

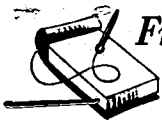

My sincere congratulations and best wishes to you, as you assume the duties of the Chief of Staff and bring order to that office and to the White House.



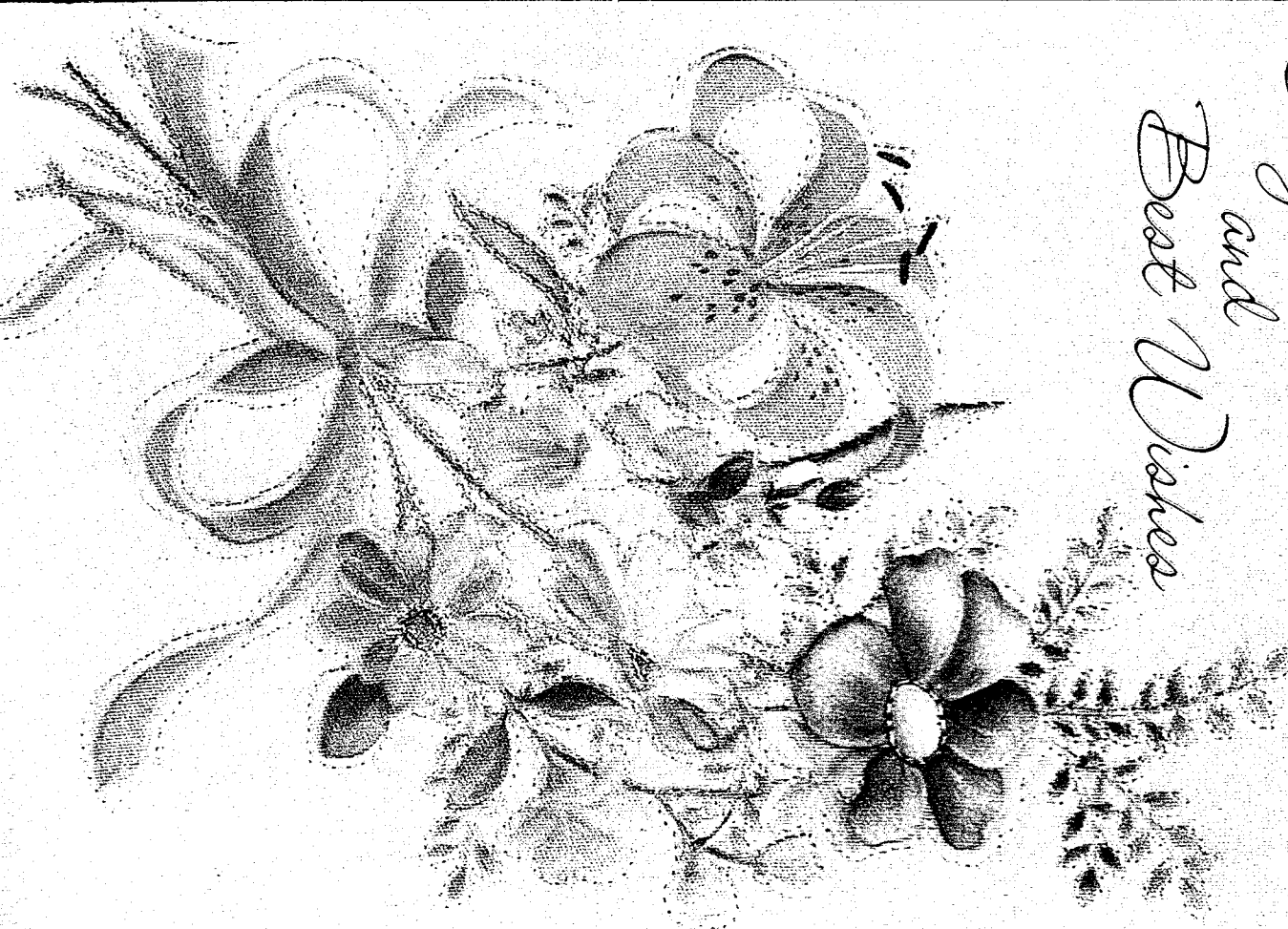
