at the elementary and secondary level. During that time, he was also a member of the Governor's Commission on Public Education for the state of New Hampshire, for 1973-1974. His work consisted of efforts to recodify state statutes for education and to implement a model voucher plan. Additionally, he served six years as a New Hampshire regional school board representative (1974-1980), where he was the chairman of the board for multiple terms. Robert Sweet was also one of the founders and first President of the Fair Haven Christian School in Essex, MA, which opened in 1977.

In the early 1980s, Robert Sweet served multiple positions within the Department of Education culminating in his appointment to the White House in the Office of Policy Development in 1983. In March of 1982, Robert Sweet was appointed by President Reagan to serve as Deputy Director of the National Institute of Education (NIE) in the US Department of Education. Concurrently, he was the Acting Director at NIE from June 17, 1982-January, 1983. He joined NIE after serving as Special Assistant in the Elementary and Secondary Education Division of the Department of Education.

On March 28, 1983 Robert Sweet joined the Office of Policy Development. Under the direction of the Assistant Director for Federalism, Health and Human Resources, he was responsible for assisting in the development and implementation of policies relating to all aspects of education and disability. In 1985, new Chief of Staff Donald Regan reorganized the White House staff by implementing the Cabinet government system. The seven Cabinet Councils for the first Administration were reorganized into two bodies: The Domestic Policy Council (DPC) and the Economic Policy Council (EPC). Ralph Bledsoe from the Office of Policy Development became the Secretary/Director of the DPC and Sweet was made the Deputy Executive Secretary. He also continued to coordinate health and education policy. As Deputy Executive Secretary he coordinated working groups on a wide variety of domestic policy issues, ensuring they created legislation and policy that fit under the broad umbrella of the Reagan White House policy directive. Sweet attended Domestic Policy Council meetings and helped draft decision memos for the President, as well as other logistical functions for the Domestic Policy Council.

In 1993, Robert Sweet co-founded the nonprofit the National Right to Read foundation, which focuses on the specific mission of returning scientifically validated classroom instruction in reading to public schools. He is married to Joy Sweet and has five children and currently resides in Virginia.

### **Scope and Content**

The Domestic Policy Council covered the broad sweep of U.S. domestic issues for 1985-1989 and this is reflected in the collection. Sweet helped develop policy on topics such as AIDS; education; tort policy; the ozone; Agent Orange; adoption; drug abuse; federal seat belt law; fetal transplantation; and more. Sweet remained heavily interested in Education policy and chaired the Parental Role in Education Working Group in the closing year of the Administration.

This collection consists of original memos, correspondence, drafts of working group papers, reports, studies, and more. Robert Sweet made multiple copies of his working material, including a reference copy of most of the memos and correspondence that passed through his office. Sweet specifically labelled this reference copy as “administrative” and this was maintained as a separate series.

This collection consists of seven series, one of which contains two subseries. The series are as follows: SERIES I: AIDS Subject Files; SERIES II: Education Policy Files; SERIES III: Working Group Files; SERIES IV: Domestic Policy Council Files; SERIES V: Subject Files; SERIES VI: Chronological Files; SERIES VII: Administrative Files.

Series II consists of two subseries. The subseries are as follows: SUBSERIES A: Subject Files and SUBSERIES B: Publications.

### **Collection Description**

#### **SERIES I: AIDS SUBJECT FILES, 1987-1988 (3.6 l. ft., Boxes 1-9)**

This series contains material relating to Bob Sweet’s involvement in the Reagan Administration’s response to the HIV/AIDS crisis. This series documents Bob Sweet’s role in coordinating and developing federal policies regarding HIV and AIDS on medical and biological

grounds. It consists of all working material including Sweet's memos, correspondence, draft reports, meeting minutes, and etc. from the Health Policy Working Group on AIDS; reports and data on what circumstances should prompt medical testing for AIDS, such as enlisting in the military or going to federal prison; reports from the Center for Disease Control (CDC), the Food and Drug Administration (FDA), and more; and fact sheets and background information on HIV and AIDS itself.

Sweet was also involved in trying to frame the response to AIDS within the social policies of the Reagan Administration, this includes working materials such contents of public notifications; drafts of policy points for the President in discussing AIDS; press releases; material debating what changes, if any, should be made to sex education in schools; publications on AIDS and safe sex; and more.

This series is arranged alphabetically by the folder title.

#### SERIES II: EDUCATION POLICY FILES, 1985-1988

##### SUBSERIES A: SUBJECT FILES, 1985-1988 (3.6 l. ft., Boxes 9-16)

This series contains material relating to drafting and tracking education policy initiatives within President Reagan's second term. It consists of education topics on: the Civil Rights Act of 1984; dismantling the department of education; the Hatch Amendment; home schooling; parental choice in education; Historic Black Colleges and Universities; staffing at the National Institute of Education (NIE); phonics and literacy reform; and school discipline.

Robert Sweet was the chairman of the Parental Role in Education Working Group. This series contains the work material from this group including numerous drafts of the final reports; comments on drafts from Working Group Members; and the directions Bob Sweet gave to the Working Group regarding things such as meetings, assignments, and chapters of the final report.

This series is arranged alphabetically by the folder title.

##### SUBSERIES B: PUBLICATIONS, 1985-188 (0.5 l. ft., Box 16)

This subseries consists of the publications on current methodology and theory in the field of education. The subseries is arranged alphabetically by the folder title.

#### SERIES III: WORKING GROUP FILE, 1985-1988 (3.6 l. ft., Boxes 16-24)

This series contains material relating to Bob Sweet's oversight of many different working groups in the second administration. Sweet as the Deputy Executive Secretary of the Domestic Policy Council monitored the progress of different domestic policy initiatives and coordinate the working groups with the Domestic Policy Council. It consists of copies of communication between Working Group chairs and outside interested parties; press releases; numerous drafts of final reports; meeting minutes; list of meeting attendees; lists of Working Group members; schedules for Working Group meetings and when the Working Group would meet with the entire Domestic Policy Council; draft memos to the President for decision; and Sweet's handwritten

notes from when he personally attended meetings.

Folders for two working groups, the Health Policy Working Group on AIDS and the Parental Role in Education Working Group, were moved into Series I and Series II, respectively due to their content matter. Folder titles were slightly adjusted for standardization. This series is arranged alphabetically by the folder title.

**SERIES IV: DOMESTIC POLICY COUNCIL FILE, 1985-1988 (1.1 l. ft., Boxes 26-28)**

This series contains material relating to Robert Sweet's work product for the Domestic Policy Council. It consists of draft decision memos to President Reagan on policy issues; plans and schedules for pending legislation and policy issues; fact sheets on different Working Group topics; correspondence; and publications. The majority of this series consists of memos that cover a wide variety of topics including acid rain, seat belt usage, welfare reform, and more.

This series is arranged alphabetically, and then chronologically when necessary by the folder title.

**SERIES V: SUBJECT FILE, 1985-1988 (2.2 l. ft., Boxes 28-33)**

This series contains material related to Robert Sweet's work product that were generally outside the scope of the DPC. It consists material about social issues such as abortion; drug abuse; fetal experimentation and transplants; religious liberties; pornography; and more. This series also contains all the regular staffing functions assigned to him, including reviews and edits of official administration communication, speeches given by President Reagan, interviews, luncheon papers, messages, scheduling, and more.

This series is arranged alphabetically by folder title.

**SERIES VI: CHRONOLOGICAL FILE, 1984-1988 (1.9 l. ft., Boxes 33-37)**

This series contains ingoing and outgoing correspondence from Robert Sweet during his time at the Domestic Policy Council. It serves to document his daily activities and schedule as a member of the Domestic Policy Council. The chronological file consists of letters; memos; articles; invitations, transcripts of speeches he gave; travel reimbursements; resumes he received; and personal correspondence either drafted by Robert Sweet or sent to him. It starts in January 1985 and documents his daily activities through December of 1988.

This series is arranged chronologically. Original folder titles were retained in processing.

**SERIES IV: ADMINISTRATIVE FILES, 1984-1988 (1.9 l. ft., Boxes 37-41)**

This series contains copies of most of the material from previous series Sweet specifically labelled as administrative. In addition to photocopies of memorandum and correspondence, this series also contains budgetary information; invitations to meetings; assignments he worked on for [Jack Svahn](#); correspondence sent to the White House and forwarded to the DPC for answer

(computer tracking correspondence); and all the logistical information for the events and conferences Sweet attended in his official capacity at Domestic Policy Council.

This series is arranged alphabetically and then chronologically. Original folders were retained in processing.
