# **Biography**

David Lester Swanson is a former government official and retired lobbyist.

David L. Swanson was born on March 11, 1942 in Stambaugh, Michigan. He grew up in Stambaugh and attended high school there. Swanson attended North Park College (now University) on the northside of Chicago earning a B.A. in mathematics in 1964. He then attended the Illinois Institute of Technology earning a Master's and Ph.D. in physics. He graduated in 1973.

Following his graduation, Swanson worked as a lab technician and then a Researcher at the National Argonne Laboratory in Illinois from 1973-1974. In a major career switch, Swanson was hired as a Special Assistant to Illinois Representative John B. Anderson. He stayed with Anderson from 1974-January 1977.

In January 1977, Swanson joined the Republican Policy Committee for the United States Senate advising Republican Senators on policy issues and supporting their reelection. His supervisor at the time was Max Friedersdorf. Friedersdorf was the first Assistant to the President for Legislature Affairs and Swanson joined his staff in the first days of the Reagan Administration.

Swanson was recruited for House and Senate Committee staffs and in May 1977 he became the Minority Staff Director for the House Ad Hoc Committee on Energy. In January 1978 he became a staff member of the Senate Committee on Energy and Natural Resources.

Swanson followed Max Friedersdorf to the White House Office of Legislative Affairs staff becoming first a Special Assistant for Legislative Affairs and then promoted to a Special Assistant to the President for Legislative Affairs.

Swanson resigned on January 9, 1984 and left the White House for the law firm of Bliss, Craft & Richards. He eventually became a lobbyist with a known position at the Edison Electronic Institute.

Swanson is retired and he and his wife live near Lancaster, Pennsylvania.
