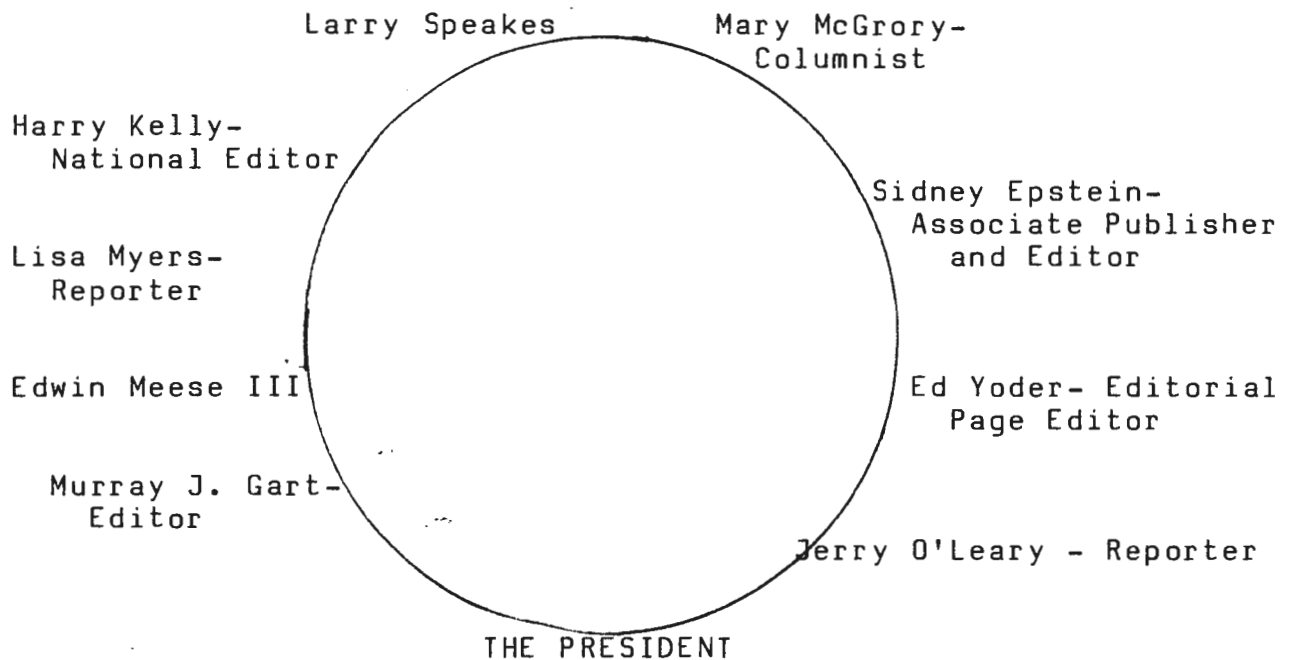

I. PURPOSE

The principal issue for discussion at the Cabinet meeting is the Clean Air Act. This issue has been under review for several weeks by a working group within the Cabinet Council on Natural Resources and Environment. You will be briefed and asked to approve amendments to the Clean Air Act which are being recommended by Ann Gorsuch, Administrator, Environmental Protection Agency, with the approval of the members of the Cabinet Council on Natural Resources and Environment. Additionally, you will be asked to make decisions in three cases where options are presented because the issues are particularly sensitive and not all members of the Administration are in agreement.

Following the Clean Air Act discussion, David Stockman and Ed Harper will brief the Cabinet on Waste, Fraud and Abuse, and Debt Collection.

II. BACKGROUND

1. Clean Air Act -- Ann Gorsuch

The Cabinet Council on Natural Resources and Environment formed a working group to develop proposed amendments to the Clean Air Act. Ann Gorsuch headed the working group and will make the presentation. A nine-page paper on the suggested amendments has been approved by the Cabinet Council on Natural Resources and Environment. The paper is being held in my office and is available if you wish to refer to it. The issues before you at the Cabinet meeting are summarized below:

A. National Ambient Air Quality Standards/Primary

- Options:
- i. Leave the present process unchanged, relying on administrative discretion to relax the standards which are agreed to be too stringent, based on poor science, waste billions of dollars.
  - ii. Change the standard setting process, giving the administrator greater discretion to relax the standards. (This option enjoys the most support within the Cabinet Council.)
  - iii. Change the basic philosophy of the Act by placing cost considerations directly in the standard-setting process. (This option is the most extreme and would encounter strong opposition.)

B. Prevention of Significant Deterioration (PSD)

- Options:
- i. Retain the present PSD statutory scheme, which involves a permit process, for protection of parks and wilderness areas; but change the method for short-term (3-24 hour) violations. This is a significant reduction in the permit burden since there are now about 500 sources which annually need permits. This process has frustrated or halted economic development in areas which are already cleaner than federal law would ordinarily require.
  - ii. Delete the entire PSD program, providing special protection for national parks and wilderness areas through federal secondary standards (favored by OMB, but a considerably more significant reduction).

C. Percent Reduction and Technology Requirements  
(New Source Performance Standards)

- Options:
- i. The Cabinet Council was in agreement with regard to eliminating scrubbers for all new coal-fired sources as

part of the "percent reduction" requirements. It is also recommended that the uniform technology requirements be established throughout the country for areas that have both attained and not attained air quality targets. These requirements would be established on an industry-by-industry basis.

- ii. A second option, favored by some, would eliminate technology requirements entirely for new sources in "attainment areas;" and/or allow states to replace technology requirements in non-attainment areas with a marketable permit system (i.e., buy and sell the right to pollute).

#### D. Consensus Items

- i. State Implementation Plan (SIP): The Cabinet Council agreed that the Federal Government should be removed from the SIP process.
- ii. Non-Attainment Areas. It is recommended to largely eliminate the present non-attainment area programs.
- iii. Hazardous Air Pollutants: It is recommended that the program be revised to give the EPA Administrator more authority to effectively control hazardous air pollutants.
- iv. Mobile Sources: It is recommended to relax emissions standards for automobiles (saving \$100 per car and \$1 billion annually).
- v. Acid Rain: It is being recommended that the Administration not address this issue with the Clean Air Act amendments at this time, but rather that current research be accelerated, and followed by recommendations to Congress for appropriate federal action.

#### 2. Debt Collection -- David Stockman

On April 23, 1981 you wrote to all Departments and Agencies directing them to improve their federal debt collection procedures. Recent studies have shown that more than \$25 billion of the \$175 billion in debts owed the Federal Government are either delinquent or in default. OMB will report on their progress.

You may wish to indicate that you understand she has been hard at work on this project for the last few months, meeting with all types of groups: car manufacturers, Canadians, Congressmen, scientists, senators, environmentalists and state officials.

Dave Stockman and Ed Harper will discuss Debt Collection and the Waste, Fraud and Abuse Program.
