I. PURPOSE

The Auto Industry Task Force chaired by Secretary Drew Lewis will preview their findings and recommendations concerning the automobile industry.

II. BACKGROUND

The Task Force has been working for the past month. This meeting was requested in order to preview Task Force findings and recommendations prior to the drafting and submittal of a final report.

It is my understanding that the Task Force is considering two major recommendations:

1. Massive cuts in regulations that place a burden on the industry.
2. Some form of import restraints that will reportedly lead to a tremendous new investment program by the automobile industry and reductions in union demands during contract negotiations.

The first of these recommendations could be incorporated into the Vice President's Task Force. The second recommendation, however, will be considerably more controversial and must receive careful consideration before the report is finalized.

The Task Force report will be discussed with governors who are coming in on Friday this week. Additional White House staffing of the Task Force recommendations will be required prior to that meeting, but a discussion about the governors should occur during this meeting.
