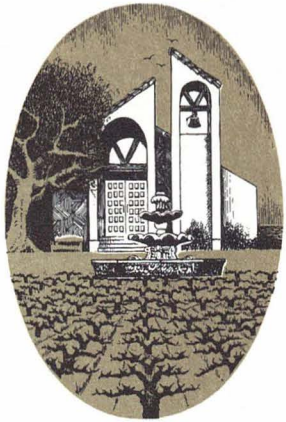

# China lists reforms to its economy

BEIJING — China yesterday unveiled a series of sweeping economic reforms designed to curb state controls and free market forces in the communist nation's boldest departure ever from its rigid economic system. The new policies, outlined in a 16,000-Chinese character document, aim to boost productivity, competition and efficiency nationwide, especially in industry, and catch up with the technological revolution. Last year, 15 percent of all these factories lost money and had to be bailed out by the government.

The reforms envisaged by the document are carried out, and would move further from the Stalinist model

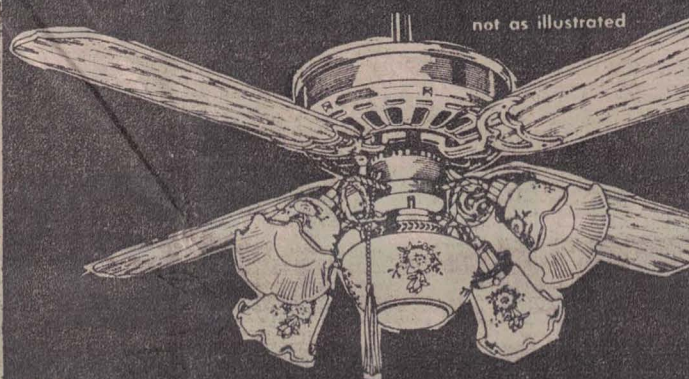
tions of Yugoslavia and Hungary.

The document lashes out at the "defects" of China's socialist system, "excessive and rigid" government control over enterprises and "equalitarianism," in which workers are paid the same regardless of their productivity.

"Socialism does not mean pauperism," said the Central Committee document. "... only when some regions, enterprises and individuals are allowed and encouraged to get better off first through diligent work can there be a strong attraction and inspiration to the majority of the people."

Although the document laid out the party's goals and philosophy, it did not announce

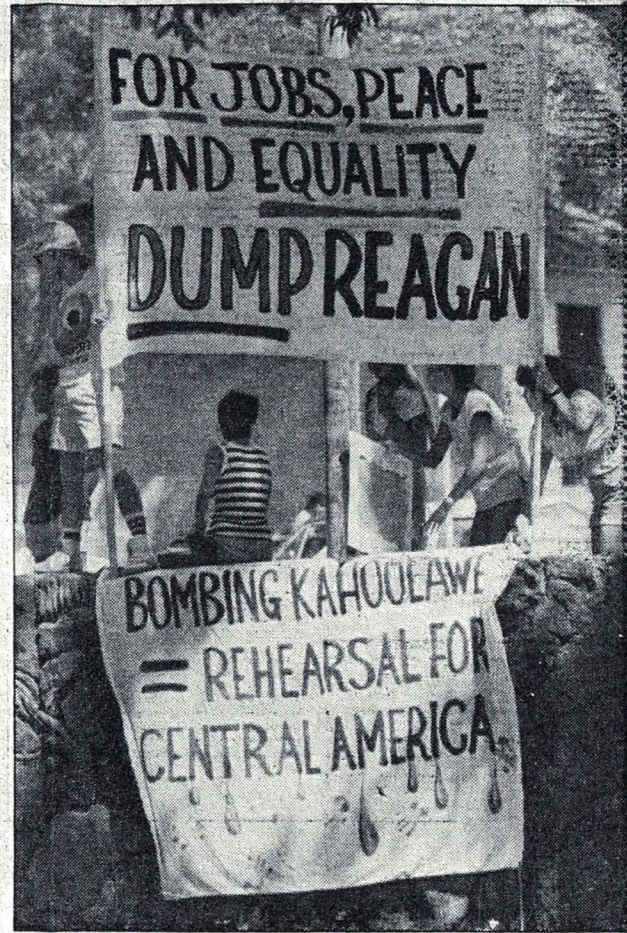
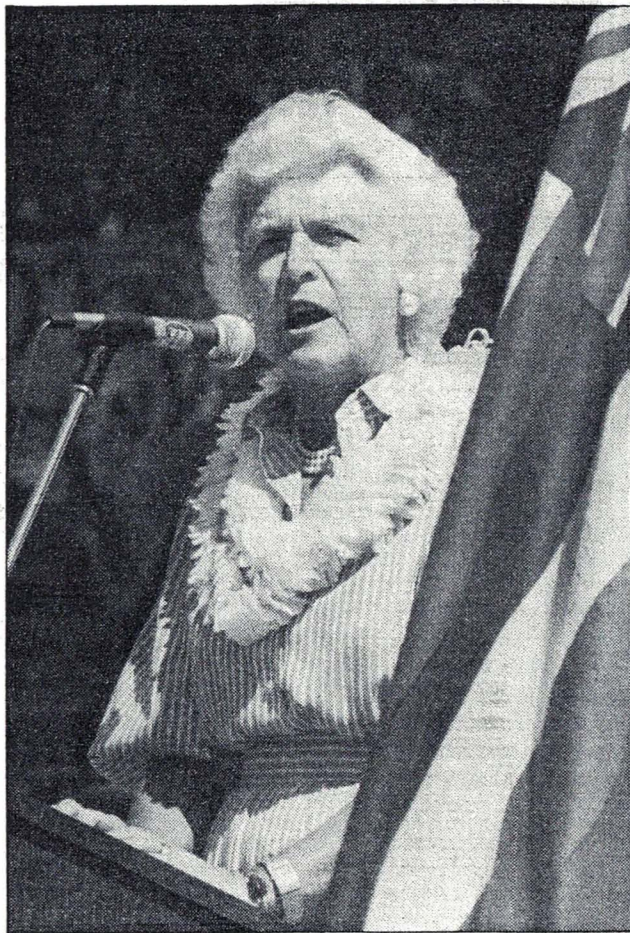
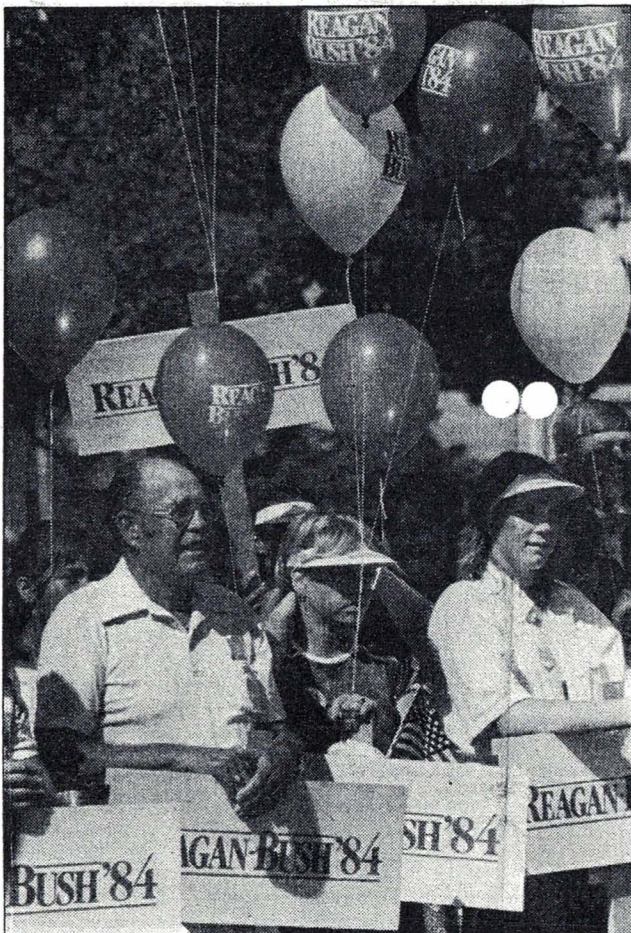

## Barbara Bush comes calling on Hawaii voters

Barbara Bush, the vice president's wife, wooed Hawaii voters young and old yesterday during a 24-hour campaign visit to Oahu.

Bush spoke to 250 people at a Republican youth rally at Thomas Square and addressed 600 Republican women at a Prince Kuhio Hotel luncheon in an effort to rally support for the Reagan-Bush ticket.



Bush told the group that the Reagan-Bush organizers hope Hawaii will support the Republicans on the national ticket. "It would be very exciting," she told the Republican women. "We think we've got a shot at it."

George Bush took office, prospects for youth in America were not hopeful.

"Their leadership has made your dreams a reality," she said.

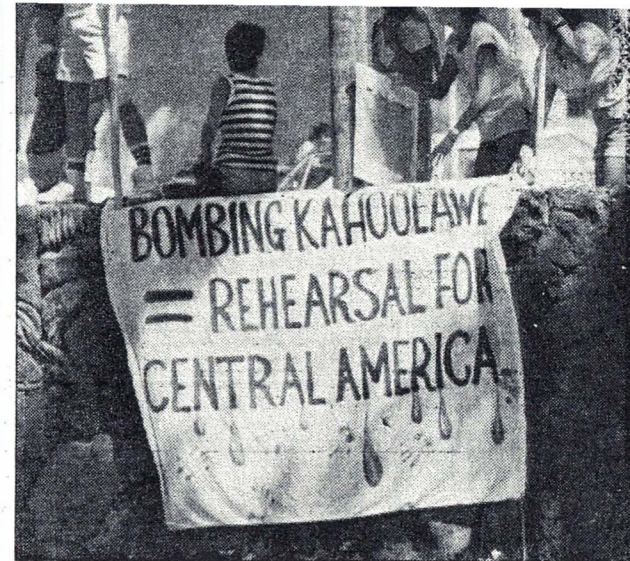
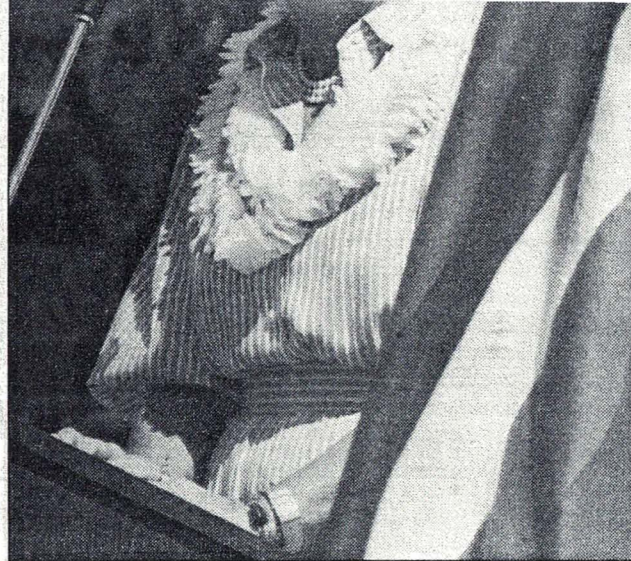

# Barbara Bush comes calling on Hawaii voters

Barbara Bush, the vice president's wife, wooed Hawaii voters young and old yesterday during a 24-hour campaign visit to Oahu.

Bush spoke to 250 people at a Republican youth rally at Thomas Square and addressed 600 Republican women at a Prince Kuhio Hotel luncheon in an effort to rally support for local and national Republican candidates.

She visited with volunteers working on Hawaii's campaign for literacy in the morning and dined with GOP leaders at a private fund-raising party last night. And the Republicans had to tangle with a crowd of girls who were waiting in the lobby of the Prince Kuhio Hotel in hopes of seeing the five young stars of Menudo.

Hotel security guards were kept busy monitoring hordes of screaming young girls who responded to rumors of the stars' whereabouts by running through the hotel bumping into well-dressed Republican women.

Once in the banquet hall,



Bush told the group that the Reagan-Bush organizers hope Hawaii will support the Republicans on the national ticket.

"It would be very exciting," she told the Republican women. "We think we've got a shot at it."

State Republican Party chairwoman Patricia Saiki, who persuaded Mainland GOP leaders to send a representative of the presidential campaign to Hawaii, said, "Barbara Bush's presence acknowledges the fact that Hawaii is important to the Reagan-Bush effort and the Reagan-Bush effort is important to Hawaii."

Bush earlier told the young Republicans at the rally that the polls show "the strongest support for the president is in the 18-to-30-year-old range."

She said protesters "can't understand why the young are responding to the Reagan-Bush message." But she suggested that before Ronald Reagan and

George Bush took office, prospects for youth in America were not hopeful.

"Their leadership has made your dreams a reality," she said.

About 30 protesters stood on the edge of Thomas Square waving Mondale-Ferraro signs. Before Bush arrived, the two groups shouted slogans at each other — the Republicans called for "four more years" while the opposition chanted for "three more months."

The turnout for the rally was lower than the organizers had expected and many of those waving Reagan-Bush signs and sporting campaign T-shirts were older than 30. But Saiki and mayoral candidate Frank Fasi said they were pleased with the Republican show of support for Bush.

"I think anybody visiting from the Reagan-Bush campaign will help any Republican candidate in Hawaii," Fasi said.

Bush urged the Republican women to campaign actively for local candidates as well as for the Reagan-Bush ticket.

"You shouldn't even be here at lunch," she joked. "As soon as you finish eating go home,

two highest offices in the land," she said, "but she must be judged on her qualifications."

Bush was scheduled to leave Oahu last night for Washington, D.C., where she will watch today's presidential debate on television with her husband, an aide said.


