VIDEOTAPE REMARKS: TRIBUTE TO KING HUSSEIN ON THE OCCASION
OF THE 30th ANNIVERSARY OF HIS ACCESSION
TO THE JORDANIAN THRONE (Taping July 30)

Your Majesty:

It is with personal pleasure that I join with your friends from many countries in this television greeting to commemorate your accession to the throne of Jordan 30 years ago. It is a celebration which reflects the respect and affection in which you are held by your people.

One of the advantages of age is that I understand better than most how long 30 years really is! Your reign ranks as one of the great achievements of modern statesmanship. Before I became President, I had followed your career for many years. I watched as you took responsibility while still in your teens. I have watched, in the years since, as you have continued to prove yourself a brave man and a wise leader.

It was not until last November, however, when at last we had the opportunity to meet in person that I found all of these impressions indeed to be true. The friendship you and I began then, Your Majesty, became part of the long standing friendship you have had with the United States. Our friendship has stood the test of time. It is based on shared interests, and, also, on common values and mutual respect. Your Majesty, you and the people of Jordan have been our friends for three decades. Such loyalty is not lightly regarded by the people of the United States.

This is a time of great trouble in your region of the world. Let it be understood that America seeks peace with honor and security for all states and peoples of the area, a goal I know you share. Recent tragedy makes it more important than ever that we work together to find just and lasting solutions. For my part, no one should doubt that the preservation of Jordan's security, integrity, and its unique and enduring character remains a matter of highest importance.

Your Majesty, on behalf of the American people, let me congratulate you once again on your remarkable achievement and allow me also to wish happiness and prosperity to the people of Jordan. We are proud to have you as a friend.
