I. PURPOSE

To hear briefings and entertain brief discussion from members of the Cabinet on matters concerning national security, the economy, and the FY '85 budget process.

II. BACKGROUND

The September 6 Full Cabinet Meeting represents the first major convocation of your Cabinet advisors since August 9. In the intervening time there have been serious national security developments concerning the Soviets' behavior in the Far East and increased hostilities in Lebanon. Likewise there have been further developments in the economic recovery and the FY '85 budget process will begin shortly.

V. SEQUENCE OF EVENTS

At 2:00 P.M. you will convene the meeting and offer brief remarks.

Acting Secretary of State Lawrence Eagleburger will provide a national security briefing. (20 minutes)

Upon conclusion of Mr. Eagleburger's presentation, Secretary Regan and Martin Feldstein will present a briefing on developments on the economy. (20 minutes)

Following the economic briefing, Mr. Stockman will review the impending FY '85 budget process. (20 minutes)

TALKING POINTS

- o I would like to begin by welcoming all of you back to the White House. We have not met as a group since August 9, and much has transpired during the intervening weeks. We are too painfully aware of the tragic and unprecedented events of the last several days.
- o Certainly, much of our attention during the days and weeks ahead will be consumed in fashioning an appropriate response to that hideous act of Soviet aggression. But in the meantime the business of government and the implementation of our many program initiatives will continue apace.
- o SECURITY BRIEFING: We will begin with a briefing from the Department of State. Secretary Shultz is at this moment traveling to Madrid for consultations with Soviet Foreign Minister Gromyko. In his place is Acting Secretary Eagleburger.
- o ECONOMIC BRIEFING: For the good news part of the program, Secretary Regan and Marty Feldstein will discuss the implication of the latest set of economic statistics and what trends they portend for continued economic growth.

- o FY '85 BUDGET: About a week ago, you all received guidance from the Budget Review Board on the need for you to submit your 1985 budget requests by September 15. I'd like to underscore that guidance. Given my fall travel agenda, it appears the only time that I will have to review overall budget requests will be in early October.
- o I've asked OMB to assume that last year's targets for 1985 still hold. Naturally, I'd be thrilled by any surprises you might be willing to offer in the way of further reductions. Be creative. With that, Mr. Stockman, you have the floor.

I. PURPOSE

To demonstrate your interest in the concerns of the American Jewish community and to reaffirm your commitment to the State of Israel.

II. BACKGROUND

Each participant in this meeting is a contributor of \$500,000 or more to the United Jewish Appeal's Annual Campaign. Most are extremely active in both local and national Jewish communities, as well as being strong supporters of the needs of Jews in Israel and of Jews throughout the world. These people are primarily involved in promoting not only the State of Israel, but local and national philanthropic causes as well.

Their day in Washington will begin with a luncheon where Senators Specter, Levin, Lautenberg and Boschwitz will be present. Prior to your meeting with this group, Assistant Secretary of State for Near Eastern Affairs and Ambassador to Egypt-Designate Nicholas Veliotis will brief them. The group will have cocktails and dinner with Israel's Ambassador to the United States Meir Rosenne later that evening.

After your brief remarks, there may be several questions, if you so desire. The type of questions you might expect will deal with your position on Jerusalem, the role that Saudi Arabia is playing to help convince Syria to withdraw from Lebanon, and ways the United States might convince Egypt to restore the normalization process between Israel and Egypt.

The idea for this meeting originated with Senator Arlen Specter. The chairman of this group is Max Fisher.

REVISED TALKING POINTS
FOR THE PRESIDENT'S MEETING WITH
THE UNITED JEWISH APPEAL

- I am glad to have this opportunity to meet with you this afternoon. I would like to personally thank Arlen Specter for recommending that I meet with such a distinguished group of Americans. During my years in government, I have been involved in many debates over the allocation of money. This group is particularly unique, and an example for others around the country in that you are Jews helping other Jews who are needy and you are putting into practice one of the important tenets of my philosophy. You are to be commended for this and you serve as an example that I wish others would emulate.
- With the impending resignation of Prime Minister Begin, we are witnessing the orderly transfer of power to the leaders of a new Israeli government. This commitment to the democratic process is one of Israel's great strengths and a tradition that binds us together. I am confident that my Administration will be able to work well with them. While Israel and the United States will not always agree, I firmly believe the spirit of friendship and cooperation that characterizes our relations serves the interests of both countries. The American-Israeli relationship is based on a bedrock of common values and common interests and I would like to take this opportunity to pledge myself once

more to the security and well-being of the State of Israel. Commitment to Israeli security and well-being has been a cornerstone of American policy in the Middle East since the creation of Israel in 1948, in which the United States played the key supporting role. Our continuing economic and security assistance to Israel is an acknowledgement of those common values and common interests and a signal of our commitment.

- I am very concerned about the recent events in Lebanon. The United States, Israel and Lebanon share common objectives -- the sovereignty of Lebanon, the withdrawal of all foreign forces, and the security of Israel's northern border.
- In Lebanon, the United States, Israel, and Lebanon share a common problem. Syria, backed by the Soviet Union, is actively seeking to prevent the implementation of Israel-Lebanon accord and to undermine the authority of the Lebanese government. The Israel-Lebanon Agreement was a major step toward withdrawal of all foreign forces from Lebanon with arrangements for the security of Israel's northern border. We will stand by Lebanon in this time of great threat to our shared interests.

- Although the current focus is on Lebanon, I can assure you that we are continuing the effort to move forward in the broader peace process which is the only real guarantee for the security and stability of Israel and its Arab neighbors. I hope in the months ahead both sides will find a way to make constructive use of the opportunities our proposals present. We can't afford to let any chance for real peace slip by -- and we won't.

- The peace treaty between Egypt and Israel is, of course, the cornerstone of our efforts to bring about a comprehensive peace in the Middle East. The continued vitality of the relationship between Egypt and Israel is important to that goal, to which the United States, Egypt, and Israel assign so much importance and have committed so much effort to achieving. I have written and spoken to both President Mubarak and Prime Minister Begin regarding my concern about the current troubled state of Egyptian-Israeli relations. I am gratified that each of them reiterated their firm commitment to the Camp David Accords and their treaty of peace. Each also indicated a desire to improve their bilateral relations and we will continue to work with both sides, including making suggestions about how to improve the atmosphere of Egyptian-Israeli relations and thereby serve our shared interest in moving as quickly as possible towards a just and comprehensive peace settlement in the Middle East.

- One last point I would like to make before taking a few questions. It is no coincidence that the same forces which are destabilizing the Middle East, namely the Soviet Union, Libya and the PLO, and also working hand glove with Cuba to destabilize Central America. Soviet activities in Central America and the Middle East are of deep strategic concern. In both areas the Soviet Union is directing challenges to American interests, both through direct involvement and through proxies such as Nicaragua and the PLO. In both areas we are working with our ally, Israel, to counter Soviet trouble making.

- Thank you for giving me this opportunity to talk with you. I will be happy to answer some of your questions.

- (Final comment after questions but before the meeting concludes.) Before we leave, I would like to extend for Nancy and myself best wishes to you and your family as you celebrate the Jewish High Holidays. Rosh Hashanah is a call to every Jew, and in a larger sense to all mankind, to return to the fundamental goals and principles for which we were created and towards which we must all strive. It is a time to reexamine the year past and look to the one ahead in a spirit of prayer and hopefulness. May the year 5744 bring health, prosperity and peace to you and your families.
