

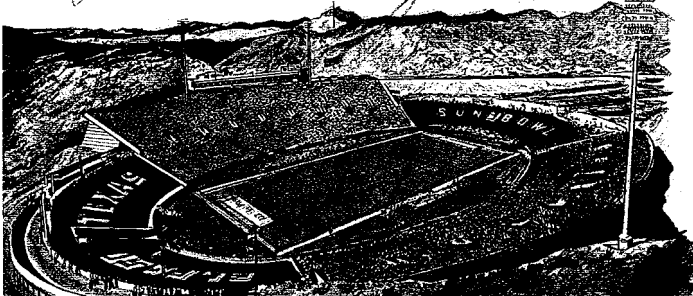

## Baker starts new job at White House

WASHINGTON (UPI) — New White House chief of staff Howard Baker started work today with a formidable mandate for change.

Baker, who gave up a possible 1988 presidential campaign to help the current president out of his worst political crisis, presided over his first senior staff meeting at the White House this morning.

The former Tennessee senator began a crash course in White House management upon accepting the chief of staff's job three days ago. He is expected to make changes in both internal politics and personnel, carefully avoiding the example of the autocratic Donald Regan, who was criticized by the Tower Commission for allowing chaos in the White House following the Iran arms disclosures.

Sources said among those expected to leave are Regan deputies Dennis Thomas, David Chew and Thomas Dawson, as well as White House counsel Peter Wallison.

The former Senate Republican leader is expected to be bringing two longtim

scom, his press secretary in the Senate, and James Cannon, his political adviser who served in President Ford's White House.

Wallison told reporters during the weekend a shake-up could not be accomplished in 24 hours, but he noted,

"Obviously we're on a fast track, trying to learn everything we can."

As Baker wrapped up a weekend break with his family in Florida, Griscom and Cannon met with presidential aides Saturday to learn White House proce-

dures in order to ease his transition. They discussed plans for Reagan's televised address on the Iran-Contra scandal, probably to be delivered Wednesday night, and one-day trips around the country in March to raise his public profile.


