I write this letter to you to formally extend to you an invitation to visit my farm in Illinois should you come to the United States.

I served as Secretary of Agriculture for President Reagan from 1981 thru 1985. I have been to the Soviet Union on three occasions. The first was in 1980 when I led a People to People delegation to your country. In 1983, I was there to sign the grain agreement between the United States and the Soviet Union. And in 1985, I visited your country at the invitation of the Minister of Agriculture Mesyats. Minister Mesyats was a guest at my farm in 1984. President Mitterrand of France was on my farm in 1984 also.

The Block Farm is a family farm with both my father and son active in the operation. We produce hogs, corn, and soybeans on 1400 hectares. I would be happy to arrange a farm tour, a meeting with agriculture leaders and a whole hog Bar-B-Q.

The farm is within driving distance to John Deere headquarters farm equipment company. You know Dwayne Andreas. His company, Archer Daniels Midland, a soybean and corn processing business, is also in Illinois. You might like to visit one or both of these companies. Their chief executive offices have sent invitations to you.



I have long been a champion for the cause of trade and cooperation between our countries. I want you to come to the United States. The people of the United States want you to come. And, I hope that you will see fit to accept my sincere invitation.



Dear Mr. *Don* Regan:

Although there is no precise date set for the hosting of Mr. Gorbachev to the United States, it appears to me that the prospects are good that he will come.

I am reasonably certain that he will want to visit a farm while he is here. You may recall that I offered to host him at my farm in Illinois.

There are some very good reasons why this would fit our needs.


- I. The Block farm has had extensive experience in hosting foreign dignitaries. Between 1982 and 1985, we hosted the following:
  - a. French President Mitterrand
  - b. Soviet Minister of Agriculture Mesyats
  - c. A group of 15 Ministers of Agriculture from all over the world including:
    1. Australia
    2. Argentina
    3. Germany
    4. Thailand
    5. And many others
  - d. Twenty Ambassadors were flown to the farm to see heartland agriculture.
  - e. Vice President Bush was the honored guest and met with agriculture leaders.

These events received broad coverage in the United States and foreign countries - all positive.

- II. The midwest (cornbelt) is the correct part of the country for Mr. Gorbachev to visit.
- III. There are other areas he may want to see within reasonable distance including ADM, Ralston Purina, Ford Motors and John Deere. John Deere is very close (within 40 miles). A drive of that distance through the farm country would give Mr. Gorbachev a better appreciation for this great agricultural industry.

Don, I would encourage you to research the success of these events. An event similar for Mr. Gorbachev could be equally successful.





SUBJECT: Apple Computer Invites Gorbachev to Visit

Frank, Bob Dean, and myself were copied on this letter that Apple Computer sent to Gorbachev inviting him to visit their plant in Silicon Valley. After consulting with me, Bob Dean called Eisenstat to thank him for keeping us posted and to let him know that, while his firm was free to tender such an invitation, we did have a concern that a visit might be read as a signal to the Soviets and the hi-tech community that the floodgates of tech transfer were opening. Hence, we wanted to coordinate in managing such impressions when and if a real summit that included such side trips was scheduled.

This is only one of dozens of such invitations that we know have been tendered for business, "peace", and private publicity purposes. According to Evgenii Kutovoi over at the Soviet embassy, they have bales of such invitations already. So undoubtedly we don't know about all of them.

No action required on this item now. But we have a big problem if a full-blown summit is scheduled...which for various reasons I currently believe is not very likely.




In November, history will be made during the summit meeting with General Secretary Gorbachev and President Reagan.


