REMARKS: TAPING FOR NATIONAL SPANISH TELEVISION NETWORK

Good evening. I want to say how happy I am to help inaugurate the first national news show carried in Spanish. With this program, the National Spanish Television Network reaches out to millions of people who have been isolated from major televised newscasts -- I know these broadcasts will enrich lives and improve understanding of the world we live in.

Yet, this premier broadcast signifies more than a valuable new service provided by free enterprise; it recognizes the growing influence of Hispanic citizens in our communities and throughout the Nation. In numbers, in income, in political participation, our Hispanic citizens are one of America's greatest resources.

This program represents Hispanic participation in an important aspect of American life -- the free and unrestricted flow of information and divergent points of view. The Supreme Court once wrote that a "free press stands as one of the great interpreters between the government and the people." The medium of television, in particular a special language newscast, is just such an interpreter.

Again, I am delighted to be part of this initial telecast. Now and then I make some news myself so I will probably be seeing you soon in this very place. Thank you and good evening.

REMARKS: TAPING FOR THE 22ND ANNUAL TEAMSTERS CONVENTION

I want to extend warm greetings to all of you in Las Vegas attending the 22nd Annual Teamsters Convention. From my union days, I know such conventions can generate feelings of camaraderie and purpose, and I am sorry I cannot be there in person to participate. But, I do appreciate the opportunity to send my regards.

I also want to extend my sympathy on the loss of Frank Fitzsimmons. As I have said previously, Frank won the respect of both business and political leaders as an affable but hard bargainer. He also won friendships, including my own.

When Frank was at the White House shortly before his death, I thanked him for his support during the election. Today, let me say to each of you how much I appreciated your endorsement and support.

As a former union president, nothing makes me prouder than to work together with my union brothers toward a shared goal. Our current common desire is to revitalize the economy. When the economy is humming, it means that your 18 wheelers are humming down the highways; it means that America is prosperous and that her working men and women have jobs. It means runaway inflation is under control; it means union members can afford their own homes.

To accomplish all this we not only have to get government to stop wasting money -- we have to give tax relief to average Americans so we can release again their ingenuity and energy and end their frustration over the constantly shrinking value of their take-home pay.

I know you'll agree that we need a convoy of determined citizens and legislators to break through the business-as-usual economics of government. While we have some successes behind us, many difficult barriers lie ahead.

Your past support indicates how much you share my concerns on the economy. I will continue to seek your support and labor leadership as we strive to release the Nation's vitality and unbind its strength. I hope to be in team with the Teamsters -- and with all of America's working men and women -- pulling for a more prosperous America.

Again, you have my very best wishes for a productive convention and my thanks.

3 Robert Nesen, Ambassador to Australia

Bob Nesen is an old friend and long-time supporter of yours and also active in the 1980 California Campaign. He is a former Assistant Secretary of the Navy, a successful business man, and is a breeder of horses, which he has in common with Australian Prime Minister Fraser. He will be sworn in in the Roosevelt Room shortly after the picture-taking ceremony.

2 John Burroughs, Ambassador to Malawi

Ambassador Burroughs will be going to Malawi, a small South-Central African nation which has pursued pro-Western policies with a free market economy under the leadership of President Banda. Amb. Burroughs attended the University of Iowa (graduated 1959) and was an All American tackle on the Iowa Rose Bowl football team. He has served 21 years as a career civil servant with the Departments of State and Navy. This is his first assignment abroad.

1 Arthur Woodruff, Ambassador to Central African Republic

Ambassador Woodruff is a career Foreign Service Officer, graduate of Harvard University, and a Marine officer who served in combat in Korea. He has served in several African posts as well as London and NATO. He is married and has four children. He will be accompanied by his wife, Jean.
