

SUMMARY OF AFL-CIO POSITIONS ON MAJOR IMMIGRATION ISSUES

I. Sanctions

- effective penalties for all employers who hire illegal aliens, including criminal sanctions and injunctions to prevent repeated violations.
- increased enforcement of existing wage and working standards legislation.

II. Identification Cards

- development of a counterfeit-proof, standard identification mechanism to enable employers to determine readily the legal status of job applicants.
- stringent, effective enforcement of civil rights laws to protect workers against any possible employer discrimination against U.S. citizens with Hispanic surnames or any other U.S. citizens.

III. Border Control & Interior Enforcement

- adequate support by the Executive Branch and adequate funding by Congress to strengthen border and interior enforcement activities of the Immigration and Naturalization Service.

IV. Temporary H-2 Workers; Labor Certification

- ending dependence of any industry on temporary workers; continued responsibility in U.S. Department of Labor for labor certification that U.S. workers are not available and that employment of temporary H-2 non-immigrant alien workers will not adversely affect wages and working conditions of other similarly employed U.S. workers.
- better enforcement of labor certification requirements to prevent abuses.

V. "Guestworkers"

- opposition to foreign labor import programs which undercut U.S. wages and working conditions under any label, "guestworker", "bracero", etc.

VI. Amnesty

- support humane and reasonable legalization of status of illegal aliens resident in the U.S. after a program to control illegal immigration is in place.
