SUGGESTED TALKING POINTS FOR MEETING WITH  
MEMBERS OF NACo

- I appreciate the opportunity for a dialogue with <sup>YOU WHO ARE</sup> ~~this distinguished group~~ of county officials.
  
- ~~of want~~ <sup>THAT WE INTEND</sup> to reaffirm ~~my~~ commitment to establish a working partnership with you as we attempt to solve our nation's economic problems.
  
- ~~As you know~~, restoring a balance between the Federal government and other levels of government <sup>IS A WILL BE ... POLICY</sup> ~~is a priority~~ of this Administration. The White House Intergovernmental Affairs Office, under the leadership of Rich Williamson, will be playing a key role as liaison to you.
  
- As part of restoring that balance, we intend to establish a coordinating task force on federalism. <sup>9</sup> ~~We~~ have already been in touch with representatives of your organization to seek advice on how the task force should be organized.
  
- In developing our economic package, we have tried to be fair and even handed. We created a social safety net to protect the truly needy.

- And when it comes to the Defense Department, I can assure you that Cap Weinberger is anything but a big spender. ~~The~~ *He has* department ~~will not be free from the cut and trim philosophy of the Administration~~ *already identified & gone to work to make into "3 Bil. + which" gone toward reducing the net incrs.*
- As you know, the UDAG function has been preserved and will be combined into a Community Development Support Program. We will be sending ~~the~~ legislation to ~~enable the UDAG function to~~ *CARRY THIS OUT - UP TO "HILL"* continue.
- With respect to Payments in Lieu of Taxes, the Department of the Interior has restructured its budget authority to allow for Payments in Lieu of Taxes for counties which have federal lands within their jurisdictions. We feel that making Payments in Lieu of Taxes by the federal government is part of being a good neighbor. There is a responsibility of ownership that requires landholders to pay their fair share of the cost of local government.
- Vice President Bush, who will be addressing your group tomorrow is heading a special Presidential task force to clear away regulatory roadblocks. His role in our regulatory relief effort should make clear the importance we place on this issue.
- I would be happy to take any questions that you might have.
