THE VICE PRESIDENT'S TASK FORCE WORKING GROUP LED BY

AND U.S. BUSINESSMEN ON PERCEPTIONS OF THE TERRORIST

INTELLIGENCE, POLICE AND DEFENSE OFFICIALS, INCLUDING MINISTER OF DEFENSE VEGA, ON OCTOBER 7 REVIEWED FOR THE WORKING GROUP THE GUERRILLA THREAT AND USE OF TERRORISM IN COLOMBIA AND, IN RESPONSE TO WORKING GROUP QUESTIONS, OUTLINED THEIR VIEWS OF THE TERRORISTS' OBJECTIVES AND NOTED HOW THE GOC IS ORGANIZED TO COUNTER THE TERRORIST THREAT. AT DINNER HOSTED BY THE CHARGE, THE WORKING GROUP MET SIX SENIOR REPRESENTATIVES OF U.S. BUSINESS IN COLOMBIA WHO SHARED THEIR PERCEPTIONS OF THE TERRORIST THREAT; DESCRIBED VARYING ANTI-TERRORIST MEASURES THEY AND THEIR FIRMS EMPLOY; AND PRAISED THE U.S. MISSION'S COOPERATION WITH THE BUSINESS COMMUNITY. ON THE MORNING OF OCTOBER 8, AT A SITE SOUTHWEST OF BOGOTA, THE WORKING GROUP WITNESSED PREPARATIONS FOR A JOINT HOSTAGE BARRICADE EXERCISE (REF B). THE WORKING GROUP DEPARTED FOR PANAMA LATE AFTERNOON, OCTOBER 8. END SUMMARY

3. PIPELINE SECURITY SITUATION AND PROBLEMS:

THE WORKING GROUP, OCTOBER 7, MET WITH JOHN STABLER, SHELL OIL COMPANY'S SECURITY CHIEF IN COLOMBIA. MR. STABLER BRIEFED THE GROUP ON THE SERIOUS SECURITY PROBLEMS FOR THE COLOMBIAN PIPELINE PROJECT. MR. STABLER NOTED THAT 5 FIRMS ARE INVOLVED IN CONSTRUCTING THE 477 MILE LONG PIPELINE ACROSS NORTHERN COLOMBIA WHERE GUERRILLAS - ESPECIALLY THE ELP AND ELN - OPERATE. THESE FIRMS HAVE ENCOUNTERED THREATS OF EXTORTION, KIDNAPPING, AND AMBUSH. MAJOR PROBLEMS ENCOUNTERED INCLUDE ACQUIRING RELEVANT INTELLIGENCE; COORDINATING MILITARY SECURITY; AND MOBILIZING ADEQUATE MILITARY RESOURCES TO PROVIDE SECURITY. MR. STABLER ALSO DESCRIBED EFFORTS ON THE PART OF THE CONTRACTORS TO INITIATE CIVIC ACTION PROGRAMS WHICH WOULD MAKE THE PIPELINE MORE ACCEPTABLE TO LOCAL INHABITANTS. SUCH PROGRAMS ARE UNDERTAKEN WITH THE AGREEMENT OF THE COLOMBIAN ARMED FORCES, WHICH THEMSELVES DO NOT HAVE THE RESOURCES TO FUND SUCH PROGRAMS. MR. STABLER UNDERScoreD THAT THE CONSTRUCTION FIRMS ARE NOW, IN EFFECT, BUYING TIME TO COMPLETE THE PIPELINE, BUT THE PIPELINE WILL REMAIN VULNERABLE TO TERRORIST ATTACK. SHELL, STABLER ADDED, WILL NOT PAY "PROTECTION" TO TERRORISTS.

4. ADMINISTRATIVE SECURITY DEPARTMENT BRIEFING:

COL. MIGUEL MAZA, CHIEF OF THE DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATI
SECURITY (DAS) AND THE INTELLIGENCE GROUP IN THE
JUSTICE MINISTRY, BRIEFED THE WORKING GROUP ON
TERRORIST TACTICS. TERRORISM, HE DECLARED IS A COMBAT
TECHNIQUE USED BY GUERRILLA GROUPS TO WEAKEN THE
NATIONAL ECONOMY. TERRORISM HAS INCREASED SINCE
THE 1984 PEACE AGREEMENTS. TERRORISTS SEEK TO
INTIMIDATE INVESTORS AND BUSINESSMEN; AT THE SAME
TIME THEY RAISE FUNDS FOR THEIR OWN OPERATIONS. THEY
ALSO DRAW REVENUE FROM NARCOTICS TRAFFICKERS IN RETURN

THE MOD INTELLIGENCE DIRECTORATE PROVIDED THE TASK FORCE WORKING GROUP A DETAILED BRIEFING ON THE ORGANIZATION, DEPLOYMENT, OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES OF THE FOUR LEADING GUERRILLA GROUPS. THE DIRECTOR OF THE JOINT INTELLIGENCE CENTER AGAINST EXTORTION AND KIDNAPPING (CIAES) THEN DESCRIBED HIS ELEMENT'S EFFORTS TO COORDINATE THE NATIONAL POLICE, ARMED FORCES, AND THE DAS IN COUNTER-TERRORIST ACTIVITY. THE CIAES HAS RECEIVED U.S. COUNTER-TERRORIST ASSISTANCE. THE BRIEFER INDICATED THAT KIDNAPPINGS HAD DROPPED FROM 299 LAST YEAR TO 165 IN THE FIRST 9 MONTHS OF 1985. GUERRILLAS USE KIDNAPPING RANSOMS TO FINANCE THEIR OPERATIONS. IN 1984 THE GOC ESTIMATED THAT GUERRILLAS RAISED NEARLY \$15 MILLION THIS WAY.

6. DEFENSE MINISTER VEGA CALLS FOR GREATER U.S.

ASSISTANCE:

DEFENSE MINISTER GENERAL VEGA URIBE WELCOMED THE WORKING GROUP'S VISIT AS AN EXPRESSION OF U.S. INTEREST ON A CRITICALLY IMPORTANT SUBJECT. EXTORTION, KIDNAPPING AND TERRORISM EXIST IN ABUNDANCE IN COLOMBIA, GENERAL VEGA SAID, AND MAFIA-TYPE OR NARCOTICS GROUPS ALSO THREATEN U.S. INTERESTS HERE. THE GOC WELCOMES EXCHANGE OF INFORMATION AND COOPERATION IN THIS AREA. ADDITIONAL U.S. ASSISTANCE WOULD BE PARTICULARLY WELCOMED, THE GENERAL ADDED. WHEN WORKING GROUP MEMBERS ASKED ABOUT GOC COORDINATING MECHANISMS IN THE ANTI-TERRORISM FIGHT, GENERAL VEGA CLAIMED THAT COLOMBIA DOES NOT HAVE THE SAME "PROLIFERATION OF AGENCIES" THAT EXISTS IN THE UNITED STATES. THE CIAS, HE POINTED OUT, COORDINATES GOC COUNTER-TERRORISM ACTIVITIES AND, FOR A PARTICULAR INCIDENT, ORDINARILY DESIGNATES A LEAD AGENCY. APART FROM KIDNAPPING AND EXTORTION, GENERAL VEGA DESCRIBED OTHER FORMS OF TERRORISM SUCH AS HOAX TELEPHONE CALLS OR RANDOM ACTS WHICH MIGHT KILL AN INDIVIDUAL AND TERRORIZE THOUSANDS. TERRORISM, HE CONCLUDED, IS PSYCHOLOGICAL WARFARE THAT MUST BE COMBATED BY PSYCHOLOGICAL WARFARE. IN HIS PRESENTATION, GENERAL VEGA RETURNED TO THE THEME OF ENCOURAGING GREATER U.S. ASSISTANCE FOR COLOMBIAN COUNTER-TERRORISM EFFORTS. AMBASSADOR PECK NOTED THAT THIS SUBJECT WAS BEYOND THE PURVIEW OF THE TASK FORCE WORKING GROUP'S CHARTER TO DEVELOP AN APPRECIATION OF THE OVERALL TERRORISM PROBLEM.

7. OPTIMISTIC VIEWS FROM THE NATIONAL POLICE:

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THE DIRECTOR GENERAL OF THE NATIONAL POLICE, GENERAL VICTOR DELGADO, EXPRESSED HIS CONVICTION THAT TERRORISM IN COLOMBIA IS NOW UNDER CONTROL. THE GOC USES COUNTER-TERRORISM METHODS EMPLOYED IN THE OTHER COUNTRIES AND HAS HAD A CONSIDERABLE MEASURE OF SUCCESS. GENERAL DELGADO THOUGHT THAT MANY TERRORIST INDICENTS WERE DESIGNED TO INTIMIDATE, RATHER THAN ELIMINATE INDIVIDUALS. VERY RARELY, FOR INSTANCE, DO BOMBS CAUSE DEATH OR INJURIES; TELEPHONE CALLS OR OTHER THREATS MAY HAVE CERTAIN POLITICAL PURPOSES SUCH AS

8. AT DINNER HOSTED BY THE CHARGE, OCTOBER 7, THE
WORKING GROUP DISCUSSED WITH SIX SENIOR REPRESENTATIVES
OF U.S. BUSINESS TERRORIST THREATS THEY AND THEIR FIRMS
CONFRONT AND VARIOUS ANTI-TERRORIST MEASURES THEY
EMPLOY. THE BUSINESSMEN GENERALLY AGREED THAT

TERRORISM IN COLOMBIA WAS ROOTED IN POVERTY WHICH INCREASED EXPORTS, PRODUCTION AND EMPLOYMENT COULD ERADICATE. ONE EXECUTIVE MENTIONED THAT THE GOC SHOULD REDIRECT RESOURCES INTO MORE EFFECTIVE CIVIC ACTION PROGRAMS IN RURAL AREAS, ESPECIALLY WHERE GUERRILLAS OPERATE. THE BUSINESSMEN DID DISTINGUISH BETWEEN "COMMERCIAL" (MONEY-RAISING) AND "POLITICAL" TERRORISM. THE FORMER WAS BOTH MORE COMMON AND EASIER FOR BUSINESSES TO HANDLE; THE LATTER POSED AN ESPECIALLY ACUTE DANGER. SEVERAL EXECUTIVES OPINED THAT OUTSIDE BOGOTA THE ARMY WAS CONSIDERABLY MORE EFFECTIVE THAN THE NATIONAL POLICE, OR IN COUNTERING GUERRILLA TERRORISM. THE ARMY, IN THEIR VIEW, WAS BECOMING INCREASINGLY DISSATISFIED WITH THE "PEACE PROCESS" BECAUSE IT PERMITTED THE GUERRILLAS TO REGAIN THEIR STRENGTH. THE BUSINESSMEN EXPRESSED APPRECIATION FOR COOPERATION WITH THE U.S. MISSION, NOTABLY FOR THE ALACRITY IN RELAYING THREAT ALERTS.

9. OBSERVING HOSTAGE BARRICADE EXERCISE:

THE MORNING OF OCTOBER 8, AT A COLOMBIA ARMY BASE NEAR MELGAR (ABOUT 60 MILES SOUTHWEST OF BOGOTA), THE WORKING GROUP WITNESSED PREPARATIONS FOR A JOINT (WITH CINCSOUTH FORCES) COUNTER-TERRORIST EXERCISE, DESIGNED TO ENHANCE THE GOC'S CAPABILITY IN HOSTAGE BARRICADE SITUATIONS. DETAILS REGARDING THE PREPARATIONS AND THE INTEGRATED EXERCISE (TO BE HELD OCTOBER 14-16) ARE TRANSMITTED BOGOTA 12269. THE TASK FORCE WORKING GROUP THEN RETURNED TO BOGOTA ENROUTE TO PANAMA LATE OCTOBER 8.
