I. PURPOSE

To solicit support and advice from Congressman John Erlenborn (R-Ill) regarding Administration amendments to the job training bill, soon to be considered by the House of Representatives.

II. BACKGROUND

Congressman John Erlenborn is the Ranking Minority Member of the House Education and Labor Committee. His support will be essential to any successful effort to amend the job training bill on the House Floor and eventually achieve a bill which could be signed by the President.

Last January the President approved a program developed by the Department of Labor, to replace the expiring Comprehensive Employment and Training Act (CETA), that was more compatible with the philosophy of this Administration. The major principles of the President's program are:

- 75 cents of every dollar should be spent on training as opposed to 15 cents under CETA. (However, the bill passed by the Senate and endorsed by the Administration provides that 71 cents of every dollar be spent on training. The Department of Labor has also stated that a level of 70 cents for training would be acceptable in the House bill.)
- No individuals should be paid salaries or wages for participating in the program.
- No public service jobs should be allowed.
- The Governor and State should run the training program consistent with Federalism.
- Federal funds should be distributed to the States through Block Grants.

II. BACKGROUND Continued:

-- The private sector should have a major role in training participants.

Last month the Senate passed an Administration endorsed bill by a 95-0 vote. The Senate bill achieves each of the principles stated above. Next week, the House of Representatives is expected to consider a job training bill which the Administration cannot support in its current form. The House bill needs to be modified to encompass the principles stated above.

To correct the House bill, the Department of Labor has submitted a package of amendments to Congressman Erlenborn and has sought his support for those amendments. However, Congressman Erlenborn believes these amendments will fail in the House and has not agreed to offer them. Mr. Erlenborn recommends that the Administration submit amendments that could pass the House and thereby move the House bill closer to the bill passed by the Senate. He would then seek to achieve a bill, which is acceptable to the Administration and encompasses the six principles of the President's original proposal, in the House-Senate Conference Committee on the legislation.

The Department of Labor believes that by supporting the weaker amendments, the Administration will signal that it is backing off of the six principles. The Department feels that this could ultimately result in a job training bill coming to the President's desk from Conference that would drastically differ from the program approved by the President last January.

10:00 a.m. PRESIDENT AND MRS. REAGAN descend the elevator and proceed to the Arrival Ceremony on the South Lawn via the Diplomatic Reception Room. They greet Her Excellency Indira Gandhi Prime Minister of India as she arrives.

10:20 a.m. Following the Arrival Ceremony, PRESIDENT REAGAN, MRS. REAGAN, and Prime Minister Indira Gandhi proceed through the Diplomatic Reception Room and up the elevator to the State Floor with Ambassador Roosevelt. They then take their places for the receiving line in front of the Blue Room in the Cross Hall.

The order from west to east is PRESIDENT REAGAN, Prime Minister Indira Gandhi, and MRS. REAGAN. (Ambassador Roosevelt will introduce guests to the PRESIDENT from his left.)

The remaining invited guests will wait until the PRINCIPALS have had time to take their places, then they will proceed up the west staircase, outside of the White House leading into the Red Room, going in front of the Blue Room, past the PRINCIPALS, proceeding into the Green Room, then into the Blue Room for refreshments. (Juice, coffee, and pastries.)

10:30 a.m. At the termination of the receiving line, Ambassador Roosevelt will escort PRESIDENT REAGAN and Prime Minister Indira Gandhi to the Oval Office. MRS. REAGAN will briefly join the guests in the Blue Room.

10:40 a.m. MRS. REAGAN proceeds from the Blue Room to the Cross Hall and continues to the Residence via the elevator.

All remaining guests in the Blue Room depart either the North Portico or the Diplomatic Reception Room.

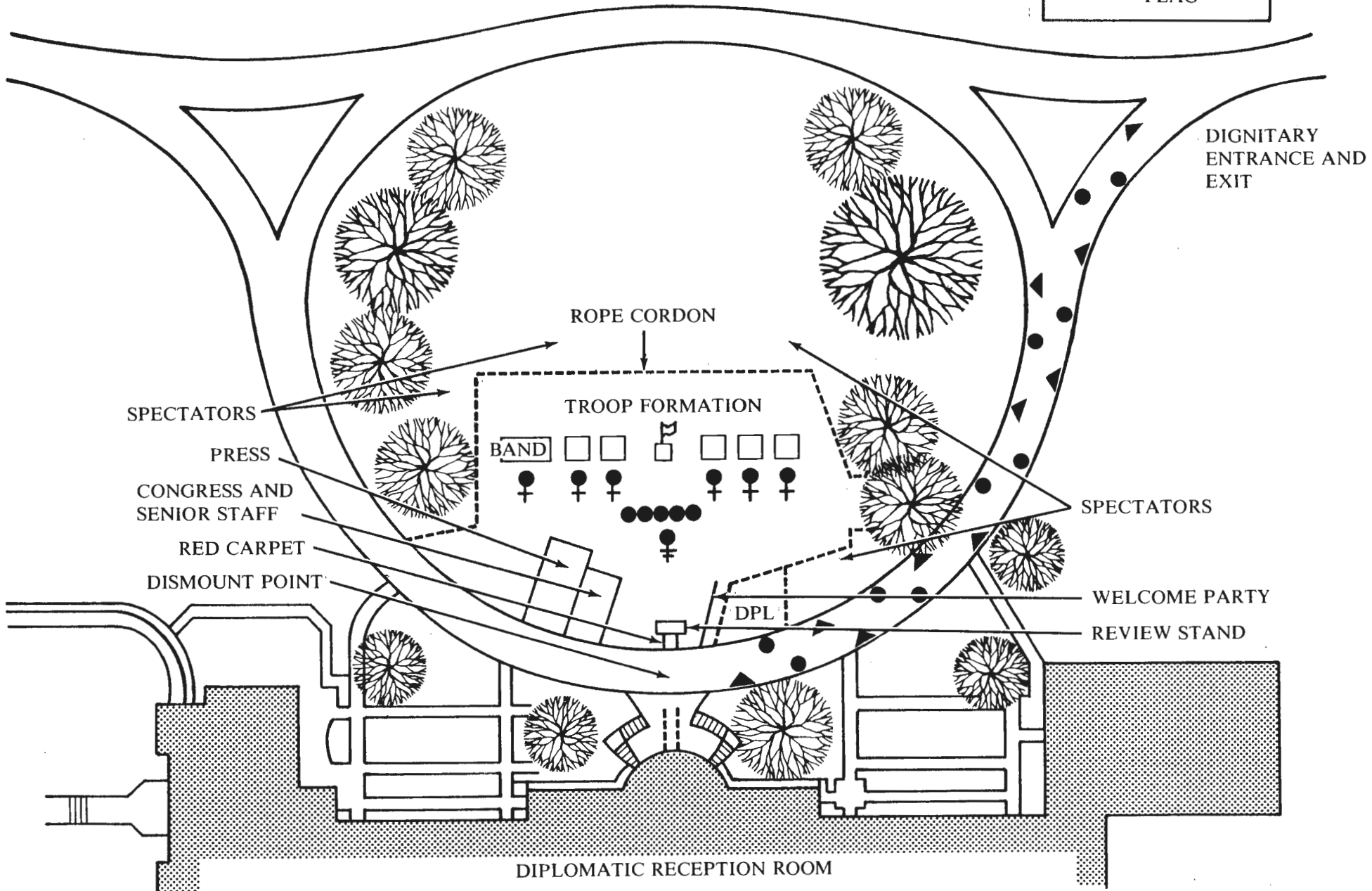

I. PURPOSE

To solicit support and advice from Congressman John Erlenborn (R-Ill) regarding Administration amendments to the job training bill, soon to be considered by the House of Representatives.

II. BACKGROUND

Congressman John Erlenborn is the Ranking Minority Member of the House Education and Labor Committee. His support will be essential to any successful effort to amend the job training bill on the House Floor and eventually achieve a bill which could be signed by the President.

Last January the President approved a program developed by the Department of Labor, to replace the expiring Comprehensive Employment and Training Act (CETA), that was more compatible with the philosophy of this Administration. The major principles of the President's program are:

- 75 cents of every dollar should be spent on training as opposed to 15 cents under CETA. (However, the bill passed by the Senate and endorsed by the Administration provides that 71 cents of every dollar be spent on training. The Department of Labor has also stated that a level of 70 cents for training would be acceptable in the House bill.)
- No individuals should be paid salaries or wages for participating in the program.
- No public service jobs should be allowed.
- The Governor and State should run the training program consistent with Federalism.
- Federal funds should be distributed to the States through Block Grants.

II. BACKGROUND Continued:

-- The private sector should have a major role in training participants.

Last month the Senate passed an Administration endorsed bill by a 95-0 vote. The Senate bill achieves each of the principles stated above. Next week, the House of Representatives is expected to consider a job training bill which the Administration cannot support in its current form. The House bill needs to be modified to encompass the principles stated above.

To correct the House bill, the Department of Labor has submitted a package of amendments to Congressman Erlenborn and has sought his support for those amendments. However, Congressman Erlenborn believes these amendments will fail in the House and has not agreed to offer them. Mr. Erlenborn recommends that the Administration submit amendments that could pass the House and thereby move the House bill closer to the bill passed by the Senate. He would then seek to achieve a bill, which is acceptable to the Administration and encompasses the six principles of the President's original proposal, in the House-Senate Conference Committee on the legislation.

The Department of Labor believes that by supporting the weaker amendments, the Administration will signal that it is backing off of the six principles. The Department feels that this could ultimately result in a job training bill coming to the President's desk from Conference that would drastically differ from the program approved by the President last January.

TALKING POINTS FOR MEETING WITH  
CONGRESSMAN JOHN ERLNBORN

- Appreciate your coming over here to talk about the Job Training Reform bill which will be on the House floor next week.
- I know you share my commitment that this legislative initiative not wind up as a clone of the old, wasteful CETA program.
- I want a bill from the Congress that I can sign. The Senate version (which passed 95-0) contains 90% of our requested reforms  
---the House committee version has very few.
- As senior Republican on the Education and Labor Committee, you are key to the legislative rescue effort in the House and I need your leadership on a package of amendments which incorporate, if at all possible, the following principles:
- o Prohibition on use of funds for wages and stipends
  - o 70% earmark of funds for training
  - o Block grant provisions
  - o No public service jobs should be allowed
- I hope you will work out an acceptable amendment package with Ray (Donovan) and Dave (Stockman) which will achieve my reform goals while making such modifications as are necessary to secure support of Committee Republicans and maximize chances for House floor passage.

SEQUENCE OF EVENTS FOR OFFICIAL DINNER IN HONOR OF  
HER EXCELLENCY INDIRA GANDHI  
PRIME MINISTER OF INDIA

July 29, 1982

7:00 p.m. Dinner guests arrive at the Diplomatic Reception Room. Alternate dinner guests, with special cards, are led to the right down the Cross Hall and into the First Ladies Garden for cocktails. (Rain Plan: West Cross Hall and Map Room.)

7:05 p.m. First motorcade of the Official Party departs the Madison Hotel escorted by the Chief of Protocol, Ambassador Roosevelt.

7:10 p.m. The regular dinner guests are escorted by Social Aides to the East Room where they are announced. (A Social Aide will also announce each guest to the Press Pool in the Lower Cross Hall.)

The Vice President and Mrs. Bush and Secretary of State and Mrs. Shultz will arrive the North Portico. They should be escorted into the Red Room to await the arrival of Ambassador Roosevelt and the Official Party.

(Harpist is in the Diplomatic Reception Room.)

The second motorcade of the Official Party then departs the Madison Hotel.

7:15 p.m. At the arrival of the first motorcade at the North Portico, a Social Aide will escort the Vice President and Mrs. Bush and Secretary of State and Mrs. Shultz from the Red Room to join the arriving party at the foot of the Grand Staircase.

The Chief of Protocol escorts the following to the Yellow Oval Room via the Grand Staircase:

Vice President and Mrs. Bush  
Secretary of State and Mrs. Shultz  
Mr. and Mrs. Rajiv Gandhi  
Foreign Ambassador and Mrs. K. R. Narayanan  
Ambassador and Mrs. Harry G. Barnes, Jr.

7:20 p.m. Second motorcade of the Official Party arrives White House at North Portico.

A Social Aide will escort them to the Red Room.

A senior Government official will serve as host in the Red Room to the remainder of the Official Party. A Social Aide, with the help of a Protocol Officer, will give out seating cards to the guests.

Four additional Social Aides will then escort the Party, one by one, into the East Room at 7:35.

7:25 p.m. Her Excellency Indira Gandhi Prime Minister of India departs the Madison Hotel accompanied by Mr. Roosevelt.  
(Military Cordon will line the driveway.)

7:29 p.m. THE PRESIDENT AND MRS. REAGAN depart the living quarters by elevator and proceed to the North Portico.

(U.S.M.C. Orchestra in Main Foyer)

The Chief of Protocol will serve as hostess protem for THE PRESIDENT AND MRS. REAGAN as they greet Prime Minister Indira Gandhi at the North Portico.

7:30 p.m. Prime Minister Indira Gandhi is greeted by THE PRESIDENT AND MRS. REAGAN; pause for press photo. Proceed to Yellow Oval Room through the Grand Foyer via the elevator.

7:35 p.m. The remainder of the Official Party in the Red Room is escorted to the East Room and announced.

Color Guard proceeds up Grand Staircase to hallway outside Yellow Oval Room.

7:40 p.m. Guests (save PRINCIPALS) depart Yellow Oval Room via elevator for East Room and are announced. The Secretary of State and Mrs. Shultz are announced first followed by The Vice President and Mrs. Bush.

OIC requests permission to secure the Colors. THE PRESIDENT responds, "Permission granted." Color Guard proceeds to secure the Colors and proceeds out of Yellow Oval Room down the Grand Staircase, led by OIC.

7:40 p.m. At foot of Staircase, Color Team divides.  
Cont'd.

7:45 p.m. The PRINCIPALS arrive on the State Floor via the Grand Staircase, pause at the foot of the Stairs for press photo session, and proceed directly to the East Room to full Honors. The Color Guard will precede them.

After the announcement of the PRINCIPALS, the PRINCIPALS, led by THE PRESIDENT, enter the East Room and form a receiving line which will be in the center of the Cross Hall doors, just inside the East Room. The order of the line from north to south is as follows: THE PRESIDENT, PRIME MINISTER INDIRA GANDHI, MRS. REAGAN.

Note: The Color Guard will precede the PRINCIPALS into the East Room and take their places on either side of the PRINCIPALS for the receiving line.

The Chief of Protocol stands to THE PRESIDENT'S left with a Social Aide on her left to make introductions to THE PRESIDENT.

Guests going through the receiving line will move as follows: they will go passed the PRINCIPALS, continue into the north door into the Green Room, out the Green Room into the Cross Hall, and down the Cross Hall and into the State Dining Room to be seated for dinner.

Having come through the receiving line, the Official Party will be led directly into the State Dining Room by Social Aides.

After all the guests have gone through the receiving line, the PRINCIPALS should hold in the East Room until all guests are in the State Dining Room, then proceed down the Cross Hall to the State Dining Room.

(Appropriate music should be played.)

8:10 p.m. Guests in the First Ladies Garden should be led into the West Garden Room to be seated for dinner.

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8:15 p.m. Dinner is served in the State Dining Room and the West Garden Room.

(The Staff Mess will be used for dinner for attending Aides.)

9:00 p.m. Dessert is served accompanied by the Strolling Strings.

9:15 p.m. Toasts:

PRESIDENT REAGAN

H.E. INDIRA GANDHI PRIME MINISTER OF INDIA

9:30 p.m. Following the toasts, THE PRESIDENT AND MRS. REAGAN will be escorted into the Blue Room with Prime Minister Indira Gandhi.

The after-dinner guests arrive at the East Gate and are escorted up the Grand Staircase with the guests from the West Garden Room by Social Aides to the Color Rooms for coffee and liqueurs.

All guests will be encouraged by Social Aides to mix and mingle in all Color Rooms.

10:00 p.m. All guests but PRINCIPALS will proceed out the outside staircases from the Red Room and the Green Room and will enter the Rose Garden from the drive. Guests will be seated as they enter the Rose Garden tent.

10:10 p.m. PRINCIPALS may exit the Blue Room into the Cross Hall and continue into the elevator to the Lower Cross Hall. They will then proceed out the West Garden Room, go directly into the tent and down the aisle to be seated on specially allocated chairs (see diagram).

10:15 p.m. The entertainment begins.

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10:45 p.m. The entertainment concludes.

PRESIDENT AND MRS. REAGAN and Prime Minister Gandhi join Conductor Mehta in front at his podium to thank the entertainers and THE PRESIDENT makes brief remarks. The Orchestra stands and are photographed with the PRINCIPALS.

10:50 p.m. Prime Minister Indira Gandhi is escorted by THE PRESIDENT AND MRS. REAGAN into the West Garden Room the way they came, into the Lower Cross Hall, up the elevator and through the Grand Foyer to the North Portico for departure.

The remaining guests on the South Lawn may enter the White House, following the PRINCIPALS' exit, through the West Garden Room, into the Lower Cross Hall, and up the Grand Staircase. Guests are also encouraged to enter the White House via the two outside staircases into the Red Room and Green Room.

11:00 p.m. THE PRESIDENT AND MRS. REAGAN return to the Main Foyer to begin the dancing.

Guests are served champagne and join in dancing.

11:30 p.m. All guests depart.
